The Registrant rendered advice on U.S. laws, regulations and policies concerning immigration, taxation, trade, and criminal law matters. The Registrant also filed an amicus brief on behalf of the principal in a case pending in The U.S. Supreme Court, Societe Nationale Industriale Aerospatiale, et al. v. United States District Court For the District of Iowa.

✓ Amok Ltd., Saskatchewan Mining Development Corporation, Eldorado Resources Limited, Uranerz Exploration and Mining Limited

The Registrant rendered advice on U.S. laws, regulations, policies and proposed legislation relating to imports of uranium and represented the principal regarding proposed amendment of the antidumping laws and a rulemaking proceeding under the Atomic Energy Act.

✓ ASEA A.B.

The Registrant rendered advice on U.S. laws, regulations and policies concerning export controls.
