NEW YORK

1) Quebec Government

Several officials of the Quebec Government visited New York City during the six-month period covered by the report.

The Honourable Robert Bourassa, Prime Minister, was guest speaker at the January 24 dinner of the Economic Club of New York, held at the Waldorf-Astoria. A large attendance heard Mr. Bourassa talk about "Quebec : To-day and To-morrow".

Other visitors included officials of the Department of Finance and of the Quebec Hydroelectric Commission concerning offerings of debentures on the U.S. market.

At the request of the President of the Quebec National Assembly, this office arranged meetings with officials of the United Nations - Radio and Visual Service Division - for Messrs. Roberto Wilson, Director of Interparliamentary and Public Relations; and Benoît Massicotte, Director of the Journal of Debates, with a view to studying the televising of debates and committee meetings. Similar arrangements were made, through the Canadian Embassy in Washington, for Messrs. Massicotte and Wilson to meet with representatives of the American Congress. The Delegate General, Mr. Guy Poliquin, accompanied these officials to Washington, and while in the Capital he met with our Canadian Ambassador, H. E. Mr. Marcel Cadieux, and ministers of the embassy, as well as with the head of the Canadian Government Travel Bureau.

As part of a reciprocal arrangement between the United States Consulate General in Québec City and the Government of Quebec, five American press representatives were invited to spend the week of May 27 in Montreal and Québec City to familiarize themselves with the Province, and inquire generally about its latest achievements and developments. They had the opportunity to meet with the Prime Minister, the Minister of Finance, the Minister of Industry & Commerce, as well as with officials of Hydro-Quebec and of the James Bay Corporation. The Delegate General in New York was directly concerned in contacting Mr. Graham Hovey of the New York Times, and Mr. Don Shannon, U. N. Correspondent of the Los Angeles Times. Also invited were representatives of the Chicago Tribune, Dallas Morning News, and Christian Science Monitor.

Between January 1 and June 30, the Delegate General met with representatives of various U.N. Divisions and organizations (UNDP, CARE), and also with representatives of the Port Authority of New York. He participated in functions

of the Canadian Society of New York, of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs, and maintained the ties already established with the business and financial communities the media, and the cultural milieu.

On May 10, Mr. Poliquin presided jointly with the Canadian Consul General in New York, at the opening of the showing of Mr. Gilles Gingras, a Montreal artist, whose works were exhibited in the "Canada Room" of the Consulate General from May 10 through June 29.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Early in January, the Information Service helped in the organization of a visit at this office on January 17 by a group of students from Russell Sage College, Albany. Two films on Quebec ("Charlevoix and Montreal Mode") were shown to the group followed by a session of questions and answers prior to the group's departure for Montreal and Quebec.

For the second year in a row, the Information Section, with the support of our Department of Cultural Affairs in Quebec and the Quebec Publishers Association, participated in the organization of a book exhibition at the Northeast Conference on the Teaching of Foreign Languages held at the Americana Hotel on April 12, 13 and 14, 1973. Approximately 300 Quebec published books in the French language were on display. Moreover visitors were invited to listen to Quebec performing artists via some fifty records on display at the Quebec booth.

A previous attempt at promoting Quebec literature in this country was done through an advertisement in the program of the American Association of Teachers of French convention held at the Statler Hilton Hotel the last three days of December 1972.

A portion of our book collection was the main attraction on the occasion of an exhibition during April and May at Notre Dame College in Manchester, N.H.

On May 18, the Information Section welcomed the American writer Sabra Holbrook-Erickson. Our Service contributed in scheduling for Mrs. Holbrook-Erickson meetings with various government representatives in Quebec in order to help her with the necessary research prior to the publication of her book : "The French of North America".

An American Student, Miss E. Griffin, who is preparing a thesis in connection with her doctorate in Political Sciences at the New York University, chose to analyze the results of separatism in the Quebec and Canadian communities. This office was in a position to help her in her research.

Dr. Louis Dumais is the first Quebecer to obtain a PHd in higher education from the New York University. Her thesis deals with the effects of the Quebec School reform on married students in Quebec universities. On this occasion, Dr. Dumais was guest of honor at a luncheon given at the New York University Faculty Club where a member of this Delegation was in attendance.

This office was in a position to help several Haitian nationals looking for schools at various levels where education is dispensed in the French language in the province of Quebec.

The Information Services received between 150 and 200 enquiries per month. The requests covered a wide range of subjects, such as education (namely student exchanges and visits), cultural affairs, taxation, living conditions, matters pertaining to the civil code, social welfare and health insurance, purchase of land, the Montreal metro, tec...

Our library, which is open to the public for consultation purposes, has acquired twelve new books of Quebec literature during the past six months.

3) Department of Industry & Commerce

- . Industrial development - There were 58 active projects concerning the establishment or expansion of new processing industries in Quebec involving the participation of American, Canadian, European and Asian interests.

Negotiations were carried out on behalf of 18 American corporations with a similar number of Canadian companies concerning sub-contracting or manufacturing under license.

Consulting services were provided to 90 U.S. firms who were interested in doing business in Canada.

- . Trade Development - 109 Quebec manufacturers were assisted in making contact with American buyers, distributors and agents. Some of these manufacturers participated in trade exhibitions held in New York, Atlantic City, Pennsylvania and North Carolina.

Assistance was given to American buyers in attending four Canadian trade shows in Quebec and Ontario.

In June 1973, some 100 American fashion editors were hosted in Montreal for the second annual "Montreal Mode" Fashion Press Weekend.

- . Arrangements were made with the editorial staff of five American publications to devote forthcoming editions to high-lighting the Quebec fashion industry.

- . Economic Development - Highlights of the period were the visit of Prime Minister Robert Bourassa to the Economic Club of New York in January and the sale of a \$ 125 million Quebec bond issue in March. The reaction of the American financial community to both events was extremely positive.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish & Game

During the past six months, between January 1st and June 30th the Tourist Office received 21,707 inquiries for travel information pertaining to the Province of Quebec.

Film distribution :

The Tourist Office who is responsible for film distribution has fulfilled 1,000 requests thus documenting 50,000 persons on the Province of Quebec.

Those films were shown to different associations : colleges, universities, sporting clubs, religious groups and television viewers.

Activities :

Various members of the Tourist Office have participated or assisted in seminars, travel shows and exhibitions.

In most instances it consisted of assistance in manning various booths representing the Canadian Government Travel Bureau or Air Canada.

The Office has also assisted a great number of American Journalists in obtaining pertinent data on Montreal, Quebec City and the Province as such.

Moreover the office has made numerous arrangements for journalists or travel agents to be guests of the Province of Quebec in order to familiarize themselves with our attractions and facilities.

During the same period the Tourism Counsellor attended several receptions as a guest speaker. He as also visited many travel agencies ; land carriers and other organizations related to the travel industry.

It is also to be noted that Mr. René Duchesne, who was responsible for the Tourist Office, departed on April 1st, 1973 and was succeeded by Pierre-Gilles Valiquette.

Organized 1973 Summer French study program in Québec for 125 Louisiana students and professors, extended that program to the campus of Rivière-du-Loup in addition to the regular campus of Jonquière ; paved the way for the hiring, by Codofil (Council for the Development of French in Louisiana) a Louisiana State Agency, of an educational consultant from Quebec, Jan Lobelle, Chairman, Teacher Training for Bilingual Education, McGill University, Montreal, for a one-year period ; Codofil is handling directly the hiring and immigration procedures ; salary will be paid by the Louisiana State Department of Education ; Mr. Lobelle will be stationed in Baton Rouge.

Culture ;

Distributed to six Louisiana stations, radio, some 100 country and western and blue grass records made in French in Montreal ; this was done through the local Codofil organization ; the records are played daily by the stations, especially in Houma ; organized a tour of 20 concerts in Louisiana high schools for Montreal performer Pierre Calvé ; the tour was postponed to an indefinite date because of the Spring floods.

Industrial Development -

During this period of time, some twenty new files have been opened and two industries have established in Quebec giving employment to approximatively sixty persons.

Among the new companies that we have been in touch with, three of them seem to be very much interested in establishing branch plants in Quebec. All three could be classified as steel fabricators, but each one is in a different line of operation. One manufactures stainless steel bolts, another, fluid flow measuring equipment, and the third, steel joists and trusses. The investment could be in the vicinity of five million dollars with a possible employment of some four hundred persons.

Trade Promotion -

We work in close cooperation with the Canadian Consulates located in the Southwest and Southeast states which constitute our territory. The most important commodities shipped to this part of the United States seem to be clothing, food, and all sorts of machinery and equipment in varying quantities.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish & Game

For some unknown reason, we receive in Dallas inquiries on tourism from all over the United States with Texas, naturally, making up the greatest portion. Our office appears to be better known after three years of operation and many requests for information on Québec are now directed to us. These inquiries come mainly from groups planning to travel to the Province of Québec or attending conventions ; also, travel agents request literature particularly on the cities of Montreal and Québec.

To comply with all these requests, we keep on hand a supply of literature on these two important cities and on the various regions of Québec, the Provincial Parks, camping facilities, fishing and game hunting regulations. We also have literature for distribution on winter sports, hotel accommodations, and road maps.

Our activities do not change but simply increase from year to year.

Information -

We sent to Québec for seven days a journalist from the Christian Science Monitor who, together with four of his colleagues from other newspapers, visited the Province on the invitation of the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs of the Government of Quebec.

Culture -

The State of New Hampshire has now set up a commission to foster the relations between French-Canada, i.e. Quebec, and its Francophile residents. There are now four of these commissions in existence in four of the six New England states, and the Boston office has been assisting their promoters. We also took an active part in the organization of a Conference on the French Language Community in North America which should result in the creation of a permanent CODOFINE (Council of Development of French in New England) comparable to the CODOFIL in Louisiana.

3) Department of Industry & Commerce

Industrial development -

In spite of all the efforts made, we were not very successful in attracting new industries to Québec, and we can say that at this time we have approximately five interesting projects that should materialize in the near future. We keep on trying and trying, but the economy itself of New England is not very bright at the moment, and the closing of the major shipyards is not going to help the situation.

Trade and Commerce Promotion -

We put a lot of emphasis on selling Québec products in the New England states, finding for Québec companies either distributors, wholesalers, agents or representatives. We helped to organize four incoming missions where more than thirty companies were involved, and we can say that each of them was very successful in getting orders or in getting the type of representation desired.

We also organized trips for local buyers to five shows in the Montréal area, and these people have been placing substantial orders, and will continue "to buy Québec" because quality, prices and service are right. We also participated in six shows, mostly in Boston, and all the Québec companies involved were pleased with the coverage they received in New England.

The number of requests for information on Québec is going up tremendously, and the hiring of a tourist officer will certainly add a new dimension to these requests, because we are now in a position to make some real promotion and not only answer the questions we receive.

Industrial development -

Two Midwestern companies have begun manufacturing activities in the Province of Quebec, and a third has acquired a Quebec company which was in financial difficulties. These three investments, which total approximately \$ 1.5 million, create or preserve at least 170 jobs for Quebec workers. The office has worked closely with 20 companies which are contemplating establishing plants in Quebec, as well as with 3 firms interested in making investments in the commercial sector ; and has maintained contact with some 12 companies which have a long-range interest in Canada. The Economic Counsellor made 3 trips to states covered by the office, making presentations to some 30 companies. The office has also written to some 220 companies in seven states in order to familiarize them with the incentive program offered by our Province.
