

The following activity was conducted on behalf of the foreign principal during the reporting period:

Since the launch of the U.S.-Canada Partnership for Growth campaign on November 7, 2002, momentum has grown consistently due to campaign activity in the areas of advertising, government relations, grassroots mobilization and earned media. This section highlights the activities and results achieved by the campaign component for Phase I (November 2002-January 2003) and Phase II (February 2003-Present).

Phase I (November 2002-January 2003)

The U.S.-Canada Partnership for Growth was officially launched on November 7, 2002 in Washington, DC and Toronto. The first burst of advertising was strategically timed to start on Election Day in order to increase awareness of the significance of the U.S.-Canada relationship with the target audience of political elites who would be watching the election results with great interest. In addition, the timing of the advertisements was designed to elevate the lumber trade dispute as an important issue to be addressed in 2003.

To launch the campaign, press events were held in Washington, DC and Toronto featuring the Partnership's co-chairs, William E. Brock, former Republican senator from Tennessee and former United States Trade Representative, and James J. Blanchard, former Democratic governor of Michigan and former U.S. Ambassador to Canada.

As part of the launch, advertisements hit the press and blanketed the airwaves in Washington, DC and the following target markets:

On a parallel track, a coordinated grassroots outreach and engagement campaign in the target states/districts coincided with the advertising. Through strategic grassroots efforts, constituents in the target districts were encouraged to educate themselves on the facts, form an opinion based on the arguments, and voice their concerns to their respective Members of Congress by letter, fax, and/or scheduled meeting.

In an additional effort to generate letters to Congress, the campaign exhibited at the International Builders' Show in Las Vegas. Beyond generating letters, the exhibit was also important in increasing awareness of the lumber tariff issue within the homebuilding industry and in recruiting members to the Partnership (*see section on International Builders' Show*).

Attention to the tariff issue was also generated through the media. The campaign was able to proactively leverage significant announcements and events by developing and distributing press releases, media statements and an op-ed piece surrounding the 10th anniversary of the North American Free Trade Agreement and the World Trade Organization's ruling on the "Byrd Amendment." The campaign also announced to the media a National Advisory Board of thirty members from various target states, a new partner organization (the American Homeowners Grassroots Alliance) and its participation at the International Builders Show.

Phase II (February 2003-Present)

The Aldonas policy discussions offered a strategic opportunity to launch the second phase of advertising, which began on February 5 and ran through early March in Washington, DC and target markets across the country. The advertising campaign included a television spot, two print advertisements, two print advertorials and an Internet banner ad. Copies of the ads and a record of their placement can be referenced within the binder – *see Index of Materials*.

In conjunction with the Internet advertising effort, the campaign ran a contest as a creative and effective way to draw the public to the website for information about the lumber issue. Internet users who linked to the contest banner ad were asked a series of questions about the U.S.-Canada trade relationship. Those who answered correctly were directed to the campaign website and eligible to register for a trip to Canada. The contest began in mid-February and, by the time it ended in late March, there were 7,889 registrants. Out of three city travel options (Toronto,

U.S.-Canada Partnership for Growth Advertising

Strategy:

The strategic objective of U.S.-Canada Partnership for Growth advertising in 2002-2003 was

Phase II Advertising (February – March 2003)

In February 2003, we revised the "boyhood buddies" ad to focus on the fact that the U.S. and Canada are the world's largest trading partners. This ad, "Baseball Cards," appeared both in Washington, DC and in targeted daily newspapers across the country.

In addition, two advertorials, "Reliable Energy" and "Friendship" were developed to deliver a more detailed message on trade and energy – raising concerns about the negative impact of a lumber tariff when our economies are interconnected. These ads appeared in the *New York Times*, *The Wall Street Journal*, and *The Hill and Roll Call* in Washington, DC.

Finally, we created "Canada Buys," a series of state specific print ads that clearly communicated that importance of U.S. – Canadian trade to the local economy. These ads ran in local newspapers – along with a generic version that was placed in regional editions of *USA Today*.

For television, a thirty-second television spot was produced after a wide variety of storyboard concepts were tested in focus groups. The final TV ad, "American Products," established the importance of the economic relationship between the world's largest trading partners (highlighting Canadian energy resources) and directly questioned a lumber import tax damaging the economies of both countries. The spot closed with the website and an appeal to help, "get this relationship back on track."

The spot ran heavily in Washington, DC on broadcast television and cable news channels. It was also seen in 20 regional media markets from Miami to Seattle. Both the inside-the-Beltway and targeted market TV time buy ran concurrently with the print ad campaign.

Under Development:

Currently, we are developing and testing print ad creative focusing on economic interdependence – and the need for the U.S. and Canada to overcome our differences and maintain a strong trading relationship. We have also designed new logos for the U.S.–Canada Partnership for Growth, as well as a "template" for a series of issue-oriented advertorials.

Grassroots Program

Since early November 2002, the grassroots component of the U.S.-Canada Partnership for Growth campaign has generated over **3,400 grassroots communications to key elected officials**, via the web and in-district activities. Below we have provided a brief summary of the grassroots efforts to date. While reviewing this section of the report, please keep in mind that the grassroots component is currently on hold, pending a decision to reactivate it at as appropriate during the campaign. Therefore, the totals indicated in the following pages are largely a result of efforts conducted early in 2003 and late in 2002.

Grassroots Campaign Overview

The goal of the grassroots program has been to raise awareness of the issue among the targeted Members of Congress and Governors. This goal was achieved by the recruitment and mobilization of a range of grassroots audiences that offer a variety of perspectives on the negative impacts of the U.S. import tax on Canadian lumber—political, economic and human impacts. We have recruited a range of politically relevant advocates with personal/business connections to the issue or to targeted legislators.

Phase I (November 2002 – January 2003) Grassroots Campaign Activities

The audiences listed above have been mobilized to engage in direct contacts—such as face to face meetings, informal encounters at fundraisers and other functions, telephone calls to senior staff members—and personal letters.

In addition, influential advocates in targeted states have been recruited to become members of the U.S.-Canada Partnership for Growth's National Advisory Board. In this capacity, some will become more involved in media activities at the local and national level, while all members are public supporters of the Partnership and may provide strategic insight and guidance on future campaign events.

Internet Communications

In anticipation of the 2002 elections, an advocacy web page was developed and linked seamlessly with the campaign website. A corresponding web advertising campaign was conducted to drive traffic to the website, where visitors would be educated about the U.S. and Canada trade partnership and mobilized to take action. The add-on functionality of the web page enabled advocates across the country to send grassroots communications to their Members of Congress via the site.

A second phase of the Internet program was intended to raise awareness of the issue after the elections were over. An initial series of two educational ads ran that informed web visitors about the issue and the importance of the U.S.-Canada trade partnership, followed by a contest from February 22, 2003 – March 31, 2003, to test visitors knowledge of the issue and offer the winner a trip to Canada.

The results of the Internet component of the grassroots program are as follows:

- **13,210,585 advertising impressions;**
- **73,417 unique visitors** to the website;
- **13,423 registrations;**
- **over 3,400 communications** – including emails, faxes and letters – to key elected officials.

Phase II (February 2003 – present) Grassroots Campaign Activities

In 2003, the local grassroots component in key states made substantial progress. **Through the end of February (when the grassroots program was put on hold), more than 1,160 personal letters, senior staff calls, intercepts and meetings had been generated from local key influentials to the 16 key elected officials and three Administration officials targeted in the campaign.** We believe that this volume of contacts demonstrates a base of widespread opposition to the import tax on Canadian lumber.

Conclusion

Although the grassroots component of the U.S.-Canada Partnership for Growth Campaign is currently idle, it is ready to re-engage at the appropriate moment. As part of an umbrella campaign, grassroots remains an integral means of tailoring national messages to specific audiences and mobilizing grassroots advocates in target markets. We look forward to continuing this aspect of the campaign when the time is right.

Earned Media Summary

Overview

With the goal of influencing key champions in target states, the earned media program has been coordinated with every aspect of the campaign to leverage media opportunities in targeted national and regional outlets.

Phase I (November 2002 – January 2003)

The U.S.-Canada Partnership for Growth was officially launched on November 7, 2002 in Washington, DC and Toronto. The launch was timed to coincide with an initial burst of advertising that began running on November 5, 2002. The launch was strategically timed to start on Election Day in order to increase awareness of the significance of the U.S-Canada relationship with our target audience of political elites who would be watching the election results with great interest.

To launch the campaign, press events were held in Washington, DC and Toronto featuring the Partnership's co-chairs, William E. Brock, former Republican senator from Tennessee and former United States Trade Representative, and James J. Blanchard, former Democratic governor of Michigan and former U.S. Ambassador to Canada.

As part of the launch, advertisements hit publications and blanketed the airwaves in Washington, DC and the following target markets:

Coordinated media outreach coincided with the advertising. A number of local and national media outlets, including wire services, covered the launch of the U.S. – Canada Partnership for Growth. The core messages – the value of trade between the nations, the importance of the overall relationship, the need to work out the tariff dispute, the impact of this tax on consumers – was reflected in the coverage. Media outreach also drove reporters and the public drove to the Partnership for Growth's website to obtain more information about the campaign.

Following the launch of the Partnership for Growth, the campaign was able to proactively leverage significant announcements and events by developing and distributing press releases, media statements and an op-ed piece surrounding the 10th anniversary of the North American Free Trade Agreement and the World Trade Organization's ruling on the "Byrd Amendment."

The campaign also announced to the media a National Advisory Board of thirty members from various target states, new partner organizations (the American Homeowners Grassroots Alliance) and its participation at the International Builders Show.

Phase II (February 2003 – Present)

Strategically launched during the Aldonas trade discussions, the second phase of advertising began on February 5 and ran through early March in Washington, DC and in target markets across the country. Earned media efforts were coordinated with the advertising and have continued through the summer as U.S.-Canada lumber trade discussions have taken place and international trade panel decisions have been made.

By issuing press releases and updating the website, the campaign was able to proactively build upon these and other significant announcements and events including the membership announcement of the U.S. Hispanic Contractors Association and a media day in New York City on February 21 with co-chairs Blanchard and Brock. Media opportunities included a media roundtable and luncheon with Forbes and interviews with Bloomberg and Fortune.

As part of the campaign's ongoing speakers bureau, co-chair Brock spoke before the World Affairs Council of St. Louis on May 14. Additional opportunities for 2003/2004 are outlined in this section. The campaign also provided media support when members of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities visited targeted U.S. cities and sponsored *Roll Call's International Trade* conference on September 3.

Other efforts underway include the redesign of the Partnership for Growth logo and exhibit in addition to the development of an image video and multi-media presentation to be used at high-profile speaking engagements and meetings, as well as exhibit opportunities.
