BELGIUM'S "EUROPALIA '87" FOCUSES ON AUSTRIA

Every two years Belgium presents "Europalia", a festival dedicated to the cultural patrimony of a particular country. From September 16 to December 16, 1987 the focus is on Austria with a veritable cornucopia of the arts. Some 200 events are scheduled among 50 Belgian towns and cities, with the majority taking place in Brussels. The range of events covers every category of culture from art masterpieces, rarely seen outside Austria, to the music of great orchestras, jazz groups, singers, soloists and chamber ensembles, along with theatre, round-table discussions, readings, exhibitions, silent films of the early Austrian cinema and a typical Viennese cafe for "kaffee mit schlag".

Belgium's major orchestras, the Monnaie, the National, the Liege Philharmonic, the Royal Philharmonic of Flanders, the RTBF and BRT, along with other musical groups and soloists will perform works of Austrian composers, in recognition of its Austrian period from roughly 1715 to 1790. Belgian museums will show coins, the post office will print stamps, and galleries and cultural centers will mount exhibitions with Austrian themes.

Austrian musical highlights include performances by the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra, the Vienna Symphony Orchestra, the Vienna Chamber Orchestra and Salzburg's famous "Mozarteum Orchester".

Jewels and artifacts of "The Order of the Golden Fleece" will dazzle visitors to Brussels' Palais des Beaux-Arts, along with an exhibition of art from the Baroque period to masters of the contemporary period. Antwerp's Museum of Fine Arts will display "Masterpieces from the Albertina" that include works by Altdorfer, Cranach, Raphael, Veronese, Tiepolo, Poussin, Watteau, Fragonard, Holbein, Michaelangelo and Belgium's own Bruegel, Rubens and Van Dyck among other artists featured. The works of Egon Schiele will be exhibited at the Palais des Beaux-Arts in Charleroi, and the Fine Arts Museums of Ghent and Liege will share an exhibition of the works of Kokoschka, considered to be the inspiration of Expressionists everywhere.



**MAREDSOUS MOUNTS EXHIBITION OF AREA ABBEYS**

The Abbey of Maredsous, near Dinant in the Belgian Province of Namur, is well known for its cheese. This year until August 31st, the Monks have organized an exhibition chronicling all the Abbeys of the Sambre and Meuse areas from the 7th to the 20th Century. A 200-page illustrated catalogue documents both the treasures and life of these religious institutions. The exhibition is open weekdays from 10:00 AM to 7:00 PM. Admission is 40 Belgian francs (approximately \$1.00).

**ART AND ANTIQUES FAIR - KNOKKE-HEIST**

The Belgian seaside resort of Knokke-Heist will hold its 12th Art and Antiques Fair from August 8 to 16, 1987 at the Scharpoord Arts Center. In addition to antiques, contemporary art will also be presented. This interaction of past and present treasures will be of particular interest to interior design specialists.

**VISITORS CAN NOW SEE TOURNAI BY BOAT**

In addition to walking tours of this ancient Belgian city, visitors can now discover its charms by boath which takes them through Tournai and on to the town of Antoing along the Escaut River. The boats depart daily, except Monday, from the Pont des Tours, at 11:00 AM, 2:30 PM and 6:15 PM until August 30th. Information can be obtained from the Tournai City Tourist Office at Vieux Marche-aux-Poteries, 14.

**MIDDELHEIM OPEN-AIR SCULPTURE MUSEUM -ANTWERP**

The theme for the 19th Biennial of Sculpture in Antwerp's Middelheim Open-air Sculpture Museum is "The Monument". Along with the exhibition proper 28 young Belgian artists will show "Statues of the Town". The exhibition will run from the present to October 4, 1987.

**BRUSSELS TOY MUSEUM EXHIBITION**



NEWS BRIEFS FROM BELGIUM

ANTWERP BOASTS NEW MUSEUM FOR CONTEMPORARY ART

Antwerp's new Museum for Contemporary Art (Museum van Hedendaagse Kunst) which opened recently is an eight story building whose Art Deco facade fronts a triangular block opening onto the Leuvenstraat, and overlooks the Schelde River. The first two floors are the major exhibition space, the third floor is the film room and the fourth floor has a restaurant, while the fifth and sixth floors are devoted to drawings, video installations and library. The opening exhibition "Inside Outside" presented sculpture by 60 artists from 9 countries.

METALLURGY MUSEUM - FOURNEAU SAINT-MICHEL - WELCOMES VISITORS

At the Fourneau Saint-Michel Metallurgy Museum, near the town of Saint Hubert in the Belgian Ardennes, visitors can see how 18th century workers practiced the art and science of separating metals from their ores and preparing them for use by smelting and refining. The museum is open weekdays from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Saturdays and Sundays from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM and during July and August from 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM daily. It is closed during January and February. Admission is 40 Belgian Francs (approx. \$1.00).

TWO BRUGES MUSEUMS OFFER SUMMER EXHIBITIONS OF TEXTILE DECORATIVE ART

An exhibition "Masterpieces of Bruges Tapestry" is bringing together from the present until October 18, 1987 the finest tapestries of the 16th and 17th centuries. This big exhibition which is being held in the historic rooms of two Bruges' museums -- the Gruuthuse and the Memling (old St. John's Hospital) unites for the first time more than 70 Bruges tapestries from all over Europe and the United States. In the context of the renowned Flemish art of tapestry, Bruges has certainly played an important role. The publication of a remarkable catalogue shows this fascinating subject in a new light. The museums are open daily from 9:30 AM to 6:00 PM; and from August 17, every Tuesday, Thursday and Friday evening from 7:30 PM to 10:30 PM. Admission: 150 Belgian Francs (approximately \$4.00).

**UNIQUE BATTLE OF THE BULGE REENACTMENT GROUP  
TO VISIT BELGIUM OCT. 24-31, 1987**

The 44th Infantry Division Historical and Reenactment Society will visit the Battle of the Bulge areas of Belgium in a tour operated by Tours of Historic and Important Places from October 24 to 31, 1987.

Ray Pfeiffer, the tour director, says that on prior tours they have had monuments dedicated in Bastogne and Chaumont, but this will be a "first" for reenactors. The Society, a 350 member organization, dedicated to studying and reenacting the historical importance the infantryman played in WWII, will meet with similar groups in Belgium, and visit the famous battle sites of 1944-45. The Society is open for membership and reenacts WWII battles twice a year in the U.S.

According to Pfeiffer, "The people of Belgium have never forgotten their liberators of World War II and they always greet Americans warmly." Belgium's top expert on the Battle of the Bulge, Major Emile Engels, will meet with the group and share his knowledge of the battle.

This fully-escorted tour includes round-trip air from New York, six nights first class accommodations, and two meals a day, as well as all admissions for \$995.00 per person.

**"LA CHANTERELLE" CHOIR OF BASTOGNE, BELGIUM  
TO PERFORM IN THE UNITED STATES DURING AUGUST, 1987**

Bastogne, a town forever etched in the minds, hearts and history of the United States and its people for the World War II heroism of its American and Belgian defenders, will send its famed "La Chanterelle" choir on a tour of the United States during August, 1987.

The choir, numbering approximately 70 members, ranging in age from 7 to 77 years, is under the direction of its resident choirmaster, Mr. Firmin Decerf, an organist and Professor of Music at the Higher Institute in Namur. In addition to the choir recitals, Professor Decerf will perform organ concerts in New Jersey and Washington, D.C. The program will include Renaissance songs, popular songs and a variety of songs of different eras and pertinence from liturgical to folk to spirituals. Miss Christiane Thiry is the accompanist and Mrs. Gisele Lutgen is the entrepreneur responsible for the visit of "La Chanterelle".

The performance schedule is as follows: August 2, Kinneelon, N.J., Our Lady Magnificat Church, Miller Road, choir at 12:00 Noon and Organ Recital at 8:00 PM at the Smokerise Community Church; August 4, Washington, D.C., Annunciation Church, 3810 Massachusetts Ave., Choir at 8:00 PM; August 5, Washington, D.C., National Presbyterian Church, Nebraska Ave. and Van Street, Organ Recital at 8:00 PM; August 7, Buffalo, N.Y. private concert for the 101st Airborne Division; August 9 Orlando, Florida Holy Family Catholic Church, Atopka Vineland Road, Choir at 11:00 AM. Another concert will also be performed in Orlando on August 11th at a time and place to be subsequently announced.

"La Chanterelle" choir originated at Notre-Dame College in Bastogne and has been associated with all the commemorative services on Memorial Day at the Mardasson Monument to the memory of the Battle of the Bulge where they perform various American songs and the U.S. National Anthem. On Christmas Eve 1984, "La Chanterelle" attracted international attention via live television coverage of their choral renditions at the 40th Anniversary of the Battle of the Bulge commemorative Midnight Mass.

The visit of "La Chanterelle" will probably be of particular interest to U.S. Veterans of the Battle of the Bulge living in the areas of the performance schedule.
