

The Registrant will represent the foreign principal before the United States International Trade Commission in a Section 332 investigation. The fee for such representation is to be determined periodically based on usual hourly charges and other criteria for legal fees, plus out-of-pocket expenses. The duration of the agreement is indefinite.


