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This amendment is filed to clarify two aspects of the firm's supplemental statement of July 24, 1987.

Item 12 of the supplemental statement correctly indicates that during the six month reporting period Akin, Gump engaged in political activities. The political activities engaged in on the behalf of Airship Industries, Salgad International, and Fujitsu Limited are listed on the information sheets attached to the supplemental statement. Copies of this information, in greater detail, are also attached to this form and with the addition of the following statements of purpose for the contacts listed: "Each of these contacts was to inform respective Members of Congress and Executive branch officials of Airship Industries' interest in being considered as a procurement source for certain U.S. airships"; "Each of these contacts was to inform Members of Congress and of Salgad International's interest in being considered as a procurement source for certain DOD mortar contracts"; "This contact was to discuss the implications of the proposed Fujitsu-Fairchild merger with an Executive branch official."

Item 19 of the supplemental statement correctly indicates that during the six month reporting period Akin, Gump prepared letters that might be viewed as political propaganda. It was the intention of the drafter of this statement to include the phrase "See Attachment" as part of the response to item 19, as was done in answering items 22 and 24. Once this phrase is added the complete response to item 19 refers to the following statement: "Some of the letters forwarded to government officials may constitute 'political propaganda' under the Act, and, as such, were labeled pursuant to the requirements of Section 4(e).
