The Registrant rendered advice on U.S. laws, regulations and policies concerning judicial assistance, immigration, bank regulation, taxation, and trade. The Registrant also represented the principal in filing an amicus curiae brief in Alcan Aluminum v. Franchise Tax Board of California, No. 84-C-6932 in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois.


