ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE
FOREIGN AGENTS REGISTRATION ACT OF 1938, AS AMENDED,

TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

I have the honor to report on the administration of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, pursuant to Section 1(c) of that Act which requires the Attorney General from time to time to report to the Congress concerning the administration of the Act, as well as the nature, sources, and content of political propaganda disseminated or distributed by agents of foreign principals registered under the terms of the Act.

This report relates to the administration and enforcement of the Foreign Agents Registration Act for the calendar year 1953. Since the disclosure of information required by the Act is made on a continuing basis and involves the receipt of supplemental statements from all persons whose registrations are in active status, this report necessarily supplements the reports previously submitted to the Congress for the year

1952, as well as for the preceding years, consisting of reports covering the years 1942 through 1944, 1945 through 1949, and for the years 1950 and 1951.

SUMMARY

During calendar year 1953, fifty-eight regular registration statements were filed by agents of foreign principals as defined by subsections 1 through 4 of Section 1(c) of the Act. This compares with 49 statements filed in 1952. An alphabetical list of the registrants whose statements were filed in 1953 is contained herein in Appendix II.

Sixteen statements were received in 1953 from individuals whose agency status was created by Section 1(c)(5) of the Act (Section 20(a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950). In 1952, thirty-one such registrations were received. An alphabetical list of these registrations received during 1953 is contained in Appendix VII.

During 1953, two hundred and thirty-one individuals filed so-called Exhibits A, which are short form registration statements designed for officers, directors, employees, and other persons rendering assistance to a registrant in the interest of a foreign principal. An alphabetical list of individuals who have filed Exhibits A during 1953 is contained in Appendix IV.

Forty registration statements were terminated during 1953, as listed in Appendix VI. At the close of the calendar year there were 252 active registration statements in the Department's files as compared with 234 as of December 31, 1952.

Since the administration of the Foreign Agents Registration Act was transferred to the Department of Justice in June 1942, a total of 808 regular registration statements have been filed. In addition, 64 persons have registered as a result of the agency status created by Section 20(a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950, consisting of those persons who have admitted knowledge of or the receipt of instruction or assignment in the espionage, counterespionage, or sabotage service or tactics of a government of a foreign country or of a foreign political party.

The Act is administered through the Foreign Agents Registration Section established within the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice. In the administration of the Act, this Section relies primarily on the investigative reports of the Federal Bureau of Investigation for information regarding the activities of persons who may fall within the purview of the Act. In addition, it receives information and inquiries from individuals and organizations and maintains a public file of the registration statements and supplemental statements required by the Act. Each registration statement and the supplements thereto are examined for their adequacy and legal sufficiency and each item of propaganda received is checked for compliance with the filing and labeling provisions of the Act. During 1953, only one registrant was found grossly delinquent in the filing of the required supplemental statement and this matter has been referred to the appropriate United States Attorney for necessary action.

A functional analysis of the registration statements filed during 1953 reveals that the greatest number was filed in connection with propa-

ganda activity in one form or another. Thus, eight statements were filed by public relations counselors, eight by representatives of foreign political movements or parties, six by advertising or publicity agents, six by information service employees, and five by persons rendering editorial or writing services. In the non-propaganda field, thirteen statements were filed by attorneys in comparison with ten statements in this category filed in 1952, while six were filed by commercial or financial agents. A functional analysis of all statements received in 1953 is contained in Appendix III.

Of the 58 registrations received during 1953, eight were in the Cuban nationality field. This is a result of the exiling by the Batista Government of a number of former officials of the government headed by Dr. Carlos Prío Socarras, who were requested by the Department to register in connection with their activities to restore in Cuba what the registrants described as a constitutional form of government.

Because of the continued interest of members of Congress and the public in the amounts of money received by registered agents, this report contains in Appendix IX the amounts received by American registered agents from their foreign principals during the year 1953. The 1952 report contained this information with respect to the preceding five-year period.

In addition to the appendices already mentioned, this report contains in Appendix V a table of all registrants whose statements were in an active status as of December 31, 1953, listed according to geographical area or nationality field, while Appendix VIII contains a list of government tourist and information offices, together with the number of employees and amounts of money expended for propaganda purposes within the United States.

NATURE AND CONTENT OF PROPAGANDA

Four agencies responsible for the distribution of political propaganda from the Soviet Union and other Iron Curtain countries are registered with this Department under the terms of the Act. These are: Four Continent Book Corporation; Imported Publications and Products; Artkino Pictures, Inc.; and Edwin S. Smith, doing business as Eastfoto, Sovfoto and Am-Rus Literary and Music Agency..

Four Continent and Imported Publications and Products concern themselves primarily with the sale of printed material, although Four Continent does offer for sale recordings imported from Iron Curtain countries.

A typical shipment of printed or published material from the Soviet Union and satellite countries to these two agencies would contain, in any one month, copies of the following items:

1. The newspaper "Isvestia," daily newspaper of the Soviets of Labor Deputies of the USSR.
2. The newspaper "Pravda," the daily organ of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union.
3. The newspaper "Literary Gazette," which is the daily organ of the Administration of the Association of Soviet Authors of the USSR.
4. "New Times," a magazine published weekly by "Trud" in Russian, English, French, German, Spanish, Polish, Czech, Rumanian and Swedish, which generally contains summaries of the principal speeches made by the main Soviet dignitaries and articles by writers of the Soviet Union and

its satellites on particular subjects of current interest.

5. The magazine "Soviet Literature," published monthly in English, French, German, Polish and Spanish, which contains articles on the literature and arts of the Soviet Union and of other countries.
6. A lavishly illustrated magazine entitled "Soviet Union", published in Russian, Chinese, Korean, English, French, German and Spanish, which contains pictures and articles about various aspects of life in the Soviet Union or its satellite countries. A similar magazine entitled "Hungary" is published in Budapest and is confined to events occurring in that country.
7. The magazine "Soviet Woman," published bimonthly in Russian, English, Chinese, French, German and Spanish, devoted to illustrations and articles relating to social and economic problems of women and children. It is published by the Soviet Women's Anti-fascist Committee and the Central Council of Trade Unions of the USSR.
8. The Russian language magazine "Crocodile," published by Pravda, which purports to be a satirical publication containing cartoons and articles generally lampooning the Western way of life.
9. "Ogonek" (Little Flame), a magazine depicting various phases of life in the Soviet Union with particular

emphasis on the industrial worker. Published by Pravda, it describes itself as a weekly social, political and literary journal.

10. A Russian language magazine entitled "Military Information" which describes itself as the monthly journal of the All Union Volunteer Society of Army, Aviation and Navy. Its motto is "Protection of the Fatherland is the Sacred Duty of Every Citizen of the USSR."
11. A magazine entitled "Change" which describes itself as the literary social political journal of the Central Committee of the Komsomol, the Communist youth movement.
12. A magazine in the Russian language entitled "Planned Economy" which describes itself as the political economic journal of the State Plan of the USSR.
13. A magazine entitled "Question of Philosophy," published by the USSR Institute of Philosophy.
14. A monthly magazine published by Pravda entitled "Banner," which describes itself as the literary, social political organ of the Union of Soviet Authors of the USSR.
15. A magazine entitled "Novy Mir" (New World for Peace), published by Izvestia, which describes itself as the literary, social political journal and organ of the Soviet Authors of the USSR.

16. A similar magazine published by Pravda.
17. A magazine entitled "Star," which also calls itself a monthly literary artistic and social political journal organ of the Union of Soviet Authors of the USSR.
18. A monthly journal of the Slavic Committee of the USSR.
19. A magazine entitled "Kommunist," which describes itself as the theoretical and political journal of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union.
20. Books by various authors published by Foreign Language Publishing House, in Moscow, with such titles as "Marx and Engels -- Organizers of the Union of Communists"; "Selected Works of Mao Tse Tung", translated from the Chinese; "Constitution and Fundamental Legislative Acts of the Bulgarian People's Republic", translated from the Bulgarian; "Plans for Progress of People's Economy in Countries with People's Democracies" and "Thirty Years of Chinese Communist Party" translated from the Chinese.
21. Various other hard and soft-cover books, pamphlets, and other publications emphasizing particular aspects of Soviet life, philosophy, science, agriculture, mathematics and medicine.
22. The magazine "People's China," published fortnightly by the Foreign Language Press, Peking, China. This magazine states that it "chronicles the life of the

Chinese people and reports their progress in building a new Democratic Society, describes the new trends in Chinese art, literature, science, education, and other aspects of the people's cultural life and seeks to strengthen the friendships between the people of China and those of other lands in the cause of peace".

Each issue of "People's China" contains some supplement on a specialized topic. For example, the issue for December 1, 1953, contained a special supplement entitled "The Depositions of 19 Captured U.S. Airmen on Germ Warfare Against Korea." The charge of germ warfare in Korea was a topic in practically all propaganda material emanating from Communist China in 1953, and was echoed by the Communist press in the United States.

23. A bimonthly magazine entitled "China Reconstructs"; a monthly magazine entitled "Chinese Pictorial"; a bimonthly magazine entitled "Chinese Medical Journal"; and a publication entitled "People's Daily", printed in the Chinese language.

There are, in addition, publications of a similar nature received from other Iron Curtain countries, particularly Czechoslovakia and Poland, but not in the same volume as those emanating from the Soviet Union.

During 1953, Artkino Pictures, Inc., declared that it released for distribution within the United States 14 feature films and 20 short subjects and newsreels.

Prominent among the short subjects is one entitled "USSR TODAY." It is indicated that at least 34 different items with this title have been produced and released as of January 16, 1954. The short subjects also include animated cartoons, pictures relating to sporting events, native dances and notable achievements in Soviet industry. The titles of several of the feature films give some conception as to the content, such as "Life in the Arctic", "Battle for China", "A Cossack Beyond the Danube", "Sadko", "Concert of Stars", "Young Chopin", and "The Country Doctor". Films containing political propaganda are required to be labeled in accordance with the provisions of Section 4(b) of the Act before distribution.

Edwin S. Smith offers for sale to magazines, newspapers and photo agencies photographs which he obtains from his foreign principals. A number of these depict phases of the war in Indo-China from the Viet-Minh point of view. He also represents various Soviet authors and composers.

The bulk of this material shipped from the Soviet Union and other Iron Curtain countries is, of course, designed to influence the reader favorably toward those countries within the Soviet orbit, their peoples, leaders, governments, and way of life. Conversely, it seeks to raise opposition to those countries or governments which oppose the Soviet Union or its satellites.

The pattern of propaganda transmitted by countries outside the Soviet bloc has not varied from that reported previously to the Congress. In general, such propaganda appears to be designed to create good will between the peoples of the United States and those of the country disseminating the propaganda. Most of this material is disseminated through

official government information and tourist offices. Forty-three such offices are registered with this Department under the terms of the Act. This material takes the form of press releases, booklets, pamphlets, travel folders, maps and trade journals, and is devoted to political, economic, and cultural subjects.

Special events, of course, bring forth specialized pertinent material. In 1953, British Information Services devoted a considerable portion of its propaganda material to the Coronation and the Empire tour of the Queen. The Government of India Information Service in its bulletins "India News" and "Indiagrams" stressed that Government's position on the Korean post-armistice political conference, the prisoner exchange question, problems relating to the joint India-Pakistan defense, and developments within India regarding agriculture and industry. The Israel Office of Information in its weekly summary of news from Israel sets forth the Government's stand on the Arab states and its position regarding Jerusalem as Israel's capital. The Information Office of the Republic of Indonesia disseminated information regarding the exchange of ambassadors and the preparations in connection with the first national elections to elect a constituent assembly within Indonesia, as well as material relating to economic conditions within that country. The Union of South Africa Government Information Office disseminated information on such matters as local elections and racial problems within that country. Material distributed by the Yugoslav Information Center concentrated to some extent on the Trieste problem and devoted some attention to conditions within Yugoslavia and relations with the Soviet Union in the five-year period after the Yugoslav-Cominform split.

Much of the South Korean propaganda activity is conducted in this country by the Korean Pacific Press, which publishes and distributes a monthly magazine entitled "Korean Survey", as well as such pamphlets as "Fifty Facts on Korea", "Korea Today" and "Korean Report". Material on France is distributed by the agent of Comite France Actuelle of Paris, whose American agent of the same name distributes the publication "France Actuelle". This magazine comments on the current political and economic matters in which France has an interest, such as items on Indo-China, French industrial strife, and financial aid to underdeveloped French West Africa and the proposed plan to give European status to the Saar area.

Information regarding the West German Government was disseminated by the public relations firm of The Roy Bernard Company, Inc., while the public relations firm of Win Nathanson Associates, Inc., disseminated material with respect to the present controversy regarding ownership of Bolivian tin mines. The public relations firm of Chester and Erbe has disseminated information with respect to the present Government of Cuba.

Certain nationalist and underground groups continued their propaganda activities during the calendar year 1953. For example, the Slovak Liberation Committee in the United States and the Slovak National Council Abroad, U. S. Branch, protested Soviet domination of Czechoslovakia through statements to the American press, by letters to editors, and memoranda to United States Government officials. The New York Section of the Partido Revolucionario Dominicano (Dominican Revolutionary Party) issued considerable material in protest against the present regime of General Trujillo. The viewpoint of the nationalist groups of North Africa was expressed through bulletins and statements issued by the Committee for Freedom of

North Africa, the Tunisian Office for National Liberation and the Moroccan Office of Information and Documentation. The Polish Freedom Movement continued its propaganda activity in protest against the present Government of Poland.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE
FOREIGN AGENTS REGISTRATION ACT

Our experience in the administration of the Foreign Agents Registration Act has indicated the desirability of certain changes designed to strengthen the Act and improve its administration. By letters of January 26, 1954, to the Vice President and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, I recommended certain amendments to the Act.

I proposed, in the first place, that Section 1(b) of the Act be amended by adding thereto a new subsection to include within the term "foreign principal" a domestic organization which is substantially financed, controlled, or directed, by a foreign government or foreign political party. This would bring within the purview of the disclosure provisions of the statute agents of such domestic organizations. At present, such agents are not subject to the Act unless it can be established that the domestic organization is subsidized by a foreign government or foreign political party, even though it is evident that the domestic organization is controlled, supervised, or directed by a foreign government or foreign political party.

I have proposed that Section 3(d) which contains the so-called commercial exemption be clarified. This Section is designed to exempt from the registration provisions an agency of the ordinary private commercial character whose activities are in furtherance of the bona fide

trade and commerce of a foreign principal. When Section 3(d) was first enacted, there did not exist to the same degree the control of business enterprises by governments such as exists today, nor was the operation of such business enterprises utilized by foreign governments to the same extent as instruments of national policy as is now the case. I believe it was the intention to include within the 3(d) exemption provisions only those commercial and financial agents who act within the United States on behalf of private interests and not those who further the political or public interests of a foreign government or foreign political party through commercial or financial activity. Accordingly, I have recommended certain clarifying changes in Section 3(d) to assist the Department in its administration of the Act by defining more exactly the nature of the activity which will entitle an agent of a foreign principal to the commercial exemption.

Included among the other recommendations is one to amend Sections 4(a) and 4(b) so as to require all political propaganda disseminated through the United States mails or other instrumentality of interstate commerce to be filed and labeled without regard to whether such propaganda is intended to be disseminated among two or more persons. The present wording of these Sections has been construed in the past to mean that the filing and labeling of political propaganda is required only when an agent disseminates political propaganda which he believes will be, or which he intends to be, disseminated or circulated among two or more persons. While we do not so interpret the Act at present, I believe it important that the intention of the Congress be made clear that these Sections apply to require the filing and labeling without regard to the question of whether the propaganda

is intended to be disseminated among two or more persons.


Further, I have recommended the inclusion of a new subsection (e) to be added to Section 4 of the Act to embody the present Rule 50 as an integral part of the Foreign Agents Registration Act. Rule 50 was promulgated by the rule-making power of the Attorney General and provides in substance that any person outside the United States who uses the United States mails or other instrumentalities of interstate or foreign commerce to circulate or disseminate political propaganda shall be considered as acting within the United States and subject to the disclosure provisions of the statute. This Rule, which is based upon an Opinion of the Attorney General of December 10, 1940, is being used at the present time by the Post Office Department and by the Bureau of Customs in connection with declaring non-mailable or with seizure of political propaganda when such propaganda is not handled in accordance with the disclosure provisions of the Foreign Agents Registration Act. Because of the present importance of Rule 50 in combating the increased Communist propaganda directed at this country from abroad, I am of the opinion that this Rule should become an integral part of the statute and directly express the intent of the Congress.

Lastly, by communication of April 29, 1954, I have recommended to the Congress that Section 1(c)(5) of the Foreign Agents Registration Act, which was enacted as Section 20(a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950, be repealed as part of the Foreign Agents Registration Act and be made the subject of an independent registration statute. Although 64 registration statements have thus far been received from individuals whose agency status was created by this Section of the Act, this number does not, in my opinion, carry into practice the intention of the Congress in

enacting this statute. It has been our experience in administering this section of the Act that the primary difficulty has been the necessity of establishing an agency status within the framework of the Foreign Agents Registration Act. Legal and practical difficulties in the administration of the Act will, in my opinion, be more effectively overcome through the enactment of this requirement for the registration of persons trained in, or who have received instruction or assignment in, the espionage or sabotage services of a foreign government or foreign political party, as a separate registration statute independent of the Foreign Agents Registration Act.

Again, I earnestly commend to the Congress these recommendations designed to strengthen and clarify the Act.
