The B.V.I Tourist Board was created for the purpose of establishing a tourism authority for the British Virgin Islands, and is therefore in accordance with the B.V.I government's brand of tourism. The Board of directors are appointed by the government of the B.V.I, and serve at its pleasure. Total autonomy is given to the Tourist Board, and its chairman makes courtesy reports to the B.V.I government.

The manager will answer to the foreign principal and will be given a budget to operate from for an indefinite period of time. In the first instance, the operating budget of the registrant is determined at \$60,000.00 to be dispensed from the foreign principal.

4. Describe fully the nature and method of performance of the above indicated agreement or understanding.

B.V.I Information and Reservations will concern itself generally with the promotion of the B.V.I as a tourism destination. The specific duties will include information dissemination, provision of a station for a reservation network, and marketing the B.V.I. The manager will make monthly reports to the foreign principal enabling a judgement of the office's performance.

5. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

Activities include the answering of inquiries on the B.V.I as a tourism destination originating by mail or telephone. The transmitting of reservation requests to the home office for processing, making of sales calls on travel agents, writers etc to cultivate interest in the B.V.I. Placing of advertisements and other information in the media strictly for the promotion of the B.V.I as a tourism destination.
