



Abu Dhabi sentences BCCI founder, CEO to jail  
ABU DHABI, June 14 (Reuter) - An Abu Dhabi court on Tuesday sentenced BCCI's 1/BCCI.CN3/8 founder and its former chief executive officer to jail for their roles in the scandal that led to the bank's collapse.

The founder of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International (BCCI), Agha Hassan Abedi, was sentenced to eight years in prison and former chief executive officer Mohammed Swalah Naqvi to 14 years.

Abedi is ailing and living in Pakistan.

Naqvi, who was Abedi's right-hand man, was not present at the sentencing.

He had attended all the hearings since the trial started in October then was handed over to U.S. authorities in May to stand trial there for his alleged role in the scandal.

It was not clear where Naqvi will serve his sentence.

Judge Shihab Abdul-Rahman al-Hamadi delivered the verdict in the trial of 13 former BCCI officials in the biggest court case to stem from the bank's forced closure.

Ten of them including Naqvi had been detained in the Abu Dhabi Police Club since the bank was shut down amid fraud allegations in July 1991. One defendant has been out on bail.

The rest were being tried in absentia.

The Abu Dhabi criminal court finished hearing defence arguments in April against the 11 defendants who appeared in court on criminal and civil charges in connection with the bank's forced closure worldwide.

They pleaded not guilty to criminal charges including dissipating funds, forging documents, concealing deficits and losses and approving false loans.

The court on Tuesday found one of the defendants not guilty, sentenced another to three years and the rest to jail terms between six and eight years.

The Abu Dhabi parties have acted responsibly throughout and are confident the facts support their position."

**Abu Dhabi Parties File Claim Against BCCI Executives  
Civil Suit Seeks \$9 Billion in Damages**

Abu Dhabi, UAE -- The Abu Dhabi Ruling Family and the Abu Dhabi Investment Authority (ADIA) today filed a civil claim in an Abu Dhabi court against 13 former executives of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International. The civil claimants, who were the majority shareholders of BCCI when it was shut down in July of 1991, are seeking \$9 billion dollars in damages for mismanaged and stolen funds.

Named in the civil suit are BCCI founder and president Agha Hasan Abedi, his deputy Swaleh Naqvi, and Ziauddin Akbar, as well as 10 other BCCI executives currently facing criminal charges in Abu Dhabi.

In accordance with UAE law, the civil claim is based on the criminal charges that have been brought against the former BCCI executives and is expected to be heard concurrently with the criminal trial. The criminal trial is scheduled to resume in late December.

The civil claim charges that over \$3 billion was stolen from an investment Portfolio account of the UAE President and his son, the Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi, by the defendants to conceal massive losses resulting from their mismanagement of BCCI and to cover up their criminal activities. The defendants created false financial statements regarding the value of the Portfolio to cover up their thefts and to mislead the Portfolio owners into believing that the depleted fund was actually worth over \$4 billion as of December 1989, when in fact it was worth only about \$250 million. If the Portfolio had been conservatively invested in dollar bonds it would be worth approximately \$7 billion today.

The defendants, led by Abedi and Naqvi, are also charged in the civil claim with misappropriating the funds of the BCCI group through the creation of false loans and the servicing of delinquent loans with these funds. These activities distorted the true value of BCCI and ultimately contributed to its closure.

The Majority Shareholders said in a statement: "Billions of dollars of legitimate investments were lost due to the criminal activities of senior members of the management of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International. The civil claim seeks to recoup funds entrusted to Abedi and Naqvi for investment by them on behalf of the Ruling Family and ADIA.

"The Majority Shareholders are the largest and perhaps only intended victims of Abedi, Naqvi and their conspirators. As evidenced by this action, we are committed to vigorously pursuing those who have so brazenly defrauded us. The defendants -- Abedi, Naqvi and their co-conspirators -- stole billions of dollars. Former BCCI management must be brought to justice for their transgressions and compensation must be provided to the victims of the fraud."

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

### **Overview**

Despite its rapid growth and expansion, the BCCI Group was plagued by a high number of delinquent and fictitious loans, along with massive losses incurred by its Treasury Division. In desperate need of capital, BCCI's founder, Agha Hasan Abedi, and his second-in-command, Swaleh Naqvi, misappropriated funds from the Ruling Family of Abu Dhabi's investment Portfolio at the International Credit and Investment Company. They were able to do so because of the enormous trust that Abedi had established with the Ruling Family. Abedi, who had suggested the creation of the Portfolio, promised low-risk investments and high liquidity. For a ten-year period beginning in 1980, Abedi, Naqvi and a small circle of their most trusted employees at BCCI and ICIC stole approximately \$3.1 billion from the Portfolio account in an attempt to keep BCCI afloat. Meanwhile, they misled the Ruling Family as to the Portfolio's investments and its account balance. As BCCI's losses became unmanageable, it became clear that they would never be able to repay the monies they had misappropriated from the Portfolio. Eventually, all but \$260 million of the \$3.1 billion fund was stolen. Today, with conservative investment strategies, the fund would be worth approximately \$7 billion (see "*Chronology*" and "*Entities*").

When legal counsel to the Majority Shareholders first attempted, following the closure of BCCI, to piece together the draft memoranda, personal notes and other scraps of paper that recorded the ten years of Portfolio theft, all that was known was that an enormous sum of money had been lost by the Ruling Family. Only after a painstaking effort to reconstruct the events and transactions -- an effort made no easier by the fact that Portfolio's records were never computerized -- did the depth and complexity of this fraud scheme become apparent. Thus, the overall story as presented is as accurate as the details of the documentation that has been uncovered to date. Although some minor details may change as the investigations continue, two facts remain unchallenged: the Ruling Family of Abu Dhabi was the unknowing victim of a closely-knit fraud scheme; and the billions of dollars taken during this theft will never be returned to its rightful owners. The attached material offers a case study of how and why BCCI purposely misappropriated and mismanaged the Ruling Family of Abu Dhabi's investments (see "*Document History*").

### **Background**

To the outside world, BCCI was a bank that staked its reputation on glitz and expansion. But the reality was that on the inside, the bank was riddled with delinquent and fictitious loans.

BCCI's founder, Agha Hasan Abedi, and his second-in-command, Swaleh Naqvi, realized that they were in desperate need of capital. They also realized that they lacked a source

from which to borrow the funds. Their solution: unauthorized utilization of funds from the Ruling Family of Abu Dhabi's "Portfolio" of investments managed by Abedi and Naqvi through the International Credit and Investment Company (ICIC).

- Internal guidelines for the Portfolio, prepared in August 1983 and October 1985, called for the Portfolio to be a prudently invested fund for its owners.
- Since it was based in Grand Cayman, ICIC was not subject to detailed regulation or auditing. The Caymans' regulatory and accounting standards enabled Abedi and Naqvi to tap into the Portfolio with minimal risk of being discovered.

From 1980 to 1990, Abedi and Naqvi worked with a select group of their most trusted employees to steal monies from the Ruling Family of Abu Dhabi's Portfolio fund to cover BCCI's various losses (see "*Defendants*").

- Since BCCI SA was chartered in Luxembourg and BCCI Overseas in Grand Cayman, the bank could not turn to a central bank as a lender of last resort (as, say, a U.S. bank would turn to the Federal Reserve).
- The defendants attempted to keep track of the stolen funds, creating a "paper trail" that ultimately would link them to the misappropriations.
  - The defendants kept pieces of paper -- literally, hundreds of individual slips of paper -- with handwritten instructions to transfer funds out of the Portfolio.
  - Records were kept of "special loans" which recorded the amount borrowed and interest owed (usually 3% above LIBOR).
- In 1986, Naqvi discovered that BCCI's supposed profit center, the Treasury Division, was in fact a financial black hole. Whatever the intentions, by now BCCI's losses were unmanageable.
- Of the \$2.2 billion deposited into the Portfolio fund by the Ruling Family from 1980 to 1990, all but \$260 million appears to have been misappropriated. If the Portfolio had been conservatively invested in dollar bonds it would be worth approximately \$7 billion today.

### *Mechanics of the Portfolio*

Abedi's relationship with H.H. Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan dated back to the mid-1960s. Abedi served as an informal financial advisor to H.H. Sheikh Zayed. Because of this trust and longstanding friendship, Abedi was able to convince the Ruling Family to place and manage funds in a supposedly conservatively-run investment Portfolio at ICIC.

**On November 14, 1980, the first transfer of funds occurred from the Ruling Family's account to the investment Portfolio established at ICIC.**

**Abedi persuaded the Ruling Family to give him discretion over how and where their money would be invested. Abedi was not required to consult the Ruling Family in order to make investments or to transfer Portfolio funds.**

- **Until 1988, only Abedi was authorized to manage the Portfolio, although in practice it was Naqvi who was responsible for the illicit transfer of Portfolio funds.**
- **After Abedi's heart attack in February 1988, Naqvi received similar authority from the Ruling Family to manage the Portfolio, although this is what he had been doing in effect for over eight years.**
- **The evidence to date makes it clear that all investment decisions were initiated by Abedi, Naqvi or other BCCI perpetrators.**

**Abedi and Naqvi enhanced both their credibility and the Portfolio's legitimacy with internal guidelines -- i.e., valuations and guidelines -- prepared after the fact.**

- **The fund was to have high liquidity at all times and investments were to be low-risk, especially those that yielded income on an ongoing basis.**
- **Abedi and Naqvi suggested:**
  - **U.S. Treasury bills, notes and bonds (25%);**
  - **certificates of deposit issued by prime banks (20%);**
  - **investments in foreign exchange, base & precious metals, bullion, commodities and futures (15%);**
  - **equities and real estate (15%);**
  - **deposits with BCCI (25%). A significant portion of the Portfolio was to be deposited in BCCI accounts to ensure the fund's liquidity.**

**But in fact Abedi and Naqvi regularly transferred funds out of the Portfolio to offset BCCI's mounting losses. They concealed the misappropriations in several ways:**

- **Purchase of certificates of deposit -- on the books it would appear the Portfolio acquired new CDs, but in reality the money was never invested in these instruments and was sent to cover losses or other obligations that BCCI had incurred;**

- **Treasury Division investment** -- funds were transferred to BCCI's Treasury Division and phantom returns were generated for valuation statements;
- **Repurchased U.S. Treasury Bonds** -- by selling bonds to brokers with an agreement to repurchase the bonds on a certain date and at a certain price, Abedi and Naqvi in theory were taking out loans from brokers. However, very few of these "loans" were paid back. The bonds were detailed in the Portfolio valuation statements as if they belonged to the Ruling Family when in fact they had been sold back to the brokers. The notion of repurchased bonds gave the appearance that the underlying assets had some validity.
- **Double-recorded CDs** -- the identical CDs held in the Portfolio appeared as assets elsewhere in the BCCI Group and eventually were transferred to BCCI;
- **Fictitious Deposit Accounts** -- through the use of fictitious deposit accounts, money supposedly on deposit at BCCI had, in fact, been misappropriated.

### **The Key Players**

**The scheme worked for almost a decade in part because it was confined to a small cadre of loyalists. Although BCCI employed over 14,000 workers in nearly 70 nations worldwide, Portfolio misappropriations were conducted by an inner circle of 10 or so BCCI officers at the bank's headquarters on Leadenhall Street in London and at the office of ICIC in the Cayman Islands (see "Key Players").**

- The scheme's perpetrators were all hand-picked by Abedi and Naqvi.
- The perpetrators were uncommonly loyal to Abedi, whom they viewed as a man of near-mystical powers.
- BCCI's chain of command helped to make the scheme a success; there were few overlapping duties within the bank and a clear understanding as to who had the authority to make decisions, beginning with Abedi and Naqvi.

**The inner circle also extended to ICIC, where Hassan Kazmi and Anwar Gillani carried out Naqvi's orders in London and Mohammed Kassim did the same from his office in Grand Cayman.**

- Although Abedi and Naqvi in effect controlled the bank through their relationships with hand-picked ICIC management, to the outside world there appeared to be no connection between BCCI and ICIC. ICIC's auditors, Price Waterhouse, failed to see the connection.

**Misappropriations**

**Naqvi's team used funds from the Portfolio to achieve the following:**

- offset losses incurred by the Treasury Division, the true extent of which became clear to Naqvi in 1986;
- reduce or retire non-performing or fictitious loans by BCCI, ICIC, or related entities -- in particular, non-performing accounts for the Gulf Group, one of the initial recipients of Portfolio funds.
- finance the purchase of shares and rights offerings in companies within and outside the BCCI Group -- including FGB and CCAH -- in the names of nominee shareholders on behalf of BCCI Holdings;
- fund fictitious ICIC (Overseas) loans that had been drawn down earlier -- the Portfolio fund was used as part of a \$150 million capital injection so BCCI could avoid reporting a loss for 1985;
- conceal the true position of BCCI Group companies and affiliates at the end of their fiscal years.

*(see "Primary Recipients of Portfolio Funds")*

**The extent and pace of misappropriations was directly linked to BCCI's misfortunes. The more money BCCI lost, the more it needed from the Portfolio fund to keep the bank afloat.**

- From 1980 to 1984, approximately \$733 million was removed from the Portfolio - - including \$117.2 million that was earmarked for CCAH, although some of this money was repaid.
- From 1984 to 1988, the perpetrators allegedly "sold" \$681 million in BCCI shares to the Portfolio under fictitious "buy back" agreements, utilizing the funds to:
  - service fictitious and/or delinquent loans;
  - finance, in part, a 1986 payment of \$100 million to the BCCI pension fund;
  - meet capital requirements elsewhere within the BCCI Group;
  - account for previous misappropriations.

**Two developments in late 1985 and 1986 -- the Gulf Group's catastrophic losses and the discovery of the Treasury Division losses -- increased the level of misappropriations.**

- BCCI continued to loan money to the Gulf Group despite the shipping industry's misfortunes which began in the late 1970s. By the 1980s, Gulf Group lending exceeded the net worth of the bank.
- Over \$2 billion was misappropriated from 1985 to 1986 -- \$1.6 billion in the second half of 1986 alone -- with less than \$200 million being returned to the account.
- After that, the level of misappropriations tapered off. By 1987, most of the Portfolio funds had been siphoned away.

### **Concealing the Fraud**

**Misleading and inaccurate valuation statements were prepared for the Ruling Family to conceal the true financial state of the Portfolio.**

- Beginning in 1983 and continuing through 1989, statements were prepared quarterly with a summary sheet outlining deposits to date, investments and returns with the valuation specifics of each investment attached.
- The categories reported were consistent with those offered in the investment guidelines drafted earlier by Abedi and Naqvi -- highly liquid assets that could be converted to cash readily and, in the case of CDs, transferred easily from one bearer to the next.
- The valuation reports and audits claimed that the Portfolio was earning reasonable returns on the funds invested.
- In response to pressure from the funds owners, Naqvi hired J.B. Benbow & Co., a team of accountants in the Cayman Islands, to "audit" the Portfolio. Naqvi selected the firm because it had a past relationship with BCCI and would accept BCCI and ICIC's documentation without question or scrutiny.

**To keep track of the irregular transactions, the staff of ICIC -- usually, M.Y. Kassim -- produced internal reconciliation documents. Typically, they were handwritten and informal notes and memoranda.**

- Internal reconciliation valuations began to appear in 1981. When quarterly valuations began in 1983, corresponding internal valuations were prepared to reconcile official versions with the actual transactions.

- Figures on these documents appear next to the initials of BCCI officers responsible for these delinquent accounts. They indicate relevant sums paid to those account officers.
- There is little doubt that those involved in producing internal valuations -- Kazmi, Kassim, Dossani and Gillani (as well as Abedi and Naqvi) -- were aware they were recording misappropriations from the Portfolio.

### Efforts to Reassert Control Over the Portfolio

In April 1990, Naqvi informed the Majority Shareholders that funds from the Portfolio had been stolen. The Majority Shareholders took immediate action to safeguard the remaining balance in the Portfolio and to begin the process that eventually would reconstruct how the fraud scheme was conducted.

- Naqvi and Abedi were officially removed from BCCI management and the remaining funds at ICIC and UBS were returned to Abu Dhabi.
- The Majority Shareholders sent an investigating team to the Caymans to review documents relating to the Portfolio. Investigators determined that routing accounts had been used to make improper transfers out of the Portfolio.
- The investigating team returned to Abu Dhabi with the Portfolio documents to keep them secure and to enable a full investigation to be carried out. That investigation continues to date in Abu Dhabi.

### UAE Criminal Proceedings

- In September 1991, the Majority Shareholders filed a complaint with federal prosecutors against certain employees of BCCI, an investigation was instituted and preliminary charges were filed against former senior members of the BCCI management. The detention order was periodically reviewed by a judge, as required by UAE law, and renewed at the request of the prosecutors as they continued the investigation.
- In July 1993, after a lengthy investigation by an independent internationally recognized consultant on financial fraud appointed by the Public Prosecutor's office, formal charges were filed. Criminal charges against the defendants included theft of Ruling Family funds, forgery, use of a forged instrument, breach of trust and charges relating to deceptive accounting practices.

- Criminal proceedings against the defendants began on October 9, 1993. The trial was adjourned until November 13, 1993 to allow defense counsel the opportunity to examine the evidence and prepare their cases. The trial is currently scheduled to resume on December 25, 1993.

#### **UAE Civil Proceedings**

- Simultaneously with the criminal proceedings, Abu Dhabi parties filed a civil claim on December 20, 1993 against the criminal defendants for theft and waste of more than \$7 billion in assets. Under UAE criminal procedure, such a civil claim may proceed concurrently with the criminal trial if the underlying injury and parties are the same (similar provisions exist under French law). The judgement in both cases will be rendered by the same Court.

## **CHRONOLOGY**

### **1980 to Early 1981**

**Agha Hasan Abedi, founder of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International, convinces Their Highnesses Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan al Nahyan and Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed al Nahyan to allow him to manage an investment portfolio on their behalf. Abedi had administered other investments for the Ruling Family of Abu Dhabi from 1969 through the 1970s.**

### **November 1980**

**November 14, 1980 -- The first transfer of funds of \$47,829,866 from the Ruling Family's account at the National Bank of Abu Dhabi to the International Credit and Investment Company (Overseas) Ltd. occurs.**

**From November 1980 through February 1990, a total of \$2.6 billion is transferred into the Portfolio. The deposits ranged from \$25 million to \$50 million a month in the early 1980s to between \$15 million and \$25 million per month from 1983 onwards.**

### **December 1980**

**Even before Abedi has received letters of authority, \$10 million from the Portfolio is invested in BCCI capital notes without approval from the Ruling Family. Later that month, \$37.5 million appears to have been secretly used to fund a BCCI rights issue.**

### **April 1981**

**Abedi is given authority by the Ruling Family to transfer funds in and out of the Portfolio. He is given similar authority over a portfolio managed by UBS.**

**April 30, 1981 -- First documented theft from the Portfolio fund -- \$15 million is used to finance the Gulf Group, a loss-making BCCI client. BCCI and ICIC officials continue to loot the Portfolio until as late as March 1990.**

### November 1981

Abedi is given further authority to transfer funds held in bonds and securities. According to the terms of the letter of authority, Abedi must provide written instructions for each transaction. Funds are transferred out of the Portfolio and BCCI, unbeknownst to the Ruling Family.

On November 17, Abedi prepared a one-page statement for the Ruling Family falsely describing the status of the of Portfolio investments. The statement, which claims a balance of \$598 million, is deliberately misleading.

### 1981 to 1986

Ziauddin Akbar instructs ICIC officials to transfer substantial funds from the Portfolio into BCCI's Treasury Division, which he heads. During Akbar's tenure at Treasury, the division loses more than \$1.3 billion.

Instructions to debit the Portfolio were also given by Imran Imam, Mohammed Hashim Shaikh, Mohammed Azmatullah and S.M. Akbar to fund delinquent and fictitious accounts which they handled.

### June 1983

June 30, 1983 -- The first detailed valuation report on the Portfolio is sent to the Ruling Family. Similar statements are provided every quarter until the end of 1989. Corresponding internal statements are also produced within ICIC to remind the perpetrators how the funds are actually being utilized. Those statements are only discovered after Naqvi disclosed the theft in 1990.

### 1985 to 1990

BCCI faces increasing financial problems. The requirement to fund losses by the Gulf Group absorbs increasing amounts of money misappropriated from the Portfolio. The revelation by Ziauddin Akbar of disastrous losses in the Treasury Division plunges BCCI further into crisis and increases its dependence on fraudulent funding from the Portfolio.

The pattern of misappropriations becomes both larger and more institutionalized as more account officers within BCCI give instructions to the ICIC staff to transfer Portfolio funds. Also, misappropriations are enacted in Grand Cayman, rather than in London.

## 1986

The high-water mark of the misappropriations. During 1986, approximately \$1.6 billion is misappropriated from the Portfolio to counteract BCCI's financial difficulties.

### March 1986

Syed Ziauddin Akbar abruptly leaves BCCI's Treasury Division. Two months later, Naqvi learns about the full extent of the Treasury Division's losses, now totalling over \$1.3 billion. Not coincidentally, several of the larger thefts at this time involved plugging holes left vacant by the Treasury debacle.

### 1987 to 1990

With less funds remaining to siphon, the pace of misappropriations slows. At the request of the Ruling Family, \$450 million is returned during 1988 and 1989.

### February 1988

Abedi suffers a debilitating heart attack; Naqvi's role expands while Abedi recuperates.

Following Abedi's heart attack, further documentation authorizes Naqvi to operate the Portfolio.

### July 1988

Anticipating that he would be required to have the Portfolio independently valued, Naqvi appoints a Cayman Islands firm to produce an "audit opinion" verifying the balance in the Portfolio. The "opinion", dated July 11, 1988, verifies the balance in the Portfolio. But is based simply on balance confirmations received from BCCI and ICIC companies. Further audit opinions are produced in July 1989 and January 1990. They are similarly dependent on false certificates received from BCCI and ICIC. A detailed valuation report produced in July 1989 by the same firm is also flawed. In late 1989, the Ruling Family instructs an independent and well-respected firm of investment valuers to value the Portfolio; just as their inquiries reach a critical stage in early 1990, Naqvi informally discloses the theft to the Ruling Family.

**March 1990**

**March 21, 1989 -- Last documented case of funds misappropriated from the Portfolio. Approximately \$3.4 million is removed.**

**April 1990**

**Swaleh Naqvi, travelling to Abu Dhabi to seek additional funds for BCCI, discloses the theft of the Portfolio funds. Naqvi's authority over the Portfolio is immediately terminated and the Ruling Family of Abu Dhabi demands that the remaining funds be remitted to the UAE. Of a total of \$2.6 billion transferred into the Portfolio, only \$270 million remains.**

**In an effort to keep BCCI afloat and at the request of the Bank of England, Abu Dhabi interests become the bank's majority shareholders in April. Efforts begin to restructure the bank.**

**July 5, 1991**

**The Bank of England closes BCCI despite its previous support of efforts to restructure the bank.**

## **ENTITIES**

### **BCCI Group**

Prior to its closure on July 5, 1991, by bank regulators in three countries, the BCCI Group consisted of three principal companies: Holdings, Overseas and SA. Overseas and SA were the principal BCCI operating companies.

### **BCCI Holdings (Luxembourg SA)**

Incorporated under Luxembourg laws on December 13, 1974, Holdings was the parent bank holding company for Overseas and SA.

### **BCCI (Overseas) Ltd.**

Incorporated under Cayman Islands law on November 25, 1975, BCCI(O) had branches in 28 countries, totalling 63 offices and in the Cayman Islands and around the world.

### **BCCI SA**

Incorporated under Luxembourg laws on September 21, 1972, SA had branches in 13 countries (including England and Luxembourg) totalling 47 offices worldwide.

### **ICIC Group**

The principal companies in the ICIC Group, based in the Cayman Islands, were ICIC Overseas Ltd. and ICIC (Investments) Ltd. They were the principal operating subsidiaries of ICIC Holdings Ltd. In practice, Abedi and Naqvi exercised control over the Group, although it was ostensible independent of BCCI.

### **ICIC Investments Ltd.**

Incorporated on November 14, 1985, this company acted as an investment management and trading company from the offices of ICIC (Overseas) in the Cayman Islands. Virtually its entire business was trading in Treasury Bonds belonging to the Ruling Family's Portfolio account.

ICIC (Overseas) Ltd.

Operating under a Class "B" banking license provided by the Cayman Islands government, ICIC (Overseas) carried on private, offshore banking in the Cayman Islands. More than \$2.6 billion was deposited in Account #20071 at ICIC (Overseas) from 1981 to 1990 by the Ruling Family of Abu Dhabi for investment in the managed Portfolio fund.

**OTHER ENTITIES:**

Credit and Commerce American Holdings (CCAH)

The holding company for First American Bankshares (then Financial General Bankshares), purchased in 1982. A majority of its shareholders were nominees for, and funded by BCCI.

However, it was acknowledged by both the defense and the prosecution in the Robert Altman trial that the Ruling Family's investment was legitimate and was paid for with real money -- their own money.

National Bank of Abu Dhabi (NBAD)

Between 1981 to 1990, a total of more than \$2.6 billion was transferred from the Ruling Family's account at this bank to ICIC and the Portfolio.

Union Bank of Switzerland (UBS)

UBS managed a small portfolio for the Ruling Family, but under the authority of Abedi. Abedi misused his authority to siphon funds from this account back to the Portfolio, where it was then misappropriated.

## **DOCUMENT HISTORY**

The information presented in these materials is based on the best efforts of legal counsel and accountants to carefully piece together disparate and often misleading documentary fragments - some dating back over 13 years.

Since the nature of fraud is to conceal and to mislead, there are some gaps which may never be explained. Therefore, it is impossible to guarantee the absolute veracity of every figure and date. Thus, the overall story as presented is only as accurate as the details of the documentation allow.

The supporting documents come from three sources:

- documents handed over to representatives of the Department of Private Affairs by ICIC in April 1991;
- documents in Swaleh Naqvi's personal collection of 6,000 files;
- documents obtained by the Investigating Committee, which was established by the Majority Shareholders to look into Naqvi's assertions shortly after Abu Dhabi interests acquired their majority stake in BCCI in April 1990.

The task to re-organize all of these records was extremely complex and time-consuming. As researchers discovered, in order to try to hide the misappropriations from the Portfolio, the orders to transfer millions of dollars were recorded literally on scraps of paper. These papers are a collection of memoranda, internal reconciliation exercises and personal notes. The incriminating documentation was often handwritten on plain paper rather than letterhead. Names were often signified simply by initials or, in other instances, are missing altogether.

Although ICIC (Overseas) was allegedly managing the multi-million dollar Portfolio, the records of this managed investment fund were in complete disarray. ICIC was not computerized until 1985 and for reasons still unexplained, the Portfolio was never entered into the computer system. There was no attempt to create a proper accounting system for the Portfolio.

## **CIVIL CLAIM DEFENDANTS**

The Civil Claimants (The Private Department of His Highness The President of the UAE and The Abu Dhabi Investment Authority) have named thirteen defendants in the civil claim filed with the Abu Dhabi Criminal Court. In accordance with UAE law, the civil claim is based on the criminal charges lodged against these former BCCI officers on July 13, 1993. The civil case is expected to proceed simultaneously with the criminal trial which is scheduled to reconvene on December 25, 1993. The following list names the defendants and outlines the criminal charges brought against them.

**Agha Hasan Abedi:**

- 1) Dissipation of Civil Claimants' funds entrusted to him in his capacity as president of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International.
- 2) Forgery of formal banking instruments such as records, documents, final accounts and balance sheets to conceal false loans.
- 3) Utilizing forged instruments to deceive external auditors, the Bank's board of directors and the Civil Claimants despite knowing them to be false.
- 4) Distribution of fictitious profits to the Civil Claimants by overstating the assets of the Bank.
- 5) Dissipation of funds in the Portfolio of Their Highnesses The President of the UAE and The Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi.
- 6) As an accessory with defendant Hassan Mahmoud Kazmi, participation in the commission of forged formal instruments, false evaluation statements of the Investment Portfolio of the first Civil Claimant.
- 7) Utilizing forged instruments by submitting the above mentioned evaluation statements to the Crown Prince while knowing them to be false.

**Mohammed Swaleh Naqvi:**

- 1) Dissipation of the funds of the Civil Claimants.
- 2) The forging of formal instruments being the records, documents, papers, final accounts and balance sheets of the Bank by recording false loans as being real loans.

- 3) Utilizing the forged instruments with external auditors, the board of directors and the civil claimants.
- 4) As an accessory with Agha Hassan Abedi to dissipate the funds forming part of the Investment Portfolio of Their Highnesses The President of the UAE and the Crown Prince.
- 5) Misappropriating Investment Portfolio funds to repay false loans and to fund the losses incurred by BCCI.
- 6) As an accomplice with Hassan Mahmoud Kazmi, participation in the forging of formal instruments, valuation statements of the Investment Portfolio of Their Highnesses.
- 7) Utilizing forged formal instruments concerning the valuation of the Investment Portfolio knowing they were forged.
- 8) By agreement and assistance, and as an accessory with Basheer Ahmad Taher, participating in the dissipation of Civil Claimants funds with Bank of Credit and Commerce (Emirates).

Hassam Mahmoud Kazmi:

- 1) By agreement and assistance and as an accessory with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in the dissipation of the Investment Portfolio funds of Their Highnesses by directing the drawing down of funds from the Portfolio to cover BCCI losses and routing the said funds through a number of banks to disguise their origin.
- 2) Forging formal instruments, valuation statement of the assets of the Investment Portfolio of Their Highnesses.
- 3) Utilizing the forged instruments with external auditors and employees of ICIC knowing they were forged.
- 4) As an accessory and through agreement and assistance with Abedi and Naqvi, participating in the dissipation of Civil Claimants funds with BCCI by agreeing to conceal the deficit and losses suffered by the Bank through creating, organizing and approving false loans and arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.

- 5) As an accessory and through agreement with and assistance of Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments by using false loans in the assets of the Bank as being real loans.

**Ziauddin Ali Akbar:**

- 1) As an accessory and through agreement with the assistance of Abedi and Naqvi, participation in the dissipation of the funds of the Civil Claimants by agreeing to conceal deficits and losses and creating, organizing and approving false loans while arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.
- 2) As an accessory and through agreement with and assistance of Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments to include false loans in the assets of the Bank and approving those loans.
- 3) Utilizing forged formal instruments with external auditors and employees of ICIC knowing they were forged.

**Abdul Hafeez Mohammed  
Ahmad:**

- 1) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in the dissipation of funds of the Civil Claimants by agreeing to conceal the deficit and losses suffered by the bank through creating, organizing and approving false loans and arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.
- 2) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments by agreeing to include false loans in the assets of the Bank as real loans and be approving those loans.

**Imtiaz Ahmad:**

- 1) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in dissipation of funds of the Civil Claimants by agreeing to conceal the deficit and losses suffered by the bank through creating, organizing and approving false loans and arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.

- 2) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments by agreeing to include false loans in the assets of the Bank as real loans and by approving those loans.

**Ameerul Haq Siddiqi:**

- 1) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in dissipation of funds of the Civil Claimants by agreeing to conceal the deficit and losses suffered by the bank through creating, organizing and approving false loans and arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.

- 2) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments by agreeing to include false loans in the assets of the Bank as real loans and by approving those loans.

**Iqbal Ahmad Rawdi:**

- 1) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in dissipation of funds of the Civil Claimant by agreeing to conceal the deficit and losses suffered by the bank through creating, organizing and approving false loans and arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.

- 2) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments by agreeing to include false loans in the assets of the Bank as real loans and by approving those loans.

**Fakhir Hussain:**

- 1) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in dissipation of funds of the Civil Claimants by agreeing to conceal the deficit and losses suffered by the bank through creating, organizing and approving false loans and arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.

- 2) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments by agreeing to include false loans in the assets of the Bank as real loans and by approving those loans.

**Mohammad Azmatullah:**

- 1) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in dissipation of funds of the Civil Claimants by agreeing to conceal the deficit and losses suffered by the bank through creating, organizing and approving false loans and arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.
- 2) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments by agreeing to include false loans in the assets of the Bank as real loans and by approving those loans.
- 3) Utilizing forged instruments by submitting them to external auditors and to relevant monetary authorities knowing they were forged.

**Basheer Ahmad Taher:**

- 1) As general manager for Bank of Credit and Commerce (Emirates), dissipation of Civil Claimants funds by utilizing funds in a purpose other than the purpose for which they were delivered to him. In particular, the transfer of \$150 million to BCCI to cover the deficit and losses incurred by the Bank.
- 2) Forging a formal instrument being the memorandum relating to the creation of a loan in the sum of US\$ 150 million in the name of His Highness Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed, stating therein - contrary to the fact - that His Highness had issued his instructions for the creation of the said loan.
- 3) Utilizing a forged instrument by submitting the instrument to the external accountants knowing it to be forged.

**Zafar Iqbal Chawdary:**

- 1) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in dissipation of funds of the Civil Claimants by agreeing to conceal the deficit and losses suffered by the bank through creating, organizing and approving false loans and arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.
- 2) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments

by agreeing to include false loans in the assets of the Bank as real loans and by approving those loans.

- 3) Utilizing forged instruments as an accomplice with Akbar and Azmatullah by submitting the instrument to the external auditors and to relevant monetary authorities knowing them to be false.
- 4) As an accomplice and through agreement with Taher, participating in the dissipation of the funds of the Civil Claimants with Bank of Credit and Commerce (Emirates) by agreeing with him to transfer \$150 million to BCCI to fund its losses. In addition, he aided him, in association with Naqvi by approving the transfer without complying with proper banking procedure.
- 5) Forgery of a formal instrument being a letter issued by the Bank of Credit and Commerce (Emirates) to His Highness Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed containing details of the false loan registered in the name of His Highness by stating in the said letter, contrary to the fact, that he had delivered the same to His Highness Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed personally while the true fact was that he did not deliver it to him.
- 6) Utilizing the above-mentioned forged instrument by submitting it to the external accountants knowing the instrument to be false.

**Mohammed Hashim Shaikh:**

- 1) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in dissipation of funds of the Civil Claimants by agreeing to conceal the deficit and losses suffered by the bank through creating, organizing and approving false loans and arranging the repayment of other delinquent loans.
- 2) As an accessory and through agreement with Abedi and Naqvi, participation in forging formal instruments by agreeing to include false loans in the assets of the Bank as real loans and by approving those loans.

## **PORTFOLIO FRAUD: KEY PLAYERS**

### **Agha Hasan Abedi**

The founder and President of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International, Abedi convinced the Ruling Family to transfer funds from the National Bank of Abu Dhabi into an investment Portfolio which he would manage. Abedi controlled the Portfolio using the Cayman-based International Credit and Investment Company (Overseas) Ltd.

Between 1980 and 1988, Abedi was, within BCCI, the ultimate source of authority for the misappropriation of Portfolio funds. After suffering a heart attack in February 1988, Abedi withdrew from active participation in the BCCI Group. He resigned as President of the bank in 1990 at the insistence of the Majority Shareholders.

Abedi stands accused by the UAE Attorney General of criminal fraud and forgery, specifically the misappropriation of funds from the Portfolio to disguise losses suffered by the BCCI Group. He is being tried in absentia.

Abedi, 71, is at large in his native Pakistan.

### **Swaleh Naqvi**

The head of BCCI's Central Support Office and the bank's Chief Executive Officer from 1988 to 1991, Naqvi was responsible for day-to-day control of BCCI's operations. He was a key figure from the beginning in the decade-long fraud scheme, although he only received formal authorization to transfer Portfolio funds in 1988 when he assumed control of the BCCI and ICIC groups following Abedi's heart attack.

Considered Abedi's most trusted deputy, Naqvi created the structure that enabled more than \$2 billion worth of funds to be stolen from the Portfolio. Naqvi also had a prime role disguising the misappropriations from the Ruling Family by the production of false valuation statements.

Naqvi, 58, a Pakistani/British national, is in custody in Abu Dhabi and has been charged with 19 counts of fraud and conspiracy by the UAE Attorney General.

**Hassan Kazmi**

The General Manager of the ICIC Group, Kazmi in effect ran ICIC from the 7th floor of BCCI's London headquarters. His duties within ICIC included overall responsibility for the day-to-day management of the Portfolio.

Kazmi organized the complex routing of stolen funds from the Portfolio to their ultimate recipients. Kazmi was also involved in the creation of fictitious ICIC loans and used Portfolio funds to cover BCCI's losses. He also prepared false and misleading reports specifically designed to deceive the Portfolio's owners.

Kazmi, a 56-year-old Pakistani national, is currently in custody in Abu Dhabi and is standing trial on charges of assisting Abedi and Naqvi in committing fraud.

**Ziauddin Akbar**

The head of BCCI's Central Treasury Division from 1982 to 1986, Akbar was responsible for the loss of more than \$1.3 billion during his disastrous tenure at the Treasury Division.

Akbar also managed commodities and currency exchange for BCCI, where funds from the Portfolio supposedly were invested in CDs, precious metals, commodities and currencies. Instead, Portfolio funds were diverted to cover Treasury Division trading losses.

A U.K. national, Akbar pleaded guilty to 16 counts of fraud and false accounting in relation to BCCI brought against him by the U.K.'s Serious Fraud Office, and is serving a 16 year jail sentence. The Attorney General of the United Arab Emirates has also charged Akbar with seven counts of fraud and conspiracy, which carries a 17-year prison sentence. Like Abedi, he is being tried in absentia.

**Mohammed Azmatullah**

As an officer within BCCI's Central Support Organization, Azmatullah served as a trusted assistant to Naqvi. Responsible for the day-to-day management of various delinquent accounts at the Kuwait International Finance Company -- as well as several of BCCI's fictitious loans accounts -- Azmatullah frequently requested misappropriations from the Portfolio to fund those accounts.

Azmatullah, a 62-year-old Pakistani/British national, is in custody in Abu Dhabi and is standing trial on charges of misappropriating Portfolio funds and assisting Abedi and Naqvi in their fraudulent scheme.

**Mohammed Hashim Shaikh**

The former head of BCCI's Special Duties Group, Shaikh worked directly under Naqvi and was responsible for loans to the Gulf Group, a Pakistani shipping company that accumulated massive debt during the 1980s. Shaikh used funds stolen from the Portfolio to conceal Gulf Group losses. Had the true extent of BCCI's exposure to the Gulf Group been known, it is likely the bank would have collapsed during the mid-1980s.

Shaikh, a British national, is believed to be in Pakistan.

**Mohammed Yacoob Kassim**

An Investment Manager for ICIC (Overseas), Kassim was Kazmi's main assistant at the Cayman Islands operation. His principal responsibility was trading in Treasury bonds for the Portfolio, and specifically organized their secret sale back to brokers to generate funds for misappropriations.

Kassim was responsible for maintaining an internal record, such as they were, of sums transferred into and out of the Portfolio and assisted Abedi and Naqvi in their efforts to mislead the Ruling Family regarding the Portfolio's status.

Kassim is believed to be in Pakistan.

**Imran Imam**

Imam served as an officer within BCCI's Central Support Organization under Naqvi. His responsibilities included the management of the nominee shareholdings in Credit and Commerce American Holdings (CAAH). He was also responsible for the accounts of Ghaith Pharaon, the Saudi financier who allegedly was a front man for BCCI activities in the U.S.

As the officer in charge of the accounts of CCAH shareholders, Imam made requests to Abedi, Naqvi and Kazmi to misappropriate funds from the Portfolio account to finance the secret purchase of shares of CCAH.

Imam is currently facing charges of false accounting brought by the U.K.'s Serious Fraud Office.

**Afzal Hussein Dossani**

Dossani was the manager in charge of administration, operations and banking at ICIC (Overseas) and a frequent signatory of misappropriations from the Portfolio. He worked with Kassim and took instructions from Kazmi.

Dossani originally worked in the Investment Division of BCCI, based at the bank's Central Support Organization, where he served under Hassan Mohammed Kazmi before switching over to ICIC. He was the most senior ICIC officer in the bank's Grand Cayman office until the appointment of Wazir Hussain Jafree in 1987. He conspired with Naqvi and Abedi to misappropriate funds from the Portfolio and was responsible for ensuring their instructions were carried out in the Caymans.

Dossani is believed to be in Pakistan.

**Anwar Ali Gillani**

Gillani was head of the BCCI Group's Investments Division, and was entrusted by Naqvi with the task of supervising the Portfolio thefts and keeping track of where funds had been paid.

Gillani is believed to be in Pakistan.

**Wazir Hussain Jafree**

In March 1987, Jafree was appointed Managing Director of ICIC (Overseas), and a signatory to various Portfolio sub-accounts. Working with Kazmi, he was also responsible for providing false audit confirmations in relation to the Portfolio.

Jafree is believed to be in Pakistan.

**S.M. Akbar**

Akbar was the General Manager of BCCI (Overseas) from 1983 to 1990 and the head of BCCI's Special Duties Department between 1989 and 1990. He worked closely with Naqvi.

Akbar was responsible for creating and maintaining fictitious accounts at BCCI (Overseas) Grand Cayman, which were funded from the Portfolio in order to disguise losses in the Treasury Division.

Akbar is believed to be in Pakistan.

## **PRIMARY RECIPIENTS OF PORTFOLIO FUNDS**

### **Gulf Group**

A Pakistani conglomerate involved in the shipping industry and perhaps one of the biggest recipients of misappropriated funds from the Portfolio. Approximately \$600 million of Portfolio monies was routed through to delinquent Gulf Group accounts in order to disguise the huge scale of indebtedness to BCCI from 1981 to 1989.

### **BCCI Treasury Division**

Until 1986, when Ziauddin Akbar disclosed to Swaleh Naqvi that it had suffered huge losses, the Treasury Division was a major source of reported profits for the BCCI Group. As the head of the Treasury Division until 1986, Akbar used funds either belonging to other BCCI clients or funds misappropriated from the Portfolio to cover up losses. The Treasury Division's losses from 1980 to 1985 totalled more than \$1.5 billion; it lost \$180 million in 1986 and an additional \$200 million in 1987.

### **BCCI Capital Notes**

Funds from the Portfolio were supposedly invested in Capital Notes of BCCI. For example, there was an investment of \$200 million in Capital Notes in December 1985, although the actual payment was not made until March 1986 -- the same time as the discovery of the BCCI Treasury Division's losses. It seems that this investment was deliberately created and backdated so as to disguise its real purpose.

### **BCCI Shares**

Over \$800 million was transferred from the Portfolio purportedly for the acquisition of shares in BCCI. But in actual fact, the recipient of these funds was BCCI; the alleged sellers of the shares were BCCI nominees and this was merely another device whereby Abedi and Naqvi could steal further funds from the Portfolio.

### **CAPCOM**

A commodities company established by BCCI Treasury Division head Akbar in 1982, Capcom was a favored recipient of business from BCCI's Treasury Division. In addition, it was the recipient of Portfolio funds, the most notable case being a \$100 million transfer in early 1986.

### Secret Funding of CCAH

Portfolio funds were used by Abedi and Naqvi to fund BCCI's secret acquisition of Credit and Commerce American Holdings (CCAHA) in 1982, when \$70 million was used for the acquisition of CCAH shares. The 1986 rights issue of CCAH was partially funded by Portfolio funds. These misappropriations only came to light following the closure of the bank in 1991.

### CCAHA Shares -- Ruling Family

Although shares in CCAH were acquired for the Ruling Family using Portfolio funds, Abedi and Naqvi also reported that they had purchased 20,147 shares in CCAH for the Portfolio when in fact those shares never existed. The alleged acquisition of these shares was designed to disguise the misappropriation of \$101 million by Ziauddin Akbar in 1984.

### Funding for Delinquent or False Loans

In excess of \$1 billion was removed from the Portfolio to service delinquent or false loans with the BCCI and ICIC Groups and their affiliates, the most notable being the Kuwait International Finance Company (KIFCO). Documents confirm that this use of misappropriated funds occurred from 1981 to 1989.

### Liquidity

In instances where Portfolio funds were not misappropriated, they still were used to bolster the liquidity of the BCCI Group. Funds supposedly deposited into ICIC for investment in the Portfolio were, in fact, held in BCCI accounts.

### Unrecorded Deposits

Portfolio funds also were used to replace deposits which had been made by other BCCI Group clients but either were not recorded or had been misappropriated.

**Tom Buell, chairman of the Canadian Forest Industries Council, issued the following statement today in response to a binational panel's third ruling on injury in the U.S.-Canada softwood lumber countervailing duty case**

"This is the third time this binational panel has unanimously remanded the U.S. International Trade Commission's (ITC's) injury finding citing a series of fundamental legal and factual flaws in the ITC's analysis.

"We hoped that the injury panel would have reversed the ITC's injury finding at this time. We remain confident that today's remand to the ITC will ultimately result in Canada's complete vindication in this case.

"Indeed, we believe that when the ITC reviews the record in light of the panel's directions, it must conclude that there is no basis whatsoever for an injury finding. The U.S. has a timber shortage, with record-setting lumber prices and industry profits. Under these circumstances, it is inconceivable that the ITC could find the U.S. industry injured or threatened with injury by Canadian imports.

"This unwarranted case has dragged on for more than two-and-a-half years. It is time for the ITC to acknowledge that there is simply no basis for a finding of injury to the American industry from Canadian lumber exports.

"This is now the fifth time that an independent binational panel has ruled that the U.S. countervailing duty case against Canadian lumber imports is completely without merit. A separate panel reviewing the subsidy determination by the Department of Commerce ordered the agency to find no subsidy. That decision should have signalled the end to this entire case against Canada, but unfortunately, the U.S. concocted a set of allegations and filed an extraordinary challenge to an independent committee. We anticipate that the committee will determine that the finding of no subsidy should stand."

FINAL CHALLENGE UPHOLDS EARLIER FINDING OF NO SUBSIDY**

**Canadian Lumber Industry Hails Outcome  
In "Case That Should Never Have Been Brought"**

WASHINGTON, D.C. --- A challenge panel convened under terms of the Canada-U.S. Free Trade Agreement today ended a long-running trade dispute by upholding a binational review panel ruling that Canada does not subsidize its softwood lumber exports to the United States.

Today's decision by an Extraordinary Challenge Committee (ECC) is the final step in the lumber case which began in 1991 when the U.S. Department of Commerce self-initiated a countervailing duty case, claiming that Canada's timber pricing and log export policies constituted subsidies to the Canadian industry.

By a vote of 2-1, the three-member ECC rejected allegations of bias regarding two members of the binational review panel and upheld the panel's determination that the U.S. subsidy allegations were unsubstantiated and not supported by the facts or the law.

The ruling brings the case to a conclusion and will result in the return of about \$800 million in duties that have been paid by Canadian lumber exporters to the U.S. Based on its determinations, which were rejected by the binational review panel and the ECC, the Commerce Department had imposed a 6.51 percent duty on all Canadian softwood lumber exports to the U.S.

The ECC decision was immediately hailed by Mr. Tom Buell, chairman of the Canadian Forest Industries Council:

"It has taken nearly three years but our position has been fully and finally vindicated," Mr. Buell said. "We have said from the beginning of this case that Canada does not subsidize its softwood lumber exports. Today's decision affirms that position."

Mr. Buell noted that this was the third time in the past 11 years that the U.S. had brought a countervailing duty case against Canada, and he said the latest dispute imposed unwarranted costs on both sides.

"Our governments and industries have expended enormous amounts of time, effort and money on a case that should never have been brought," Mr. Buell said. "Surely, the best way to proceed is to find a way to avoid such wasteful litigation in the future."

It is expected that the ECC ruling will render moot a parallel process through which a second binational review panel has been considering allegations that Canadian softwood lumber exports are injuring the U.S. lumber industry. That binational review panel has three times rejected determinations of injury by the U.S. International Trade Commission.

**STATEMENT FROM MIKE APSEY, PRINCIPAL TRADE COORDINATOR,  
CANADIAN FOREST INDUSTRIES COUNCIL, REGARDING THE U.S. LUMBER  
COALITION LAWSUIT CHALLENGING THE CONSTITUTIONALITY  
OF THE DISPUTE SETTLEMENT PROCESSES  
IN THE U.S.-CANADIAN FREE TRADE AGREEMENT (FTA)  
AND THE NORTH AMERICAN FREE TRADE AGREEMENT (NAFTA)**

"By challenging the binational panel review process, the Coalition is threatening the FTA and NAFTA.

"The Coalition filed this lawsuit only because it lost the countervailing duty case on its merits, and rather than admit defeat, it decided to take on the entire free trade process. To achieve its narrow ends, a handful of U.S. lumber companies is seeking to destroy the benefits of North American free trade and undermine U.S. relations between Canada and Mexico.

"The constitutionality of the process was thoroughly reviewed during implementation of the Canada-U.S. FTA, and so universally accepted that the process was incorporated into NAFTA. The process has been used in more than 20 binational panel proceedings and two extraordinary challenges, and not one of the parties to these proceedings has ever suggested the process was unconstitutional.

"Like the coalition's countervailing duty case against Canada, this case, too, is without merit and will fail. But before a final decision, a great deal of political uncertainty will have been created through this act of legal petulance and desperation.

"While the Coalition is using this lawsuit to try and keep this case alive, a binational challenge committee said this case is over and we fully expect our lumber industry's approximately (U.S.) \$600 million in cash deposits to be returned in the near future."

**CFIC SEEKS TO OPPOSE NAFTA REVIEW CHALLENGE;**  
**AGAIN URGES U.S. TO RETURN LUMBER DUTIES**

Washington, D.C. -- The Canadian Forest Industries Council (CFIC) today filed a motion with the U.S. Court of Appeals to intervene in a lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of the binational review process established by the Canada-U.S. Free Trade Agreement and the North American Free Trade Agreement.

Mr. Mike Apsey, president of CFIC, blasted the "doomed and desperate" lawsuit, and at the same time, criticized the United States for stalling the refund of countervailing duties owed Canadian lumber producers as a result of Canada's victory in the U.S.-Canadian lumber dispute.

Last month, after the U.S. lost the three-year lumber dispute, a small group of U.S. lumber companies asked the U.S. Court of Appeals to declare unconstitutional the review process under which the lumber case was resolved. Today's filing would allow CFIC to intervene in opposition to the lawsuit to ensure that its interests are protected.

"The U.S. lumber producers that filed this suit give new meaning to the term sore loser," said Mr. Apsey. "The lawsuit challenges not only Canada's victory in the case, but the entire North American free trade structure. It is a doomed and desperate attempt to reverse a three-year legal process which both the U.S. and Canada, by agreement, law and regulation, had committed to follow.

"We will take every action necessary to preserve our victory and the sanctity of the free trade agreements, and we expect the American government to defend the Constitution and the Free Trade Agreement by vigorously contesting this suit."

Mr. Apsey said the lawsuit should have no impact on the American government's ability to return about (U.S.) \$600 million in duties wrongfully collected during the Canada-U.S. lumber dispute.

"We expect the American government to follow the law, not the pleadings of special interests," Mr. Apsey said. "This case is over, and the decision was clear. The U.S. was not entitled to collect those duties in the first place and so they must now be returned."

**PRESIDENT-ELECT ERNESTO SAMPER MEETS WITH UNITED STATES  
AND UNITED NATIONS OFFICIALS DURING NEW YORK CITY VISIT**

New York - President-elect Ernesto Samper of the Republic of Colombia met with high-level officials from the U.S. Department of State today to discuss the current state of Colombian-U.S. bilateral relations, and proposed the formation of a Binational Commission to coordinate joint policy and cooperative programs between the two nations. President-elect Samper proposed that various government agencies of both countries involved in the fight against narcotrafficking and other bilateral issues be represented on the Commission.

President-elect Samper, who will assume the Colombian Presidency on August 8, 1994, was accompanied at the meeting by Colombia's Foreign Minister, Noemí Sanín; the Colombian Ambassador to the United States, Gabriel Silva; the Colombian Ambassador to the United Nations, Luis Fernando Jaramillo; and by Rodrigo Pardo and Nestor Humberto Martínez, who have recently been named by President-elect Samper to serve as Minister of Foreign Affairs and Minister of Justice, respectively, in the new government. The U.S. State Department was represented at the working meeting by Ambassador Michael Skol, Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary, Bureau of Inter-American Affairs, and Mr. Chris Arcos, Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary, Bureau for International Narcotics Matters.

President-elect Samper outlined to the State Department officials the principal guidelines his Administration will pursue in the international fight against narcotrafficking, including a commitment to expand Colombian efforts against drug money-laundering. Common grounds were also established to give continuity to current Colombian-U.S. efforts and to develop new actions and initiatives when the Samper government assumes office.


In addition, President-elect Samper announced today he would send a delegation to Washington within the next few weeks to initiate contact and discussions between the designated Colombian Ministers of Defense, Justice and Foreign Affairs and their U.S. government counterparts.

President-elect Samper's meeting with the U.S. State Department follows talks Tuesday with United Nations General Secretary Boutros Boutros-Ghali, where the two leaders exchanged views on a number of international issues, including the political situation in Haiti and Bosnia.

## Bolivia : A Country on the Move

- ***Bolivia's New Government:*** On August 6, 1993, Gonzalo Sanchez de Lozada became Bolivia's fourth consecutive democratically-elected president since 1982. His cabinet is made up of young business leaders committed to social justice, economic growth, and sustainable development. President Sanchez de Lozada, who grew up in the United States and graduated from the University of Chicago, gained popularity as the Senator and Planning Minister who designed the 1985 "shock therapy" program that successfully curbed hyper-inflation, instituted free-market reforms, and created the foundation for future economic growth.
- ***From Dictatorship to Democracy:*** Bolivia use to be considered one of the most unstable governments in Latin America. Now, democracy is firmly established. Since 1982, Bolivia has chosen four presidents by free and fair democratic elections. In each case, the new president was an opposition leader and the ensuing transition was peaceful and orderly. Popular Participation, a key element of the *El Plan de Todos* will further entrench democracy by transferring substantial political power to local communities.
- ***An Economy in Transition:*** Located in the heart of South America, Bolivia is strategically positioned to supply the region's 270 million consumers. Its economy is characterized by stability, low inflation, and steady growth. Inflation fell from 23,447% in 1985 to 9.3% in 1993 -- the lowest rate in South America for that year. GDP rebounded to 4% in 1993 and is estimated to reach 4.5% in 1994. Bolivia is an Andean Pact member and has preferential trade agreements with Brazil, Chile, Peru, Argentina, Paraguay, Uruguay, and Mexico. The U.S. is Bolivia's largest source of imported goods and foreign investment.
- ***Environmental Excellence:*** Bolivia is a land of fantastic environmental diversity. It contains the full range of the earth's geographic features including the snow-capped Andes Mountains, the valleys of Yungas, rain forests and tropical lowlands, and the rushing rivers of the Amazon River basin. Bolivia also is home to every type of flora and fauna found on the South American continent. The government does not take these responsibilities lightly and is recognized as an international environmental leader. President Sanchez is continuing this tradition by establishing the world's first *Ministry for Sustainable Development and the Environment*.

## **A Progressive Model for Sustainable Development**

The concept of sustainable development maintains that a country can develop politically, economically, and socially without exhausting its national resources. Sustainable development means much more than balancing the needs of economic growth with environmental protection. It also means nurturing indigenous cultures, strengthening and encouraging participatory democracy, and rationalizing the use of natural resources so they may be preserved for future generations.

Bolivia is a pioneer in the field of sustainable development. It is the first country to enact a long term reform strategy, *El Plan de Todos*, or *The Plan for Everyone*, that employs sustainable development as its operative policy framework. The major policy components of *El Plan de Todos* are:

- **Capitalization of the 6 largest state owned-enterprises, which will generate economic growth and give the Bolivian people ownership interests in these enterprises;**
- **Popular Participation, which will transfer political and economic decision-making authority to local communities thereby expanding political participation and strengthening democracy;**
- **Education and Health Care Reform, which will increase the ability of every Bolivian to improve his quality of life and participate more fully in public life; and**
- **Judicial Reform, which will make the system more responsive to the needs of individuals and strengthen Bolivia's democratic institutions.**

The primary goal of sustainable development and *El Plan de Todos* is to create greater opportunities for all Bolivians to improve their quality of life. To ensure the attainment of sustainable development's goals, President Sanchez de Lozada has created the world's first *Ministry for Sustainable Development and the Environment*.

# Capitalization

*"The social and economic effect of the Capitalization program will be to transform the Bolivian state "*

- Capitalization, the central economic program of *El Plan de Todos*, is designed to maximize the commercial potential of Bolivia's six largest state-owned enterprises, create the stimulus necessary for an unprecedented investment boom, generate economic growth, and provide the opportunity for all Bolivians to play a greater role in the country's economic activity.
- The key operating principle of Capitalization is *contribution*. The government will contribute assets -- the state enterprise to be capitalized -- and strategic (primarily foreign) investors will contribute capital equal to the state's contribution. A new "mixed corporation" will thus be created that has doubled its value. Investors will be given a 50% ownership interest and full management control. The remaining 50% equity will be distributed to the 3.2 million Bolivian's aged 21 years old and over.
- Capitalization will be a mechanism for a large redistribution of wealth. All Bolivian citizens 21 years or older will become title holders in the newly capitalized companies and will receive dividends in the form of individual pension funds. The distribution of these benefits will provide retirement benefits to recipients and generate internal savings that will strengthen the economy in the long run.
- The six-stated owned enterprises to be Capitalized are: YPFB (oil and gas), LAB (airline), ENTEL (telecommunications), ENDE (electricity), ENFE (railroad), ENAF (mineral smelting). The value of these firms is over 65% of Bolivia's annual GDP, making this one of the largest efforts to convert state assets to private ownership in the world.

# Popular Participation

- *El Plan de Todos* is founded upon the belief that genuine, qualitative political participation by all citizens is an absolute requirement for the continuation of stable representative democracy in Bolivia. Strong democratic institutions and broad-based citizen participation are also necessary to achieve the goals of social justice, national unity, and sustainable development.
- Popular Participation will radically change Bolivia's political power structure. Political power that is currently exercised by the central government will be transferred to historically marginalized groups. Locally-based grass roots organizations, called *Organizaciones Territoriales de Bases* (OTB's) will be the primary recipients of this transfer of political and economic power. The OTB's will be empowered to decide how money from the central, departmental, and municipal governments will be spent in their communities. This structure will vastly improve the administrative efficiency of government programs and provide for a more just distribution of resources.
- Education, health care, basic sanitation, infrastructure and irrigation projects, and local economic development are the most important areas where popular participation will return political power and authority to the Bolivian people. The breadth of authority that will be delegated by the central government underscores the President's commitment to local political empowerment and a just distribution of resources.
- The central government has earmarked 20% of its budget to finance the public programs called for by popular participation. Of this amount, a 10% cap will be placed on administrative costs to ensure that the Bolivian people receive the maximum benefits of local participation and empowerment.

# Education Reform

- The educational reform program of *El Plan de Todos* makes a dramatic break with the past by completely overhauling Bolivia's current educational system. There are four primary objectives to President Sanchez de Lozada's plan for education reform:
  - *Global Change*: the reform plan will change teaching and administrative techniques, institute regionally-based curriculum, and make educational institutions more responsive to the people.
  - *Total Change*: educational reform will impact every level of Bolivia's educational system -- formal education, non-formal education, and special education.
  - *Gradual Change*: the plan creates an entire new educational system. Implementing such an ambitious program must be gradually, particularly in a country of such great ethnic diversity.
  - *Permanent Change*: these reforms are designed to be permanent because the world is changing. Bolivia must learn to embrace these changes if it is to succeed in the new world environment.
- The goal of the President's plan is to help build a well-educated and productive society so the people can enjoy a better standard of living, a more just society, and achieve the objectives of sustainable development. Consistent with precepts of Popular Participation, the control and direction of educational programs in local communities will be determined by the *Organizaciones Territoriales de Bases*.

# Judicial Reform

*"Only through the establishment of a strong, corruption-free judiciary can the Bolivian people enjoy the full benefits of democracy."*

The Government of President Sanchez de Lozada is committed to creating an independent judicial system that is efficient, committed to the protection and promotion of individual rights, and free of corruption. A strong and independent judiciary is needed to strengthen Bolivia's democratic institutions and solidify confidence in its free market system. The Sanchez de Lozada Administration's program for judicial reform falls into the following categories:

- Improving efficiency and the administration of Justice,
- Mounting a vigorous anti-corruption campaign,
- Protecting and promoting human rights,
- Updating laws that will improve Bolivia's business environment, including laws on arbitration, intellectual property, copyrights, trademarks and patents, trusts, a stock exchange, and pension funds,
- Simplifying and improving laws which have the greatest impact on people's daily lives, including the Criminal Process Code, the Civil Code, and the Commercial Code,
- Establishing a process in which the Ministry of Justice reviews and modifies legal proposals or projects by other departments before they are sent to the Congress. This will improve the efficiency of the legislative process.

## **His Excellency Gonzalo Sanchez de Lozada**

His excellency Gonzalo Sanchez de Lozada was inaugurated as the 61st President of Bolivia in August 1993. The people of Bolivia elected President Sanchez de Lozada in the fourth consecutive democratic election since 1982. As the leader of the Movimiento Nacionalista Revolucionario (MNR) in 1989, President Sanchez de Lozada received a plurality of the national vote for president, but was denied office due to a political agreement between two opposition parties and a subsequent vote in Congress. In the 1993 elections he won the popular vote again and assumed the Presidency.

As former Senator and Minister for Planning, Sanchez de Lozada gained popular recognition as the author of the 1985 economic "shock therapy" program, which brought Bolivia's 25,000% hyper-inflation rate under control and created the foundation for future economic growth. Today, Bolivia enjoys steady growth and a 9.3% rate of inflation, the lowest in Latin America.

Since his inauguration, President Sanchez de Lozada has emerged as one of the most thoughtful and effective leaders in Latin America. *El Plan de Todos* (The Plan for Everyone) is the President's innovative plan to bring profound economic, social, and political changes to Bolivia. The main elements of *El Plan de Todos* are Capitalization, the transfer of Bolivia's largest state-owned enterprises to private owners; Education and Judicial Reform; and Popular Participation, which will strengthen democracy by transferring significant decision making authority to local communities.

President Sanchez de Lozada was born in 1930. he is married to Ximena Iturralde Monje and has two children. President Sanchez de Lozada is a graduate of the University of Chicago.

## **Bolivia's Free Trade Reforms**

- In 1990, the Government of Bolivia passed an investment law which guarantees all investors national treatment, free currency conversion, unrestricted remittances, and free mobility of capital. Bolivia has also implemented anti-dumping regulations and is currently formulating an anti-monopoly law.
- Bolivia changed its tariff rates to a two-tier system: 5% for a defined list of capital goods, and 10% for the remainder of imports. These reduced rates are among the lowest in Latin America.
- Bolivia acceded to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) and all Bolivia trade statutes and regulations are in compliance with GATT and the General Agreement on Trade in Services (GATS).
- Bolivia is a member of the Andean Pact and Latin American Integration Association. Bolivia already has free trade agreements with its Andean Pact partners: Ecuador, Colombia, Venezuela, and Peru, and is negotiating one with Mexico. Additionally, it has preferential trade agreements with Paraguay, Uruguay, Brazil, Chile, Argentina, and Mexico.

## **Bolivia: Economic Stability and Growth**

- **Economy by Sector:** While a significant portion of its economy is related to the production of natural resources (20.5%), Bolivia's service (9.5%) and manufacturing (16%) sectors are growing.
- **Annual GDP:** Bolivia's GDP rebounded to 4% in 1993 and is forecasted to reach 4.5% in 1994.
- **Inflation:** Inflation has fallen from 23,447% in 1985 to an annual rate of 9.3% in 1993.
- **South America's Inflation:** Bolivia's 1993 inflation rate (9.3%) was the lowest rate of inflation in South America.
- **Foreign Reserves:** The increase in international reserves from 18.6 \$US million in 1989 to 370.9 \$US million in 1993 has played a significant role in Bolivia's economic recovery.
- **Direct Foreign Investment:** United States 66%, Argentina 9%, Colombia 8%, Canada 8%, Australia 5% (1993).
- **Fiscal Deficit:** The Bolivian Government has been vigilant in controlling its budget deficit which is forecasted to register 3% of GDP in 1994.
- **Private Deposits:** Bolivia's economic revival is demonstrated by the dramatic increase in private deposits from 69 \$US million in 1985 to 2,053 \$US million in 1993.
- **Investment in Bolivia:** Both private and public investment have increased dramatically from a total of 473.6 \$US million in 1989 to a total of 950.5 \$US million in 1993.
- **US Exports to South America:** U.S. exports to South America grew at a rate of 19.5% between 1991-1992.
- **Bilateral Trade:** Bilateral trade between Bolivia and the US has steadily increased to 407.8 \$US million in 1993.
- **US Exports:** US exports to Bolivia have risen more than 150% over the last four years to reach 215.9 \$US million.
- **Bolivian Exports:** The U.S. (19%) was second only to Argentina(31%) in destinations of Bolivian exports. In terms of overall trade, the U.S. was Bolivia's largest trading partner.
- **Bolivian Imports:** The United States (24%) was the largest source of Bolivian imports in 1993.

## Bolivia: A Fact Sheet

- Bolivia is a land-locked country located in the heart of South America. It is approximately the size of Texas and California combined.
- Bolivia is a land of fantastic diversity containing all of the earth's topographical features - the snow-capped Andes Mountains, the valleys of the Yungas, rain forests, tropical lowlands, and the rushing rivers of the Amazon basin.
- Bolivia's government is an international environmental leader. It pioneered "debt for nature" swaps and is the first country in the world to create a *Ministry for Sustainable Development and the Environment*.
- Only 30% of Bolivia's territory is located in the Andean highlands. The remaining 70% is tropical lowlands and rain forests.
- Approximately one-half of Bolivia's population of 7 million are Aymara, Quechua, and Guarani Indians.
- Bolivia is one of the most stable democracies in Latin America. Since 1982, four consecutive democratic presidential elections have been held. In each election, an opposition party won and the ensuing transition was peaceful and orderly.
- Bolivia's government consists of executive, legislative and judicial branches. The President and Vice-President are elected by national vote every four years. The Legislature is comprised of a 27 member Senate and 130 member Chamber of Deputies. Members are chosen by popular election. The Judiciary is an independent branch of the government.
- Bolivia's president is Gonzalo Sanchez de Lozada. Sanchez de Lozada grew up in the United States and graduated from the University of Chicago with a degree in Philosophy. He is the founder of a successful mining company and a movie production company. President Sanchez de Lozada has served as a Senator and as Minister for Planning.
- Confronting its worst economic crisis in 1985, Bolivia instituted a "shock therapy" program designed by then Planning Minister Sanchez de Lozada. This plan curbed hyper-inflation from 24,000% to 20% in two years, lifted private sector price controls, allowed the exchange rate to float freely, and created the foundation for today's growth economy.
- The President's national program, called *El Plan de Todos*, or the Plan for Everyone, will bring about dramatic political, economic, and social change and will prepare

Bolivia to meet the challenges of the 21st century. The Plan for Everyone's main policy components are:

- ◆ **Capitalization:** The six largest public enterprises will be converted to private ownership. Government will contribute the enterprises' assets and strategic investors will invest an equal amount of capital *into the enterprise*. Investors will be given half ownership and full management control. The remaining 50% equity will be distributed to Bolivians 21 and older.
- ◆ **Popular Participation:** The central government will transfer economic and political decision-making authority to historically marginalized groups and local communities, thereby strengthening democracy and creating greater social justice. Local communities will be empowered to make decisions on health care, education, and local development issues.
- ◆ **Sustainable Development:** The framework of the Plan for Everyone is sustainable development -- the idea that economic growth must be balanced with the rational use of natural resources and environmental protection. President Sanchez de Lozada has created the *Ministry for Sustainable Development and the Environment* to ensure that all government policies are environmentally sensitive and safeguard the interests of future generations.
- Vice-President Victor Hugo Cardenas, an Aymara Indian intellectual, is the highest ranking Indian official in the history of American democracy. His accession to power exemplifies the ethnic harmony of Bolivian society.
- Bolivia's economy is characterized by stability, steady growth (4%), and the lowest annual rate of inflation in Latin America (9.3%).
- In a May 1, 1994 report to the President on future NAFTA partners, U.S. Trade Rep. Mickey Kantor wrote, "Bolivia has made remarkable economic advances since 1985, becoming a country with some enviable macroeconomic conditions (including an inflation rate of under 10 percent and growth rate of about 4 percent)."
- While the export of natural gas remains important to the health of the Bolivian economy, non-traditional exports such as soybeans, timber, leather, coffee, jewelry, textiles, alpaca woolens and manufactured goods have become important income earners.

## Macroeconomic Climate of Bolivia

For more than the past seven years, Bolivia has successfully employed policies targeting low inflation, real productive growth, and increasing market openings without restrictive legislation. A few of the most important indicators which demonstrate the success of these policies and the resulting stability are:

- Inflation in 1993 registered below 10%, and projections based on the first quarter of 1994 indicate that inflation for 1994 will be at or below 7.5% for the year as targeted. This remarkable success is due in large part to the stability of the exchange rate regime enforced by the Central Bank, which pegs the Boliviano to the dollar with continuous nominal depreciations. Whereas before the stabilization program there was a large spread between the parallel (black market) exchange rate, and the official, currently the difference between the official and the informal market is less than 1%.
- Deposits in the commercial banking system grew over 27% during 1993 and rose an additional 6.5% in the first quarter of 1994, reflecting increasing public confidence in the security of the banking system. This growth occurred despite a fall in the real interest rates offered in the commercial banking system.
- Real gross national product rose for the seventh consecutive year by 3.2% in 1993, and indicators for 1994 show a growth of 4.6% over the prior year during January and February alone. Production is slated to grow 4.5% for the year of 1994.
- Net international reserves held by the Central Bank climbed a large 52.2% during 1993 as a result of strict monetary controls on credit to the public sector and large capital inflows to the country.
- The fiscal deficit, which has ranged between 3.4% and 6.6% of GDP over the past six years, is projected to end 1994 at approximately 3% of GDP. The willingness of the government to contain expenditures is one of the pillars of the stability of the economy.
- The commercial foreign debt of Bolivia was virtually eliminated in May 1993 through buy-backs and swaps, public bilateral debt has been restructured on very favorable terms which ease the debt burden on the balance of payments. Debt service obligations have averaged 3.5% of GDP over the past three years.

## Qualifying for the World Cup: Bolivia's Story

This is a story of a South American giant killer...a modern day "David" that has emerged from the peaks of the Andean Mountains and the lush tropical lowlands of Bolivia.

Bolivia was not *supposed* to qualify for the World Cup in 1994. To earn the right to travel to the United States, the Bolivian team would need to post a first or second place finish in South America's "Group B", a division recognized as one of the world's most competitive and unforgiving. Group B is home to two soccer Superpowers -- Brazil and Uruguay, who, between them, have won 5 World Cup championships and were clear favorites to finish first and second in the World Cup qualifying round. Against foes like this, and a resurgent Ecuador, most people gave the Bolivian team no chance of advancing.

But that was in July, 1993, before the first ball of the *Eliminatorias*, Group B's 8 game, round-robin World Cup qualifying series, was kicked or its first goal scored.

- **Game 1: Bolivia v. Venezuela:** The Bolivian team's remarkable quest began on the road on July 18 when it faced the Venezuelans. No one is quite sure if the Venezuelans knew what hit them. When the dust cleared, the scoreboard stood as a testament to Bolivia's offensive prowess; Bolivia 7, Venezuela 1. Two Bolivians (Ramallo and Sanchez) completed hat-tricks. This was the lightning-quick start the Bolivians needed for up next was one of the world's most powerful soccer dynasties; Brazil.

- **Game 2: Bolivia v. Brazil:** Exactly one week later, the Bolivian team returned to La Paz to face Brazil; the only team ever to qualify for every World Cup ever held. With eyes trained on America, Bolivia took to the field in front of 45,000 screaming fans. After battling to a scoreless tie through 88 minutes of play, Bolivia's star, "El Diablo" Etcheverry, broke the deadlock. Just before the final gun sounded, he was followed into the scoring column by his teammate, Alvaro Pena, thus completing a thrilling last minute upset. Bolivia had done the impossible; it had toppled the Superpower, 2-0, handing Brazil its first loss ever in World Cup qualifying action.

- **Games 3-5.** Now on a roll, three more victories followed in quick succession: a 3-1 victory over the other soccer Superpower, Uruguay; a 1-0 win over a strong Ecuadorian team on August 15; and a 7-0 rout of the Venezuelans in which Bolivia placed five players in the scoring column.

- **Games 6-7.** But Superpowers do not give up easily. Bolivian's unbeaten streak was finally snapped by Brazil on August 29. Bolivia traveled to Recife, Brazil, leading Group "B", and was shut out 0-6. On the heels of this defeat came a 1-2 loss to Uruguay in which the difference was a controversial goal resulting from a penalty kick.

● *Game 8.* With one game left, Bolivia was 5-2. It was time for Bolivia to regroup and take hold of their World Cup destiny. They did just that by playing Ecuador to a 1-1 tie which assured Bolivia a place among the hallowed World Cup finalists. William Ramallo provided the tying goal which sent the Bolivians to the United States and also clinched his title as the leading goal scorer (8) of all of Group B.

## **Bolivia's Soccer History**

Although the most exciting chapter of Bolivia's soccer history may be written this Summer, soccer in Bolivia did not begin the day the national team took the field for the World Cup qualifying round in July 1993. Soccer has much deeper roots in Bolivia where it is nothing less than a national passion.

Soccer reached Bolivia by way of the railroad in 1898. The first Bolivian club was called "Oruro Royal" after the then railroad center of the nation. It wasn't long before other territories formed their own clubs. In 1914, La Paz became the first city to organize a soccer association. This too, spread quickly to other cities. By September 1925, the growth of soccer clubs were so great that the Bolivian Soccer Federation (FBF) was founded. The very next year, the FBF joined the South American Soccer Federation (CSF) which joined the International Soccer Federation (FIFA) thereby placing Bolivia squarely on the world's soccer map.

Some of the teams founded in the early days have gone by the wayside, but many continue their proud tradition dating back to the early 1900's. "The Strongest," founded in 1908, is one such club which is regarded as a national treasure and has won many Bolivian National championships. Other clubs of note which are playing today include Bolivar (1925), Wilsterman (1947), Oriente Petrolero (1955), Blooming (1946), and San Jose (1942). Each of these clubs have won the national championship and participated in the "Copa Libertadores de America."

A sport, however, without heroes is not much of a sport. Bolivian soccer has had more than its share of heroes; right up to the present day. In the late 1920's and 1930's, Mario Alborta was a remarkable wing who competed in the first World Cup. In the 1940's and 1950's, the greatest Bolivian player was midfielder Victor Augustin Ugarte. In the 1960's and 1970's the Bolivian team was anchored by the likes of Wilfredo Camacho, who symbolized Bolivia's clutch performances on the way to victory in 1963 in the America's Cup. Now, young Bolivians idolize both Marco Antonio Etcheverry, "El Diablo," who was a hero in the World Cup qualifying round this past year, and William Ramallo, who was the leading goal scorer for Bolivia and all of South America's Group B.

From the beginning, Bolivian soccer has grown and flourished, though sometimes in the shadows of its Brazilian and Uruguayan neighbors. Bolivia has successfully adapted parts of each style and melded them to form its own unique style of soccer.

This soccer style has served the Bolivian's well over the years by helping bring several international championships home. Included in these championships are the 1957, 1979, and 1993 "Paz del Chaco" Cup victories, the 1963 South American "America's Cup" championship, and this year's qualification for the World Cup Finals.

Bolivia is an up and coming force in the soccer world. Qualifying for the World Cup Finals will generate the kind of internal interest in soccer which often translates into stronger

teams in the future. What bodes even better for the future of Bolivian soccer is the success the Bolivian Junior National Team has enjoyed. Just recently, this team won the "Sub-16" South American championship which should mean an even brighter future for Bolivian soccer. Couple this with the National Team's appearance at the World Cup and you have a recipe for great soccer for years to come.

## **Coach Xabier Azkargorta: “No Excuses”**

Born on September 26, 1953 in Azpeitia, a small village in Spain’s Basque country, Francisco Xabier Azkargorta Uriarte began a journey that would lead him from Spain to Bolivia and, finally, to the World Cup in America.

Azkargorta started playing soccer competitively at the age of 15 with the Spanish team Real Sociedad, and later played for Bilbao Atletico, which represents the Basque capital. Always pushing his personal limits, Azkargorta studied medicine while playing professionally and received his medical degree in 1985 from Bilbao University. An unfortunate knee injury ended his playing career in ??????. But realizing he had more to give to the game, he turned his boundless energy to coaching.

Azkargorta's coaching career began in Spain’s Division 2. At age 29, his appointment as head coach to Espanol de Barcelona, a Division 1 team, gave Azkargorta the honor of being the youngest Division 1 coach in the history of Spanish soccer. He went on to coach other Division 1 teams such as Valladolid, Sevilla, and Tenerife.

Meanwhile, in September 1992, the Bolivian National Team was facing a severe dilemma. It was blessed with talented players but the team was playing far below its potential. With the World Cup qualifying rounds less than one year away, Guido Loayza, President of the Bolivian Soccer Federation, made a controversial decision to hire the foreign-born Azkargorta to coach the national team. Azkargorta's mission was clear: qualify Bolivia for the 1994 World Cup.

Perhaps Azkargorta’s worst moment in Bolivia was the team’s 1-3 loss to Chile soon after he became coach. New to the post, and a foreigner as well, Azkargorta became the focal point of a media maelstrom. But “el Bigoton”, as he is known for his big mustache, persevered. Bolivia’s exciting performance in the South American Cup ????? days/months later caught the attention of the nation and soccer fans all over South America. A new winning attitude and level of confidence had taken hold of the Bolivian team. Azkargorta’s invisible hand was working its magic in perfect time for the World Cup qualifying round.

Bolivia entered the qualifying round in June 1993 like a team possessed.

Azkargorta's team won its first five consecutive games, including major upsets over division Superpowers Brazil and Uruguay, both heavily favored to qualify from South America's Group B. Without a doubt, the victory against Brazil (2-0) was Bolivian soccer's greatest moment in recent history. Until that game, Brazil had never lost a game in World Cup qualifying action.

Following this five-game winning streak, Bolivia lost two in-a-row, both away games, to Brazil and Uruguay. As a result, Bolivia's World Cup dreams would be made or broken by a single match -- the final qualifying game against Ecuador. When the smoke had cleared, Bolivia had done what most people thought was impossible; by tying Ecuador 1-1, it stood with Brazil as one of the two qualifying teams from South America's Group B for the 1994 World Cup Finals.

Guido Loayza's gamble had paid off.

Coach Azkargorta has ushered in a new era in Bolivian soccer. He has imparted a new philosophy based on hard work and self-respect to the team and the nation as well. His leadership has helped elevate Bolivia to its current status as one of the best soccer teams in the world. Moreover, he has made the dreams of a nation come true.
