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New York

1) Quebec Government

The Quebec Government House in New York is the official representative of the Quebec Government in the United States of America. This mission is headed by a Delegate General who is appointed specifically by the Executive Branch (The Cabinet of Ministers). He is the only authorized individual to act as governmental representative in the United States.

He is responsible for the administration of the House and its Branches and acts as official agent with the Securities Exchange Commission in regards to all borrowings made in the U.S.A. by the Quebec Government and by all agencies carrying the endorsement of the Quebec Government.

July-August 1975

Activities at Quebec House in the summer are mainly centered on Tourism. However, in August, the House was host at two receptions offered to American buyers attending the Shoe Show and the Gift Show.

September 1975

The Delegate General was guest speaker at the bi-annual meeting in Bridgeport, of the Connecticut Franco-American Union. On that occasion, he stated emphatically that the Government of Quebec would cooperate in any plans put forward to maintain French as a second language provided these plans first received the approval of the State of Connecticut.

The Minister of Industry and Commerce for Quebec visited New York City in September. On this occasion, he gave a press conference to the financial press and met with officials of American corporations doing business in Quebec. On September 9, he addressed the Canadian Club of New York on the state of Quebec's economy and on Quebec's views regarding foreign investments.

The Delegate's Executive Assistant was dispatched to Las Vegas, Nevada, on the occasion of the annual meeting of the International Musexpo meeting. Quebec is very interested in exporting its artists.

The Delegate General attended a reception at the residence of Canada's Permanent Representative at the United Nations.

The Mayor of Montreal was guest speaker at the annual Maple Leaf Dinner of the Canadian Society of New York and gave a press conference to the Sports editors on the 1976 Olympiad to be held in Montreal next July.

October 1975

The Delegate General introduced a firm of Quebec consultants to the U.N.D.P. mission at the United Nations.

He also met with the authorities of a Quebec bank interested in opening an Agency on Wall Street. Meeting arrangements were also made with the New York State officials.

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The Delegate General hosted a reception in honour of three Quebec opera singers performing at the Metropolitan Opera House together.

The Minister of Municipal Affairs visited the financial community.

The Delegate General attended the Canadian Arts Festival held in Washington as a tribute to the Bicentennial.

Further to the mission conducted by the Delegate General in February 1975 to the municipal authorities of Philadelphia, Mr. André Gravel, Chief Engineer, had further meetings with these officials as well as officials in Cleveland, Ohio, from October 13-15, 1975

From October 5-18, 1975, three Quebec Officials from the Ministries of Transport, Natural Resources and Public Works visited the National Archives in Washington and the National Personnel Records Centers in St. Louis to investigate what is being done in the field of records management. This was just a study group.

November 1975

The Delegate General attended a reception at the Canadian Consulate in honour of the International Business Community.

He also participated in the Foreign Trade Convention and in a special Ski-Night offered by Quebec to the American Travel Community.

He gave a reception in honour of the fashion editors, attending their annual meeting in New York City.

December 1975

The Delegate General met with the authorities of the U.N.D.P. promoting Quebec consultants in overseas ventures.

He also hosted a group of students from Westfield High School (N.Y.) planning a two-week stay in French Quebec.

He supported the Olympics Committee visiting New York to promote the July Games in Montreal.

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2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Listed below is a summary of inquiries received by mail, telephone and from visitors during the above period. They numbered approximately 100 to 125 per month.

We were in a position to:

- help in securing birth and marriage certificates from Québec for American nationals;
- intervene with Québec firms in the settlement of accounts under dispute,
- loan and/or make available through our library Québec Government reports and other literature to students involved in special research dealing with Québec.
- Supply:
  - a) United States importers, brokers and retailers with directories and lists of Québec manufacturers,
  - b) lawyers and other interested individuals with answers pertaining to Québec statutes, civil code, municipal code, fiscality, real estate, immigration, Québec Health and Hospitalization Insurance, Québec Pension Plan,
  - c) teachers, parents and/or students with lists of boarding schools, trade schools, summer camps and programs from universities and colleges offering French summer courses
  - d) schools with literature, photos and posters.

Official Language Act - The application of the regulation respecting public signs and advertisements in writing in the Province of Québec resulted in several requests from American firms, lawyers, etc. concerned with the use of French in Québec.

Since the beginning of the school year 1975-1976, three invitations requesting a speaker were extended to us by two high schools and one association. We unfortunately had to decline because of the lack of time to delegate an appropriate lecturer. However, in lieu of a speaker, in one instance, a Québec film was loaned for showing to a group of teachers on the occasion of the annual meeting of the Association of Teachers of French at Otego, N.Y.

On December 11, 1975, a group of students from Westfield, N.J., paid this office a visit prior to a proposed visit to Québec. The group, accompanied by their teacher of French, was shown the film: "La Place Royale à Québec", a film depicting the restoration of this historical site in the city of Québec.

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LITERATURE

During the past six months, the following publications were given upon request:

- "Québec At a Glance" - 100 per month
- "Québec en Bref" - 60 per month
- "Profile of Québec" - 400 copies
- "Le Québec Tel Quel" - 200 copies (most requests originating from schools where French is being taught).

During the above period, our service was instrumental in obtaining from this country various necessary materials required by departments of the Québec government. This service was particularly emphasized during the Canadian postal strike, at which time several of our departments took advantage of our special mail service established between New York and Québec in order to avoid unwanted delays in the delivery of books and other literature urgently needed.

From July to December, we compiled twenty-one press reviews and acquired fourteen books of Québec literature.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

Industrial Development:

The completion of our Fantus studies was carried out in the period under review, specifically Fantus #14 - Automotive Replacement Parts and Accessories - and Fantus #15, Agricultural and Construction Machinery parts and Attachments. As in the past, initial contact was made with the prospects by letter from the Minister of Industry and Commerce from Québec City and followup by letter and telephone call was carried out through this office.

The second half of 1975 was not one that was economically conducive to the expenditure of capital here or in Canada and, consequently, our activity was considerably reduced insofar as working with new prospects was concerned.

The rapid escalation of wages through contract settlements at a greater rate than here in the U.S. and also a reduction in productivity per man have contributed to a slowdown in interest.

Our commercial counsellors continue to travel the territory to maintain a p.r. image in the area served by this office.

Commercial Development:

We have continued to counsel and introduce Québec firms wishing to establish export contacts and have provided display space and office accomodation for visiting exporters.

The principal shows in which Québec manufacturers participated were the National Association of Men's Sportswear Buyers in mid-October and the Canadian Ladies Leatherwear Collections later in the same month.



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Early in September the Minister of Industry and Commerce spent two days in New York and was Guest Speaker at the Canadian Club, which was attended by some 300 persons, included in which were the senior officers of most of the companies whose head offices are located here and who are corporate citizens of Québec Province.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

Films:

Our distributor in the United States, Association Sterling lent out 528 films thus documenting 25,000 people on the Province of Québec. All these films were shown to either ethnic groups, conventions or student bodies.

Miscellaneous:

As in the past this office has aided journalists or newspapermen or any other person connected with the information media in obtaining information on the Province of Québec. Many were guests of the Province during the past six months. One of our main tasks has also been to coordinate or assist in fabrication of tour packages to the Olympics.

On September 3rd, 4th and 5th, the Information Officer accompanied three officials of the Department of Social Affairs on a visit to New England.

The purpose of their visit was to study the Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission.

On October 31, the Information Officer attended a meeting with other representatives of the Eastern Canadian Provinces to discuss the implementation of the International Heritage Trail approved by the Premiers of the Eastern Canadian Provinces and the Governors of the New England States at their June 16-17 meeting in St. Andrews, New Brunswick.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

Of all the telephone calls, letters, industrial visits, we have retained approximately 14 dossiers which we consider serious prospects for

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eventual plant expansion in Québec. One of them is already building in Sherbrooke -\$4½ M investment - and three are negotiating land.

To promote our Province in New England, we made arrangements for our Minister of Industry and Commerce to speak in Boston to a group of 60 businessmen.

We are also making arrangements for the preparation of a special economic supplement in the Boston Globe for the month of February 1976. The Christian Science Monitor would also like to prepare a similar supplement.

For the period July 1st to December 31, 1975, the Commercial division has assisted in the marketing of sporting goods, specialty truck bodies, wood products, cement forms, food products, hardware, confectionary, batteries, candles, wood cabinets, cement etc., high temperature insulated wire, apparel and shoe products.

In addition, endeavours were initiated to locate markets in Canada for: Prime Computor Inc., Alcoa Aluminium for travel trailer forms, a supply of fresh shrimps from the Gloucester area for a Québec processing plant.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

There was a small increase in traffic in our new offices. Requests for information came:

via mail approx. 600  
via telephone approx. 900  
via visits to the office approx 250  
for films about 100

The tourist sector:

- 1) participated in various fam tours of travel agents,
- 2) invited and accompanied twelve different decision-makers for incentive trips on visits to Montreal and Québec,
- 3) participated in ski promotion seminars and shows in Atlanta, Boston and Washington,
- 4) cooperated on a regular basis with the offices of tourism of the Canadian Government in Atlanta, Boston, Washington and New York,
- 5) cooperated with the city of Montréal on:
  - a) a Christmas tree special event program at the Prudential Complex
  - b) a Marketplace for twenty-nine representatives of Montréal hotels to meet with eighteen wholesalers and/or New England tour operators.
- 6) maintained regular contacts with wholesalers and/or tour operators,
- 7) participated in a series of Québecair promotions in five Southern cities.



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CHICAGO

1) Quebec Government

The office helped coordinate fact-finding visits to shows or organizations in our region for officials of the Departments of Agricultural and Intergovernmental Affairs and the Montréal Regional Transportation Authority. The Director of the office has participated in various activities of the Northwestern University Canadian Studies Program and is urging the Québec government authorities to actively support this program. The office's four counsellors represented the Government of Québec at a luncheon given by the Canadian Olympic Coin Committee to launch the Olympic Coin Sport Art Tour. As the representative of the Québec government in the Midwest, the office was invited by the Chicago Board of Education to participate in the bicentennial project highlighting the French language. We are supplying posters and educational materials on Québec which will be distributed in some 50 Chicago high Schools.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The office participated in the organization and presentation of a Seminar for teachers of French on the subject of the French language in Québec, sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of French and the French Cultural Services. As the result of the interest in Québec inspired by this Seminar and the exposure we received from our involvement in it, we received several requests from teachers who are interested in giving courses on Québec or taking their students to the Province, and are now working on these projects. The Director of the office also devoted considerable time to promoting the participation of Québec in the LaSalle Expedition II bicentennial project.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

During the last six months of 1975, the economic counsellor worked closely with 7 companies which are seriously contemplating manufacturing investments in Québec, and maintained contact with over 10 long-range prospects. The office also increased its activities in the area of joint ventures, acting as consultant and liaison to 11 Midwest companies looking for partners in Canada. One of these investors concluded an agreement with a Québec company which will permit this enterprise to expand both its technology and its production. The economic counsellor and staff continued to devote considerable time to the Fantus project, sending out 620 followup letters and distributing 100 feasibility studies to companies in the Midwest territory.

The commercial counsellors organized a major in-store promotion with Evans Inc. which involved 7 stores and \$1,4 million worth of women's outerwear and apparel made in Québec. In conjunction with this promotion we arranged for a Québec sculptor to appear in two of the stores, where he garnered much favorable publicity in addition to selling a number of wood sculptures. The office helped coordinate, promote, and followup on Québec participation in 2 major shows which brought a total of 20 Québec manufacturers to Chicago where several appointed representatives have sold their products and services. The commercial officers also provided



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assistance to 16 Québec companies interested in selling their products in the Midwest, as well as to 3 American companies looking for suppliers in Québec.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

The office has been working hard in encouraging major wholesalers to promote package tours to the Province of Québec. Several major wholesalers have developed and are marketing winter programs in Québec as a result of these efforts. Among these is Forlow Tours, which has already organized 13 trips to Québec, each with a maximum capacity of 585 people; Cartan, in conjunction with Air Canada, is selling ski programs to Québec throughout the Midwest. S & H Travel Awards Inc. welcomed the tourist counsellor while he was in Detroit and gave him an overall view of their organization. To help stimulate interest in Québec as a convention site, the office is continuing to contact Chicago area associations who have affiliations in Québec.

Fourteen area travel writers were contacted and familiarization trips were organized for three of them. The resulting articles represented at least \$15,000 in free publicity and were published in 5 newspapers with a combined circulation of almost 2 million. These articles also inspired an impressive number of requests for travel information. The office handled approximately 450 requests for information from individuals interested in visiting the Province of Québec.

The tourist counsellor collaborated in apparel promotion efforts sponsored by two clothing stores, Evans and Seiferts. The office was instrumental in providing a one-week, all-expense paid vacation to Québec City for the winner of the Seiferts drawing (with a total of 350,000 entries), and a similar trip to Montréal for the Evans winner.

The months of September, October and November were particularly active months for the tourist counsellor. He attended 2 Ski Seminars, 1 Ski Show, 2 Airline Shows, 1 Sales Incentive Show, and 3 Travel Trade Shows in Chicago and the Midwest region. For the first time Québec was represented in the Henry Davis Travel Trade Show (held in both Chicago and Detroit), one of the most important trade shows which attracts the leading travel agents in the Midwest. This year's shows commanded a combined attendance of approximately 2000 travel agents, making it an excellent platform for vaunting Québec's touristic attractions.

In December the tourist counsellor attended a one-week meeting held in Québec City to discuss policies of programs of the Department of Tourism, Fish and Game.

Industrial Development:

During the last semester twenty six new files have been opened on companies visited by the Director of the Dallas office, which have shown particular interest in establishing manufacturing operations in Quebec. Unfortunately, none of these projects are to be considered in an immediate future, but are rather studied on a long range basis.

However, a large Texas company, contacted previously, has started construction on the grounds of their Canadian division, aiming at an expansion of their manufacturing facilities which will imply an investment of approximately \$18 million.

One company from Atlanta has negotiated a licensing agreement with a Montreal firm for the manufacturing of chemical dyes for the textile industry. Two other firms from our territory are investigating the possibilities of purchasing existing Canadian companies engaged in the production of similar commodities.

An oil company from Arkansas, has built a number of oil storage tanks east of Montreal. Another large oil firm from Dallas, has invested more than \$1 million in a joint venture with the Quebec Government sponsored company SOQUIP (Société Québécoise d'Initiative Pétrolière), towards the exploration of gas and oil resources.

Trade Promotion:

Sponsored by the Federal Department of Trade Industry and Commerce, seven Québec Furniture Manufacturers exhibited their products at the Southern Furniture Show held at Hickory and High Point, N.C. with satisfactory results.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

The Director of the Dallas Office attended the presentations made by Air Canada in five important cities of Texas, to promote their new services between Houston/Dallas and Toronto/Montréal. The inaugural flight took place on July 1st.

These presentations have spurred a lot of inquiries from travel agencies requesting literature and additional information on Montreal and Québec City, and particularly on the forthcoming Olympics to be held in Montréal.

In cooperation with the Department of Tourism of Québec, we have been able to provide detailed information regarding the convention facilities offered by Montreal and Québec City, to various groups and companies seeking attractive sites for their annual meetings.



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LAFAYETTE

1) Quebec Government

The office received and piloted Robert Guy Scully of Le Devoir, one of Montréal's leading newspapers.

Organized and supervised the twelve concert tour of Les Petits Chanteurs de Granby, a well known children choir from Granby, Qué.

Received and stationed in Lake Charles a new educational consultant by the name of Louise Fréchette.

Received the Québec thirty member contingent to American Public Work Association convention in New Orleans.

Took care of the fifteen member contingent from Québec for the American Folklore Association convention in New Orleans. Organized a trip for them to Lafayette and St-Martinville. Arranged T.V. and newspaper coverage.

Met several times with Gérard Roubichou, cultural attaché of the French General Consulate in New Orleans to coordinate the Fédération Internationale des Professeurs de Français (FIPF) convention schedules for the 26 to the 30 of December in New Orleans.

Met with Richard Hadre, general chairman of the F.I.P.F. to coordinate Québec's part in its convention.

Escorted a sick Québec CODOFIL teacher to Québec and met the Québec officials for discussions on questions concerning the office.

On another trip, met with Jean-Paul L'Allier, new minister of Cultural Affairs on general views concerning Québec's image of North America.

Held an hour long interview with John Phillips, from the Globe and Mail and various other publications.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Coordinated a month of intensive study course at LSU, Baton Rouge, for 115 Québec teachers of English. (Department of Intergovernmental Affairs).

Coordinated the sending of some 200 Louisianians students and teachers for summer courses in Jonquièrre and Rivière-du-Loup.

Coordinated the arrival and installation of 65 young Quebecers to teach in elementary schools in CODOFIL's program carried out in conjunction with the State Department of Education.

Attended in New Orleans, a CODOFIL academic advisory board meeting comprising all the heads of the foreign language departments of Louisiana universities.

Attended a meeting of the eight educational consultants in CODOFIL's

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educational program. They are French, Belgian and Québécoise (Louise Fréchette), paid by the respective governments and supervised by the State Department of Education.

Met with Louis-Michael Richard, of U.S. Immigration in New Orleans for a briefing on the status of the Québec teachers.

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LOS ANGELES

1. Quebec Government

Representatives of the Central Claims Department of the Québec Department of Justice and the Québec Provincial Police (Sûreté du Québec) visited California in early October, meeting with the Los Angeles and San Francisco Police Department and the California Highway Patrol. Their discussions were aimed at structuring a Vehicule Safety Program and at streamlining liability claim procedures against the Government.

Mr. Pierre G. Dorion, Directeur Général aux Greffes, for the Québec Department of Justice, addressed a session of the California Judicial Council on matters of bilingualism.

2. Intergovernmental Affairs

A group of 10 representatives from 7 Québec-based companies participated (September 21-24) at International Musexpo'75 in Las Vegas, under the sponsorship of the Québec government.

3. Industry and Commerce

Wescon: The Economic Development Office of the Montreal Urban Community had an information booth at WESCON, the Western Electronic Fair, held this year in San Francisco from September 14-19. A group of 11 Québec companies part of a larger canadian sales mission, also participated actively to the event.

In the field of Defense Production, four buyer missions were sent to Montreal, during the period of review and a sales mission was arranged for 6 Québec companies in Southern California, This activity preceeded the recent award by the Canadian Government of a \$950 million contract to Lockheed for Long Range Patrol Aircrafts.

This office has continued to assist various american firms of this area to setup facilities or negotiate manufacturing arrangement in Québec.

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4. TOURISM

The Québec Department of Tourism participated at the Travel Age West convention held in Anaheim from October 17-20.

Continuous inquiries on the Montreal Olympics were handled from this office.

Assistance was provided by this office, relative to the participation of the Quebec City Winter Carnival and the Cité of Montréal to the 1976 Parade of Roses in Pasadena.


