

Privacy Act Statement. 

Registrant will attempt to differentiate the democratically elected Islamic government of Afghanistan from the Pakistani backed Taliban militias by means of direct visits to House and Senate foreign relations, congressional staffers, all government agencies connected with foreign policies and other interested parties, with the express purpose of changing American foreign policy in the region to garner support for the foreign principal.

EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 26th day of February, 2001, by and between OTILIE M. ENGLISH, ("Contractor") and the ISLAMIC STATE OF AFGHANISTAN, ("Employer"), together the "Parties."

WHEREAS, Contractor and Employer desire to enter into an arrangement by which Contractor is to perform certain services for Employer, as an independent contractor,

NOW THEREFORE, for good and adequate consideration, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Contractor shall serve as the Government Relations Representative in the United States of America for the Employer, effective February 15, 2001. Contractor shall report to Dr. A. Abdullah, Eng. Mohammad Es Haq, and Gen. Payenda Mohammad in Washington, DC, and shall work with Employer's United Nations office in New York, NY, and Employer's representatives in Afghanistan.
2. Contractor shall represent the Employer in the U.S. Congress and in that capacity shall represent the interests of the Employer in such manner as the Contractor deems appropriate, and shall monitor U.S. foreign policy regarding Afghanistan, and report the same back to the Employer.
3. Contractor shall be responsible for production and dissemination of information about events and conditions in Afghanistan to U.S. media representatives, and shall be responsible for monitoring media coverage of events and conditions in Afghanistan, and reporting the same back to the Employer.
4. Contractor shall assist government officials of the Islamic State of Afghanistan on an as-needed basis as directed by the Employer.
5. Contractor shall provide bi-weekly reports of Contractor's activities and efforts on Employer's behalf to Eng. Mohammad Es Haq and Dr. A. Abdullah, in such manner and form as is agreeable to both parties.
6. Contractor shall be compensated by Employer Sixty Thousand U.S. Dollars (\$60,000.00) per year in quarterly installments.
7. Employer shall pay Contractor's health insurance premiums directly to Contractor's health insurance provider, in such manner as Contractor shall direct, until termination of


this agreement. Such payments shall not reduce Contractor's compensation.

8. Employer shall pay or reimburse all of Contractor's expenses incurred in connection with fulfillment of Contractor's obligations and duties pursuant to this agreement, including but not limited to travel expenses, legal fees, promotional materials and recording media. Such payments shall not reduce Contractor's compensation.
9. Employer shall pay for or reimburse Contractor for reasonable costs of equipment purchased in connection with fulfillment of Contractor's obligations and duties pursuant to this agreement. Any equipment so purchased by Employer shall remain the Employer's property upon the expiration of this agreement.
10. Contractor shall provide and maintain her own office space and equipment, including but not limited to computer equipment, furnishings, fixtures, and media access services in such manner as Contractor deems appropriate, and at no additional cost to Employer.
11. This agreement shall have a term of two years, after which time it may be renegotiated or renewed by the Parties. Notwithstanding the foregoing, either Party may terminate this agreement by delivering written notice to the other Party ninety days prior to the effective date of such termination.
12. Contractor agrees that she will not work for any foreign government or agency during or for one year following the term of this agreement.
