

6. The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences awarded the 1996 Nobel Prize in Chemistry to Professors Robert Curl and Richard Smalley of Rice University in Texas, and Sir Harold Kroto of the University of Sussex in Britain. (1:15)
7. The Prize in Economics was endowed by the Swedish Central Bank. This year the award went to William Vickrey of Columbia University, and James Mirrlees at Cambridge. Sadly, 82 year old laureate William Vickrey died of a heart attack three days after learning he'd won the Nobel Prize. (0:32 + (1:41)
8. Francis Sejersted of the Norwegian Parliament's Nobel Committee named the Peace Prize winners: Bishop Carlos Belo and José Ramos-Horta, both working for social justice and human rights in Indonesian-occupied East Timor. (3:06)

The Right Livelihood Awards arose from criticism that the official Nobel Prizes are too detached from the true problems of the planet, such as threats to the environment, human rights, and social justice. As Azariah Kiros reports, this year's winners are from Greece, India, Russia and the United States. (3:04)

Sveriges Television Aktiebolag (the Swedish Television Company) is a non-commercial corporation formed in Sweden to broadcast television programs.

It is financed by annual license fees from owners of radio and television sets in Sweden.

An office was established here in New York City, operating under the assumed name of Swedish Broadcasting Company (a Certificate of Assumed Name was filed on June 14, 1989 with the State of New York/Department of State) to provide production research and assistance to the home office, and to distribute programs about Sweden to radio stations in the United States, free of charge.

The office in New York conducts no commercial activities, and is completely funded by the home office.

The corporation is registered with the U.S. Department of Justice under the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, and files semi-annual reports of its activities.
