

INSERT ITEM 11NEW YORK1) Quebec Government

The Quebec Government, a provincial entity of Canada, has maintained a representative office in New York City since 1941. It is now known as Quebec Government House (in French: La Délégation générale du Québec) and is located in the International Building of the Rockefeller Center in the heart of Manhattan. It also maintains satellite offices or branches in Boston, Mass., Chicago, Ill., Dallas, Tex., Lafayette, La. and Los Angeles, Cal. This mission looks mainly after the financial, commercial, tourist and cultural interests of Québec in the United States. Its head, known as the Delegate General, is registered as a Foreign Agent with the Department of Justice.

His main responsibilities cover the administration of the House and the operation of its branches. He is the principal representative of the Quebec Government and also acts as the authorized agent with the Securities Exchange Commission.

January 1976

The Delegate General introduced the officials of a large Quebec Consulting Engineers firm to the Washington community, the World Bank and the Interamerica Bank. We also met with representatives of Voice of America to discuss Quebec's role in French-speaking countries. We supplied information to prospective investors in the Hydro-Quebec private placement of \$1 billion of debentures. Also cooperated with various media interested in the construction cost of the Olympic installations. Have participated in the launching in the U.S.A. of the sale of Olympic coins and jewellery.

February 1976

We hosted a reception for buyers and trade editors attending the International Shoe Fair where ten Quebec manufacturers exhibited their wares under the sponsorship of the Quebec Government. Hosted the officials of the U.S. Department of State Governmental Advisory Committee on Book Fairs in relation to the forthcoming Montreal International Book Fair. Another reception for buyers and trade editors attending the Gift show at the New York Coliseum. Hosted a reception to introduce Montreal's Mayor, Mr. Jean Drapeau, promoting the Book Fair in New York City.

March 1976

The Delegate General attended a reception offered by Mayor Beame to launch the "Week of French" in New York City. Participated in a discussion at Columbia University on Canadian federalism and U.S.-Canada relations. Also discussed Quebec's role in Columbia Maison Française project. Invited the International Bridge, Tunnel and Tollroads Association of Washington to hold another convention in Montreal. Alerted the proper officials on a proposed visit of Quebec's Premier Bourassa to Chicago.

April 1976

Visit to New York of five Québec parliamentarians on the occasion of the meeting of French-speaking legislators at the United Nations. Also hosted Quebec officials attending "Law of the Sea" meetings at the U.N. Attended a reception offered by the Ivory Coast Ambassador at Huntington, L.I.

Premier Bourassa of Quebec came to New York to meet the main investors of Hydro-Quebec and discuss the present economic situation. The Ministers of Intergovernmental Affairs and of Industry and Commerce were in New York to attend the annual meeting of all Quebec representatives in the United States. The Montreal Symphony Orchestra played at Carnegie Hall for guests of both Canadian and Quebec governments. Was consulted by the International Bridge, Tunnel and Turnpike Association of Washington with regards to publishing Tollways in foreign languages. Cooperated in the launching of an exposition of Olympic memorabilia in the Seagrams Building.

June 1976

Attended the opening of an exhibition of tapestries of Louise Panneton at the Canadian Consulate. Met with Wall Street representatives to discuss Quebec financial situation. Received the U.S. press corps to hear Hon. Victor Goldbloom on Olympic installations in Montreal. He also discussed municipal financing in Quebec with the Wall Street community. Attended the due-diligence meeting in the last Hydro-Quebec issue in New York. Accepted to participate in a "Quebec Day" celebration in a large New Jersey resort. Gave an interview to "Voice of America" on the forthcoming Olympic Games. Accompanied a group of U.S. financiers to St. Félicien, Québec, where a new Kraft plant is being erected. Delivered an invitation from Premier Bourassa to Governor Carey's office to attend the Olympic games in Montreal. Hosted a reception in honour of Montreal Mode for U.S. fashion editors.

Our commercial attachés and economic counsellors continue to travel the territory and in the commercial field, we have welcomed incoming Quebec missions showing at several U.S. exhibitions, specifically and in part, National Shoe Fair, Childrenswear Show, Fancy Food Show, New York Gift Show, National Association of Men's Sportswear Buyers and in support of this activity, our Quebec Trade Center at our offices in Rockefeller Center has become more active, making space available for Quebec merchants to show their wares.

During the period we were visited by Mayor Jean Drapeau of Montreal and The Honorable Victor Goldbloom, Minister of Municipal Affairs, both of whom addressed Canadian audiences based here in New York.

As usual, several mailings were made to our selected list, all of which were reported in the prescribed form to Washington.

Films:

The office through its distributor Association Sterling lent out 1,061 films which were shown to various audiences totalling 53,050 persons.

During the same period a great portion of the efforts were directed towards the 76 Olympics.

We provided assistance regarding lodging; press accreditation etc... to a great number of people.

The office also participated in a variety of trade promotion activities such as seminars and exhibitions held in various parts of the States of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

BOSTON1) Quebec Government

Our Government was represented at the New England Governors and Eastern Canadian Premiers Conference which was held in Chatham, Massachusetts, in the early part of June, by Premier R. Bourassa and Vice-Premier Gérard D. Lévesque. One of the main issues was the energy problems which do exist between the two regions and whether the states and provincial governments can influence their respective federal governments to find solutions.

Together with Thomson, McKinnon, Auchincloss, Kohlmeyer, underwriters, this office organized a conference for portfolio managers in the New England area to hear Mr. Lemieux, director of finance, on the occasion of a massive Hydro-Québec bond issue in the United States.

INSERT ITEM 112) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

In coordination with the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs, the Department of Immigration is delegating since April 1976 two officials for short periods of two to three days a month to scrutinize immigrants interested in locating in Québec.

The cultural section worked particularly with the Franco-American associations of New England, universities and colleges of the region.

We assisted teachers interested in giving courses on Québec civilization, history and literature.

We organized Québec's participation in the Franco-American Week held at the State House in Boston for the Bicentennial.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

In the course of the month of February, the Boston Globe published a special supplement on Québec emphasizing the economic advantages offered by our Province.

During the past six months we were in touch with over 160 companies. We have retained approximately 21 dossiers which we consider serious prospects for eventual plant expansion in Québec. Four of these companies have submitted their proposals to FIRA and DREE and are awaiting decision.

During the period from January 1st to June 30th, the commercial division has assisted in the marketing of turkey poults, hydraulic lamps, radios, quails, canoes, loudspeaker cabinets, trailers, ski boots, candles, wood-turnings, jet washing machines, electronic communication equipment, wood, metal shelves, small printing presses, synthetic cords. In addition, we promoted a number of shows taking place in the Province of Québec, among others CAMA and Sporting Goods Show, and made a survey of the possibilities of our chances of selling travel trailers and tent trailers in New England.

In all, we were in touch on an individual basis with 35 Québec companies that showed an interest in exporting their products to New England.

- 4) maintained regular contacts with wholesalers and/or tour operators,
- 5) sent 6 media people to Québec,
- 6) participated in conventions of the travel industry for groups.

CHICAGO1) Quebec Government

The office coordinated the first official visit to Chicago of the Hon. Robert Bourassa, Prime Minister of Québec. The office organized a luncheon in honor of the Prime Minister which was attended by 100 members of Chicago's business and banking elite. The Prime Minister gave a brief address and answered questions submitted by the audience. Mr. Bourassa's schedule in Chicago also included speeches to the Canadian Studies Program at Northwestern University and to the Chicago Council on Foreign Relations, and meetings with Mayor Daley and members of the press. The director of the office was influential in obtaining the support of the Government of Québec for the project LaSalle: Expedition II, which was designated Québec's official project for the U.S. Bicentennial and received a grant of \$10,000. The office helped coordinate fact-finding trips for officials of the Department of Labor and the Mirabel Industrial Park. The director of the office gave lectures on Québec to student groups at Mundelein College and the YMCA Community College, and continued working with the Canadian Studies Program at Northwestern University, which developed a course on Québec which was offered during the spring semester.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The office worked closely with Mundelein College in the development of a course on Québec's cultural renaissance which was offered during the spring semester. In addition to supplying or obtaining books, films, and other material on Québec used during the course, the office helped in the organization of a "Québec Day" sponsored by Mundelein to introduce area high school and college students to the Province. Over 800 students attended this program, where they received copies of "Profile of Québec" distributed by the office. The office and the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs were also deeply involved in a bicentennial project organized by the Chicago School Board to commemorate the contribution of francophone countries to the development of Illinois. This project took the form of a contest open to all 6000 students of French in the Chicago school system. In addition to supplying background material on Québec to the 80 schools involved, the office provided books, records and Québec handicrafts which were distributed to the prize winners. The office also helped coordinate the trip to Québec of a group of students from Metro High School. Through the intervention of the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs, these students participated in a special program of activities organized by the City of Québec and visited a Québec school.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

During the first 6 months of 1976, the economic counsellors worked closely with four companies which are seriously contemplating manufacturing investments in Québec, as well as with eight longer-range prospects. They also opened files on 90 new prospects through

the distribution of Canadian import analyses prepared by the Department of Regional Economic Expansion to highlight sectors offering exceptional potential to manufacturers. The initial phase of the Fantus project was concluded with the distribution and follow-up of the final study, and the office is continuing to develop the leads created during the last two years by this effort. The economic counsellors also continued to expand their efforts to develop joint ventures, working with five Québec companies (three of which are currently negotiating with American companies to associate through licensing or distribution) as well as with six American companies who are looking for Canadian partners.

The two Commercial Counsellors made a trip to Montréal to discuss with their Québec Colleagues the orientation and expansion of the Department's export promotion program. The office helped organize, promote, and follow up on Québec participation in two major shows which brought twelve manufacturers to Chicago to sell their products, and also helped coordinate three technical missions which enabled 35 manufacturers to assess the market and product technology in their sectors. In addition to working with twelve Québec companies seeking to penetrate the Midwest market, the commercial counsellors provided assistance to buyers from seven Chicago area stores who made buying trips to Québec. The office also helped to promote the CAMA and NAMSB shows, in which Québec manufacturers participated, through calls and mailings to Midwest retailers. The six month period ended on an exciting and promising note when the Chicago office succeeded in negotiating the rental of permanent showroom space for Québec contract furniture in the Exhibitors Building, the first time that Québec manufacturers will have a continuing base of operations from which to develop their exports to the Midwest.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

In the spring the Office in collaboration with the Canadian Government Office of Tourism and 23 Chicago area wholesalers and airlines staged 12 "workshops" in various Mid-West cities. Some 800 travel agents and wholesalers were introduced to the travel advantages and travel aids available to them and their clients. As a result of this promotion campaign on behalf of Canada, we received more than 65 requests for additional information on the Province of Quebec.

The tourist counsellor participated in the highly successful Air Canada and Air France Travel Trade Shows held in March; some 800 travel agents were present at these events.

The Montreal Summer Olympic Games have created a surge of requests concerning lodging and tickets, as well as approximately 700 tourism inquiries on the Province of Quebec. Some 15 firms and travel agencies contacted us for promotional materials on the Olympics. We provided them with posters, brochures and, in some cases, samples of Quebec crafts.

Further to our promotional efforts, several associations and companies have solicited us for information on convention facilities in Montreal and Quebec City.

The office also contacted various food editors in the Chicago area to participate in the 11th "Salon Dégustation" held in the Laurentians.

In collaboration with two major wholesalers, the office sponsored two familiarization tours for a total of 75 travel agents. One highlighted Montreal and Quebec City; the other, Montreal and the Laurentians. Another familiarization tour to Quebec was offered to tour desk employees of Air Canada, Air France and Allegheny airlines.

The office organized and hosted the May luncheon of A.O.T.O. honoring the media. It was attended by 12 members of the media and 33 tourism officers.

The office is now in the process of organizing different package tours to Quebec and presenting them to wholesalers. One of the wholesalers contacted has already expressed serious interest in the proposed itineraries.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

At the invitation of the Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs of the Government of Quebec, the Director of the Dallas office attended a meeting in New York of the heads of post of the Québec Delegations in the United States, where the Minister of Industry and Commerce was also present. This meeting was presided jointly by the two Ministers of the Cabinet of the Quebec Government.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

Industrial Development:

Even though the territory assigned to the Dallas delegation does not seem to be affected by the recession to the same extent as in the rest of the U.S., we have found business towards Quebec relatively slow in the first six months of the year.

We have opened sixteen new files on companies that have shown interest in investing in manufacturing operations in Quebec. Two among them would prefer to buy existing companies in the same line of business. All the others projects are not for an immediate realization but are rather on a long range basis. Of course if the economic situation improves some of these projects might be activated sooner.

Trade Promotion:

Sponsored by the Federal Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce five Quebec manufacturers out of eleven exhibitors showed their products at the Miami Boat Show in February.

In April, the Quebec Government sent to Atlanta, Ga., a mission composed of six manufacturers to participate in the Exhibitors Manufacturing Service Exposition (E.M.S.)

In May, the Quebec Department of Industry and Commerce sponsored the participation of seven manufacturers from our Province to the Supermarket Institute Convention and Exhibition (S.M.I.) held at the Convention Center in Dallas, Texas.

At the same time a group of manufacturers from Quebec attended as observers the Offshore Technical Conference, in Houston, Texas.

The Director of the Dallas Office attended the Third International Trade Conference of the Southwest held at the Southern Methodist University in the later part of May. The main speakers were the U.S. Secretary of Commerce, Mr. Elliott Richardson, and the Canadian Minister of Trade, Industry and Commerce, Mr. Donald Jamieson.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

At the invitation of the Canadian Consulate the Quebec Delegate attended a seminar to promote Canada where a minimum of one hundred Travel Agents were present.

As we are getting closer to the 1976 Olympics to be held in Montreal in July, the number of inquiries concerning this event has increased extensively.

LAFAYETTE

1) Quebec Government

The delegation hosted a meeting of the Louisiana State Department of Education, the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL), and the representatives of Québec, France and Belgium teachers in Louisiana.

At the request of Quebec's Chicago delegation, the delegation met with Reed Lewis, participating organizer for the "La Salle: Expedition II", which will retrace the voyage of Cavalier De La Salle from Canada to New Orleans.

The delegation helped NBC's Pat Dalton to gather material for the Today Show.

The delegation participated in the unveiling of a Plaque commorating Juchereau De St-Denis, a Québécois who established Natchitoches, the first French settlement west of the Mississippi River.

Later, the delegate, representing the Prime Minister, attended the inauguration of an outdoor theatre in Natchitoches featuring a play on St-Denis written by Paul Green.

The delegate was interviewed by Radio Canada, Montreal, and helped it find other interview material. Also interviewed by MacLean's, Montreal and Globe & Mail, Toronto. The delegation helped l'Office National du Film and a film crew from the University of Ottawa to gather material and sights.

The delegation received and guided the head of elementary and secondary education in the foreign section of the Quebec Government, on tour of facilities and programs.

The delegation organised a one-week mission by Quebec's Labor & Manpower Department studying modes of applications in methods of forecasting in manpower needs according to sector.

The delegate attended and participated in the annual meeting of the delegates and respective ministers held this year in New York City.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The delegation met with French Education Minister, René Haby, and attended various events in his honor. Exchange of information was had between the two parties, mostly on Quebec's and France's separate and mutual educational endeavor in Louisiana. The delegate had a private meeting with Mr. Haby and participated with him in a short-wave radio broadcast to Paris from Lafayette.

Except for the radio part, the delegation and the delegate had the same communications with the President of the French language section of the Belgium Parliament, Lucien Outers, and later with Belgium Education Minister, Antoine Humblet.

The delegation left the United States to take part in a two-day meeting with representatives of the Louisiana government to iron out details for coming mutual programs especially in education.

The delegation's educational consultant guided two federal inspectors from HEW on an evaluation tour of bilingual programs of Acadia Parish.

The delegation attended the ceremonies surrounding the visit of the President of France. It was also available to the French and Americans organizing the visit in case they should need help on any particulars. The delegate's secretary accompanied the French President's niece on a one-week advanced visit to Louisiana where she met her uncle on arrival. The delegation participated in the awarding of 15 scholarships for summer study in Jonquière, Québec.

Four administrators of the Quebec Department of Social Affairs visited a serie of group homes for the Youth in the San Francisco, Sacramento and Los Angeles areas, and met with administrators and academics active in this field of endeavour (May 30 - June 13, 1976).

Two economists for the Quebec Department of Manpower met with representatives of the University of Colorado in Boulder and University of California in San Diego, on a research project (May 20-21, 1976)

CULTURAL AFFAIRS

This Office participated to the April meeting of the Los Angeles Chapter of L'Alliance Française, organizing a program on Quebec.

Other cultural activities to which we were associated include the showing of the film "La Vraie nature de Bernadette" at UCLA on March 10 and "La Tendresse ordinaire" at the Vanguard Theater on June 8, 1976.

3. Industry and Commerce

This office assisted I.T.T. Gilfillan of Los Angeles and Boeing Corporation of Seattle in organizing procurement information seminars in Montreal, within the framework of the Canadian-American Defense Sharing Program. The I.T.T. Gilfillan seminar was held in Montreal on April 13 and the Boeing seminar on June 22.

The Deputy Minister of Industry and Commerce for Quebec, Mr. John Dinsmore visited the Los Angeles area May 26-28. Meetings were arranged with Lockheed, a group of local manufacturers interested in Quebec and representatives of the financial community.

Industrial commissioners and other people active in Industry development work, visited the Office during the period of review.

A subsidiary of Dart Industries has finalized its plan to build a new facility in Lachine during the period of review.

4. Tourism, Fish and Game

This office, in cooperation with the Canadian Government Travel Office, participated in travel seminars in Phoenix Arizona, Long Beach, Beverly Hills and Pasadena California in the period from April 15 to April 27.

A significant volume of information requests for the Olympics, and housing problems were handled by the Office.
