## SPLENDOR OF THE SASSANIDES DYNASTY ON EXHIBITION AT BRUSSELS ROYAL MUSEUM OF ART AND HISTORY

Brussels Royal Museum of Art and History continues its tradition of exhibitions of high artistic value with its presentation of "The Splendor of the Sassanides" from February 12 until April 25, 1993.

The Sassanides ruled over a large part of the Near and Middle East from 224 to 642 AD and were the last powerful dynasty preceeding the coming of Islam. The four centuries of their reign coincided with that of their powerful neighbors; Rome, Byzantium, China and Central Asia. Their well established administration formed the base for an aristocratic society and served as a model to the rulers of Baghdad after the expansion of Islam.

Reflecting their brilliant civilization, the Sassanides art works mainly represent the glorification of their royal rulers. Of particular interest are finely decorated silver vases and dishes, showing dance presentations, figures from mythology and scenes from royal hunting parties. However, it's their incomparable silks for which they are renowned even to the present day. Silk was used to protect relics and so made their way to convents and churches in Europe. The oriental motifs on the silk later influenced roman sculptors who reproduced them unmindful of their real significance.

## ART NOUVEAU IN THE STREETS OF BRUSSELS JUNE 22 - SEPTEMBER 12, 1993

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The Foundation for Architecture, with the collaboration of the Brussels Region, is organizing an exposition on Art Nouveau in the streets of Brussels to run from June 22 to September 12, 1993. 1993 represents a celebration of the 100th anniversary year of Art Nouveau.

**LIEGE CELEBRATES THE 90TH BIRTHDAY OF GEORGES SIMENON**  
**WITH AN EXHIBITION ON THE MAN AND HIS WRITINGS**

Georges Simenon, creator of Inspector Maigret, the hero of 76 of his novels written between 1929 and 1972 was born in Liege at 26, rue Leopold on February 13, 1903.

500 million readers world-wide from all walks of life enjoyed Simenon's books. His works have been translated in 87 languages and edited in hundreds of thousands of publications. There have been 55 movies made of his books and hundreds of TV shows. To commemorate his prodigious literary output; 1500 articles, 1000 short stories, 200 novels, 79 crime novels in the Maigret series and 212 other novels, some 40 of which are undeniably major contributions to world literature, Liege has planned an exhibition on the man and his work to be held between June 26 and October 30, 1993.

The main subject of the exhibition will cover Simenon as 'the man, the writer, the journalist and the traveler' but will also focus on his 'Inspector Maigret'. The exhibition will include conferences, films, theatre productions, a contest to write a novel inspired by the writings of Simenon, a celebration at Outremeuse, a fair and flea market where Simenon collectibles can be purchased or exchanged. The exhibition will be a chronological guide through the life of Simenon and will include previously unpublished material, formerly exhibited documents and reconstructed scenes from his novels.

During the four months of the exhibition, Liege will be decorated and transformed into Simenonville. An Information Center, a Book Fair, live TV and Radio Shows from the site of the exhibition, and a superb catalogue produced by the ten best known specialists on the works of Georges Simenon will be available.

Between 1945 and 1955 Georges Simenon and his family lived in New York. He then lived in France from 1955 to 1957 and subsequently settled in Lausanne, Switzerland, where he died at age 86 on September 4, 1989.

The exhibition will take place at the Musee d'Art Walloon at 86, rue Feronstree in Liege, the true home of Simenon and Maigret.

## ANTWERP, EUROPE'S CULTURAL CAPITAL FOR 1993

Highlights of the Cultural Calendar are :

"EUROSAIL '93" : The 'Cutty Sark' Tall Ships will sail up the River Scheldt on August 14 and stay in the Antwerp harbour thru August 17 where they can be visited free of charge.

"ANTWERP, STORY OF A METROPOLIS" is an exhibition of the paintings, sculptures, prints, books and jewellery of the 15th, 16th and 17th centuries. The objects actually tell the story. The exhibition will be held at the Hessenhuis from June 25 to October 10.

"15TH AND 16TH CENTURY ANTWERP RETABLES" will be on display in the Cathedral of Our Lady from May 26 to October 3. Retables, wooden altarpieces with a carved center piece and two hinged and painted side panels, were an important Antwerp artifact.

"THE ARK" is a 77-meter barge that houses a 200-seat theatre and a cafe-restaurant. From May 20 to October 3 the Ark will lie at anchor in various places in Antwerp as a backdrop for a program which will showcase the artistic talents of young people from 14 world cities.

"THE PANORAMIC DREAM" covers Antwerp's second economic heyday during the second half of the 19th century World Fairs of 1885, 1894 and 1930. The exhibition from June 12 to August 31 is at the Bouwcentrum.

## ANTWERP - CULTURAL CAPITAL OF EUROPE FOR 1993

In keeping with the tradition that was initiated in 1985, the European Ministers of Culture chose Antwerp to be designated the Cultural Capital of Europe for 1993. In the 16th century Antwerp was already one of the major cities north of the Alps and as a center of cultural, artistic and scientific interaction provided a fundamental contribution to the development of European culture.

1993 provides a unique occasion for Antwerp to showcase it's energy and Belgian culture to the world. The Program of Events, which focuses on art in all its manifestations; i.e, visual arts, performing arts, applied arts, literature, music, architecture and historic restoration, will run from March to December.

Since 1993 will mark the 400th anniversary of Jordaens' birth in Antwerp, the focus on this work of the pupil of Rubens is especially appropriate. On March 27, the Royal Museum of Fine Arts will open the Jacob Jordaens exhibition that will include 90 paintings, 70 drawings, some 30 prints and a unique set of tapestries that will be on loan from the Art-Historical Museum of Vienna. The closing date is June 27.

From May 15 to June 27, under the title "Rubens Cantoor, 80 drawings mostly the work of Willem Panneels, a student of Rubens, on loan from some 500 such drawings in the Printroom in Copenhagen will be on exhibition in Rubens House, thus returning the 'Cantoor' drawings to their place of origin. This exhibition, in addition to providing a comparison to the master, whose work is spread among the world's major collections, gives an insight as to how the atelier functioned and to the importance of the drawing in the process of creation.

Antwerp is also an important seaport and an impressive fleet of historic sailing ships from all over the world will moor in the heart of the city between August 14 and 17. A large folk festival will welcome the international crews during their stay.

From April through August, the Antwerp Zoo, one of the oldest zoos in the world will celebrate its 150th anniversary with concerts, exhibitions, congresses and other events.

On the historical front from June 24 to October 10 at Hessenhuis, "Antwerp, the History of a Metropolis" will depict the pomp of the city's golden age and how things have evolved.

"The Diamond Jewel in the 17th Century" is an exhibition that will pay homage to the glorious history of Antwerp as a Diamond Center from April 23 to September 26 at the Provincial Diamond Museum.

The Middelheim Park, an open-air museum for modern sculpture, will display 15 new sculptures by famous international artists from June through December.

The summer months will resound with music; Organ recitals by renowned organists playing old and modern repertoires will ring out every Friday in July from the Cathedral of Our Lady; Polyphonic music by top class ensembles will offer medieval and renaissance pieces at Saint Augustine church during May, June and July; and during July and August chamber music recitals by young talent at private residences will be open to the public.

From May through September "The Ark" a floating theatre on the River Scheldt, will showcase young artists from 15 countries in presentations of theatrical, musical and visual arts productions. And from April 19 to May 2, the Frankfurt Ballet, one of the most renowned European ballet companies will perform at The City Theatre.

Many other exciting exhibitions in Applied Arts, Film, Photography and Media Art, as well as contemporary work by Silversmiths and an exposition of World Expos around the turn of the century will offer the visitor a cornucopia of cultural delights.

The city itself is a contemporary metropolis that hums around the clock. It has spectacular restaurants, cosy indoor and outdoor cafes, luxury shops and charming parks and gardens.

Adding to its wide range of accommodations are two new hotels. Christian V or the "Floatel", is anchored at Bonapartedok, Sint Laureiskaai. This 3-star hotel, retains the '50s style in its 59 rooms. Behind its charming facade, the hotel is built around a spacious inner courtyard and is crowned by a monumental dome. 
