II. ACTIVITIES

During the six-month reporting period, Quebec Government House, which represents the Quebec Government in the United States, has maintained the close ties already established between the authorities and people of Quebec on the one hand, and their American neighbours on the other hand, with a view to promoting friendly cultural and tourist relations as well as business and financial contacts on a mutually profitable basis.

From July 1 to December 31, 1969, this office has welcomed 6,564 visitors; it has answered 8,100 telephone calls from prospective tourists, investors or other persons wishing general information on the Province of Quebec ; it has mailed 4,890 first class letters and kits containing promotional tourist literature.

Between October 30 and November 20, the Tourist Attaché has visited ski shows held in New York City, Washington, Boston and Hartford, Conn. He has also kept in contact with the various travel agencies and associations. Under his direction the travel information bureau has been instrumental in providing the requested information to several magazines and newspapers preparing articles on the tourist attractions of the Province of Quebec. Through the United World Films, Inc., this office has also distributed 1,049 tourist films on Quebec.

In the promotion of the economic development of Quebec, this office has maintained its usual activities during the six-month reporting period:

1. INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT

a) Plant Location Projects

Thirty-six American firms through this office have studied the possibilities of establishing manufacturing operations in the Province of Quebec.

b) Manufacturing under licence

Eleven U.S. companies have asked this office for assistance in finding a Quebec licensee for the manufacturing of their products in Canada.

c) Industrial Calls and Consultations

This office has answered some 51 industrial development inquiries and has called on 25 firms with a view to explain the advantages Quebec offers as a center of production and distribution.

2. TRADE PROMOTION

a) Export Projects

This office has tried to find outlets for 25 Quebec manufacturers wishing to sell their products in the United States.

b) Fairs

This office has been instrumental in helping 2 Quebec firms to participate in trade fairs in Eastern U.S.A.

II. ACTIVITIES (cont'd)

c) Inquiries

The economic counsellors of Quebec Government House in New York have replied to 13 general inquiries from U.S. firms wishing to sell their products in Canada; they have also helped several firms in finding sales representatives or opening sales offices in Quebec.

4. PUBLIC RELATIONS

In the economic field, the counsellors have maintained regular contacts with U.S. Federal and State Development agencies, representatives of American and Canadian banks, trade associations, and Canadian consulates in the U.S.

The highlight of this six-month reporting period, however, has been the decision of the Province of Quebec Government to extend its representation in this country by the opening of four new regional offices -- operating under the coordination of the New York office -- in an attempt to increase the volume of exchange between Quebec and all parts of the United States, on a mutually agreeable and profitable basis. This major stepping-up program has coincided with the arrival in New York City, on October 14, 1969, of a new Agent General, General Jean V. Allard, former Chief of Staff of the Canadian Armed Forces, in replacement of Mr. Charles Chartier who has been transferred to Montreal, Que.

The new offices are:

1. CHICAGO

Although in operation since April 1969, this office held its official opening, presided by the Minister of Industry and Commerce of the Quebec Government, and the new Agent General, General Jean V. Allard, on October 28, 1969.⁽¹⁾

2. BOSTON

The counsellor in charge assumed his duties on October 1, 1969. However most of his time and efforts from October to December 31, have been directed towards finding suitable office space, organizing his office, hiring secretarial help, finding living quarters. His industrial promotion activities have been limited to establishing contact with the Canadian Consulate and the banks in his area. He has participated actively in the 5th Trade Mission on Wood, and in the exhibition of the American Vocational Association. He has also established contact with the main French-American associations in his area.

3. DALLAS

The counsellor in charge assumed his duties on December 1, 1969. Therefore his activities have been limited to finding office space, hiring secretarial help, organizing the office, finding suitable living quarters.

4. LOS ANGELES

The counsellor in charge assumed his duties on December 2, 1969. Most of his activities for the month have been the organization of his office. He has been able however to establish contacts with the Canadian Consulate, the Canadian and American banks in his area, and he has made several industrial visits.

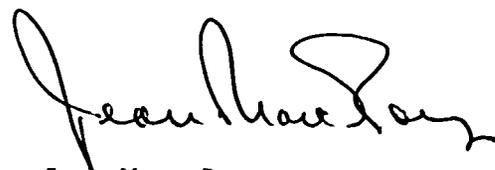
(1) The Chicago office opened in April 1969. Following an opinion received from Mr. James L. Weldon, Jr., on April 29, 1969, it has been registered separately with the U.S. Department of Justice under Registration No. 2136.

II. ACTIVITIES (cont'd)

In addition to the trade offices listed on the preceding page, the Province of Quebec Government has appointed a Cultural representative in LAFAYETTE, La. This officer, who assumed his duties on December 4, 1969, acts as liaison between the Quebec Government and the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana. During the month of December, he has been responsible for organizing the visit to Louisiana of the Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs and several Quebec Government officials who attended the Natchitoches Conference held on December 11, 12, 13 and 14.

In the area of information, the Director has maintained his contacts with the information media. He has been responsible for the publicity surrounding the arrival of the new agent general and the official opening of the Chicago office. He has organized and coordinated a trip to northern Quebec for the crew of ABC's "American Sportsman," and he has been invited to participate in a programme on NBC-TV series "Concentration" which was devoted to Quebec handicraft and Quebec City Winter Carnival. He has also been invited to address the students of Caldwell College, N.J. and Stuyvesant School, N.Y.C. During the month of July he has accompanied to Atlanta, Ga. a trade mission headed by the Minister of Industry and Commerce of the Quebec Government.
