





Québec was present at the Probe International Seminar on future Canadian-American relations held at the World Trade Center Institute on January 19th. Mr. Bernard Landry, Minister of State for Economic Development, stated the position of his new government.

The Delegate General was a guest of James Davant, Chairman of Paine, Webber, at a luncheon in connection with the forthcoming Economic Club meeting. On January 25th, he accompanied the new Premier of Québec, the Honourable René Lévesque, on a series of private meetings in New York City. That same evening, Mr. Lévesque was guest speaker at the Economic Club dinner held at the New York Hilton.

FEBRUARY 1977

The Delegate General hosted a cocktail party on the occasion of the New York Shoe Fair.

He attended a reception at the Canadian Club hosted by the Mayor of Montreal in honour of the Montreal International Book Fair.

He attended a reception given by the Banque Canadienne National on the occasion of their official opening of an agency in New York City.

He was a guest of U.S. Senators in the House of Representatives when Prime Minister Pierre E. Trudeau addressed both Houses. He also attended the press conference given by the Prime Minister at the National Press Club.

MARCH 1977

He attended the Canadian Society of New York dinner at the Waldorf-Astoria where the Honourable Donald MacDonald, Minister of Finance in the Federal government, was the guest speaker.

He attended a reception at the Canadian Mission to the United Nations in honour of Mr. Bruce Rankin, former Canadian Consul General of New York City and presently Canadian Ambassador to Japan.

He hosted a reception at Québec House in honour of Québec exhibitors at the National Association of Men's Sportswear Buyers Show.

APRIL 1977

He escorted the Honourable Yvon Duhaime, Minister of Tourism for the Province of Québec, visiting with the travel community and hosted a reception in his honour at the Drake Hotel.

In early May, he hosted a luncheon at the Brook Club in honour of the Honourable Bernard Landry, Minister of State for Economic Development of the Province of Québec, and escorted him to a series of private meetings with Québec corporate citizens.

He escorted the Honourable Jacques Parizeau, Minister of Finance for the Province of Québec, in town for a private meeting with the Directors of the Council on Foreign Relations.

He attended a reception given by the Canadian Staff College at the Canadian Consulate General.

He attended a reception at the Canadian Consulate given by John Blackwood, Deputy Consul General, for the Canadian financial community.

He attended the Canadian Society of New York dinner at the Canadian Club where the Premier of Ontario, William Davis, was the guest speaker.

He attended a reception in honour of Marie-Claire Blais given by the Consul for Information, André Massé, at the Canadian Consulate General to introduce her to the literary community in New York City.

He attended a reception of the Loews' Hotels chain given in honour of their hotels "Le Cité" and "Le Concorde" in Montreal and Québec City respectively at Shephard's Hotel in New York City.

JUNE 1977

He met and completed arrangements with Fortune magazine for the writing of an article on Canada and Québec in particular.

He attended the première of the movie "Chagall - Colours of Love" and the reception following hosted by the Consul General of Canada.

He hosted a reception for travel agents in honour of the departing Director of Tourism, Pierre Valiquette, and his successor, Alain Fahmy.

He travelled to Washington to attend receptions given by the Canadian Ambassador.

2) Department of Intergovernmental AffairsGENERAL INFORMATIONMr. René Lévesque in New York

At the time of the visit of the Québec Prime Minister, Mr. René Lévesque, to New York, the Information Department had collected twelve (12) Press reviews from the American newspapers. It also pre-scheduled interviews with radio and television journalists, and we had registered Press attendance to the Prime Minister's address at the Economic Club of New York.

Following the Fifteenth of November Elections and Mr. Lévesque's visit to New York, a number of Press agencies and newspapers (among others The Business International, Exxon magazine, Chemical engineering, Svenska Dagbladet, The German Television) had requested documents and/or briefings on the Québec political, economic and social situation.

INSERT ITEM 11The Québec constitution

Professor Blaustein from Rutgers University, being interested in completing an additional volume to his CONSTITUTIONS TO THE COUNTRIES OF THE WORLD/ CONSTITUTIONS OF DEPENDENCIES AND SPECIAL DEPENDENCIES with a reference edition to Québec constitution had been directed to the Intergovernmental Affairs Ministry of Québec City, meeting to take place in August 3rd 1977.

The Québec economy

We have supplied the Center for Strategic and international Studies with up-to-date literature on the Québec economy and politics. Mr. Mark Jarmie from CSIS is conducting a study evaluating the strength of the Québec economy.

Language and education

A survey has been made by a master degree student of Columbia University on biculturalism and bilingualism in the Québec educational system. Our services were made available to her in order to gather data and information and to point out the possible consequences on the society.

American legislatures

For the Bureau of Interparliamentary relations of the Québec National Assembly we contacted the legislative bodies of the american border states as well as those where a Québec Delegation is established in the United States, to prepare a roster of officials representing those states.

Students exchange

New Jersey and Québec were guests of our offices and refreshments were served. Arrangements were made for a group of Pennsylvania students planning a trip to Québec. Hotel reservations were made and pre-arranged conferences were scheduled with government officials.

Québec students in New York and New Jersey

IBM Corporation in Montréal has requested that our department locate Québec students in New York and New Jersey colleges and universities to offer them job opportunities in engineering and administration upon their return in the province.

Information

Our department has been asked to give a lecture on "Québec since November 15th, 1976" at the St. Georges Campus of N.Y.U., Staten Island.

We have carried out an extensive research on the cost of transportation of crude asbestos in various parts of the world.

On request of different ministries in Québec, the Information Department has gathered data concerning laws and regulations on:

- 1) Business hours of retail stores in New York State and New York City.
- 2) Consumer protection law of 1969 in New York City.
- 3) Taxi transportation in New York City.

Due to the changes that followed the November Elections, our department has received several inquiries on the Lévesque government policies such as the Prime Minister's Inaugural Address, the Language Policy (White paper, Bill 1), governmental aid in mining exploration, Mr. Jacques Parizeau's Budget Speech. We were also given the task of negating rumours of nationalization, especially concerning the issue of asbestos mining.

As per demand of the Québec Labor Ministry, we arranged an exchange of information with the US Department of Labor.

The Department of Political and Security Council Affairs of the United Nations has shown much interest in the political evolution of Québec and we supplied them with documents pertaining to this issue.

American students made use of our literature on the political and social situation in Québec. We also have answered their questions concerning the possibilities of studies in Québec Universities.

More and more Americans of Québec origin are anxious to know their roots. We helped them in their search and further referred them to the Genealogy and Heraldry Department of Cultural Affairs Ministry. Some of them have expressed interest in establishing an association which would be entitled "Québec-United States" to intensify cultural and educational ties.

Numerous inquiries received (telephone, mail, visitors) covered various subjects such as; Eskimo art, Hydro-Québec, Highway code, job opportunities, taxes, civil code, crime rate statistics and police operations, real estate, french courses, summer camps, vacations on farms, vacations in Québec families (UNESCO programme), immigration, social programmes (old age pension, unemployment insurance, minimum wage, health insurance).

We have supplied lists of translators, manufacturers, real estate brokers, french speaking radio stations and registered canadian companies.

Documentation

During the past six months, we have acquired fifty (50) new books on the Québec social, economic, political and literary aspects - to supply the increasing demand.

During the same period, we have edited twenty-one (21) Press Reviews and twenty-one Daily Inserts which were utilized for internal use only which totals 924 in all.

We have mailed 17 copies of Québec at a glance, 125 copies of Le Québec in bref and 79 copies of Québec International.

Department of Industry and Commerce

The period under review was highlighted by the visit of our Minister of Economic Development, Mr. Bernard Landry. All activities were concentrated on meeting top industrialists, and this was accomplished through a private luncheon and dinner. In all, approximately fifty guests were entertained, and a series of one-to-one meetings were held in the offices of those with whom appointments were made.

Two very succesful fashion shows were put on at the St. Regis Hotel. Clothes were all Montreal designers lines, and attendance in total topped five hundred. One show was exclusively designed for buyers, while the second was for the fashion press.

Incoming missions included shoe manufacturers and men's sportwear cutters. Both showed at their respective industry trade shows in New York City.

With our emphasis on working with Québec exporters, the need for market studies has increased steadily. Statistics and marketing patterns are constantly being requested. In this regard the World Trade Center and the Regional Office of the U.S. Department of Commerce have proven most cooperative and helpful.

Counsellors continue their P.R. role of keeping in touch with head offices of companies operating in Québec and also maintaining contact with the financial community.

This office has also continued its usual activities in the direct-mail field.

Main activities were in the form of familiarization tours for journalists, wholesalers, travel agents and association executives a total of sixteen visits were planned and executed.

The Department also participated in ten Trade Shows throughout New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania States.

FILMS

The Department, through its distributor, Association Sterling, lent out 965 films to various schools and associations.

4 b) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game. (Atlantic South Area)

During the period covered by this report the Tourist Counsellor for the "Atlantic South" area has:

- participated in ski promotion shows and seminars (Miami, Fort Lauderdale, Tempa, Atlanta, Washington D.C. and Baltimore).
- assisted wholesale travel agencies, tour operators and automobile clubs in the preparation and marketing of travel "packages" to Québec.
- participated in several wholesalers' promotional seminars.
- assisted retail travel agencies.
- planned and organized several familiarization trips to Québec for travel agents and carriers (reservation and Tour Desk personnel).
- participated in several of such fam-tours.
- maintained a regular cooperation with the Canadian Government Office of Tourism in Washington D.C. and Atlanta. Such cooperation covered joint travel promotions, fam-tours, receptions, visits to travel agencies, seminars, etc...
- developped contacts with various associations for the promotion of Québec as a convention destination.
- coordinated several fam-trips to Québec for association executives (conventions and meetings).
- developped contacts with incentive travel specialists and several interested companies for the promotion of Québec as an "incentive travel" destination.

No tourist literature has been distributed by this office as all mailings, direct or in answer to specific requests, have been handled either by the Tourist Office of the New York area or directly from Québec by the Promotion Division of the Department of Tourism, Fish and Game.

BOSTON1) Québec Government

In May, we had the visit of the Minister of Tourism of the Province of Québec, Mr. Yves Duhaime, who met with a number of travel wholesalers and members of the press of New England who are actively involved in promoting tourism to Québec.

At the invitation of the Boston Committee on Foreign Relations, the World Affairs Council and the Worcester Committee on Foreign Relations, the Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, Mr. Claude Morin, came to Boston to address these groups and met with professors from Harvard, M.I.T. and Fletcher School of Law & Diplomacy to discuss the political situation in Québec.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The Delegation has worked in collaboration with the theatrical troupe: "Le Théâtre des Pissenlits", who performed in about fifteen towns in the New England area. These cities have a fairly important percentage of Franco-Americans. This theatre addressed itself mostly to children.

The Delegation has organized a festival of films in New England from April 12 to April 28. We have presented Québec films in the following cities; Orono, Maine, Biddeford, Maine, Amherst, Massachusetts, Boston, Massachusetts, Bridgewater, Massachusetts.

We have organized two cultural weeks where we have given conferences on Québec politics, economics, and culture. The first one was held as the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, January 19 to January 21, and the second at Orono, Maine, from March 28 to April 1.

We have also provided many high schools, colleges and Universities of New England with cultural material (mostly books) from Québec.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

During the first six months of 1977, four of our industrial prospects opened manufacturing facilities in the Province of Québec, one of which, employing 65 persons at the beginning, will be producing chains used in the Lumber industry and navigation. The second employing 10 opened an establishment in St-Jean d'Iberville transforming auto-vans and finishing the interior. The third is now manufacturing conveyor belts in Cowansville and the fourth has started production of plumbing accessories in Coaticook.

We are presently concentrating our efforts in the area of joint ventures. To this effect, we have contacted numerous companies, four of which we consider serious prospects who are about to negotiate contracts with Québec firms.

We organized in collaboration with the investment firm of Thomson & McKinnon, Auchincloss, Kohlmeyer Inc. a dinner and conference which was attended by 25 portfolio managers from New England who are large holders of Hydro-Québec and provincial bonds. Guest speaker was the Deputy Minister of Finance, Mr. Pierre Goyette, who explained the political and economic situation of the Province of Québec.

The delegate was invited to visit the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution in Woods Hole, Massachusetts, which is also operating a research center in Matamek near Seven-Islands, Qué., where more than 40 scientists are engaged in the research on salmon.

The delegate was again invited by the U.S. Department of Commerce to be one of the speakers at a World Trade Conference at Bryant College, Rhode Island, for top executives in Rhode Island and South-eastern New England, co-sponsored by the Department of Commerce, the State Department of Economic Development, R.I., the Rhode Island Chamber of Commerce World Trade Club and the U.S. Small Business Administration. The prime object of this conference was the development of export business with particular emphasis on doing business in Canada.

INSERT ITEM 11

Our commercial division conducted market research analyses and the development of marketing programs including the selection of sales representation for:

Ladders and scaffolding, custom built kitchen cabinets, records, canned meat, bakery items, do-it-yourself patio doors, electric oven, lamps and decorative mural ornaments, library shelves, wooden sculptures, guide books for tourists, trailers, canoes, woven lamp shades, snowshoes, toxedos custom made, computers, knocked-down kitchen cabinets, lawn swings, promotional give-away items, swimming pools, bowling alleys, cookies, hardwood squares, after ski boots, surgical gloves, spices.

We also promoted a number of shows in the Boston area, such as:

International Boat Show, where 3 Québec firms exhibited,
New England Boat Show
New England Sportsmen Show
Boston Gift Show
Home Show
New England Industrial Show
New England Construction Show
and the Hotel Show.

During the past six months, we assisted 32 companies who showed interest in exporting their products to the New England area. We provided assistance by either finding manufacturers representatives and/or distributors.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

Requests for information on Québec came:

- 1) via the mail --- about 450
- 2) via the telephone --- about 250
- 3) via visits to the office ---about 70
- 4) for films --- about 40.

The Tourist Sector:

- 1) Participated in cooperative advertising campaigns in two local newspapers,
- 2) Participated in fam tours for local free-lance writers, travel agents, air lines and tour operators,
- 3) Endeavoured to prepare detailed market studies on the area,
- 4) Prepared various executives' inspection tours of Québec,
- 5) Cooperated on a regular basis with the Canadian Government Office of Tourism in Boston and in New York for travel promotions and their consortium seminars,
- 6) Maintained regular contact with wholesalers and tour operators,
- 7) Organized a Marketplace for Québec (meeting where hotel representatives and tour operators get together to talk business).

DALLAS

1) Québec Government

Our Premier, Mr. René Lévesque, was invited to be one of the main speakers at the Fourth Annual International Trade Conference of the Southwest, held in May on the campus of the Southern Methodist University in Dallas. Unfortunately he was unable to accept due to a heavy schedule and previous commitments. This conference is under the auspices of many important regional industries and the Center of International Business of Dallas.

Through our office, the Mayors of the cities of Montreal and Québec have extended an invitation to the Mayor of Dallas to visit their cities at his convenience. October might be the suitable month.

INSERT ITEM 11DALLAS (CONTINUED)2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs of the newly elected Québec Government spent a day in Dallas during February. At that occasion he met with the officers of the Canadian Consulate in Dallas and the resident representatives of the various Canadian Banks in Texas.

By Order in Council the mandate of the Delegate has been extended for another year, ending June 11, 1978.

3) Department of Industry and CommerceA/ Industrial Development

The industries contacted during those first six months of the year, which are considering investing in Canada and particularly in Québec, seem to be very cautious. The economic and political situations appear to be their main concern. Unless the greatest portion of their market is found in Québec, companies are inclined to look more closely toward other parts of Canada for their proposed Canadian manufacturing operations.

During this last semester we have been in touch with fifteen companies that might consider a location in Québec for their Canadian plant. Twenty-four files have been reactivated. The Delegate undertook five business trips in the territory assigned to the Dallas office.

One company with headquarters in New Orleans, LA., has decided to open an office in Québec City. An eventual investment of a couple of million dollars is involved.

Another company from Arkansas, supplier to the paper industry, is seriously considering setting-up a plant in Québec. The president will be visiting our Province again in July to meet with the provincial and federal authorities before making his final decision. This could mean an investment of approximately one million dollars.

We have accompanied the exploration and Production Manager of SOQUIP (Société Québécoise d'Initiatives Pétrolières) in a tour in Louisiana and Texas of some oil and gas companies to discuss with them the undertaking of explorations within Québec. Negotiations will be pursued with the companies that have shown a certain interest.

The holding company of an asbestos mine in Québec, located in Florida, is considering the expansion of its operations.

A medical group who owns some fifteen weight-reducing clinics in Florida is contemplating opening-up similar establishments in Québec, starting within the city of Montreal. The director has already visited our Metropolis twice and a decision should be taken shortly.

B/ Trade Promotion

Under the sponsorship of our Federal Government, many Québec manufacturers have participated in the following shows and exhibitions in our territory during the last six months: Southern Furniture Show in High Point, NC - Offshore Technology Conference, in Houston, TX.

During March '77 manufacturers from Québec, sponsored by the Québec Department of Industry and Commerce, participated in the National Home Center Exhibition in New Orleans, LA, and the Exhibition of Manufacturing Services in Atlanta, GA.

The Delegate attended the exhibitions of the National Association of Home Builders and the Supermarket Institute Show both held at the Dallas Convention Center, in May.

INSERT ITEM 11DALLAS (CONTINUED)

The participation of Québec to those various shows was generally satisfactory to our exhibitors.

With the cooperation of our Department of Industry and Commerce a trip to Montreal was arranged for a fur buyer of a large Department Store in Texas.

We invited a buyer of an important antique dealer's shop in Dallas, to visit Montreal in order to explore our market for various antiques. His trip has been set for the month of July '77.

Negotiations are underway between some American and Québec companies for licensing contracts in our Province. We are hopeful that this type of business arrangements will be profitable for everyone concerned.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

American Airlines has inaugurated in January a direct flight between Dallas and Montreal. The Delegate was invited to attend different promotional meetings held with Travel Agents at that occasion. The tourist attractions of Montreal and the Winter sports in Québec were discussed with the guests. He also attended a Seminar for the promotion of skiing in Canada, organized by the Canadian Government Office of Tourism.

Because of this exposure of the tourist attractions of Québec to different groups of Travel Agencies, the number of requests for information on our Province is increasing constantly.

We are in touch with a few companies interested in holding their future convention in Québec, however, because of the U.S. regulations on conventions expenditures, the interest of the American companies in general has greatly diminished.

LOS ANGELES1) Québec Government

A Parliamentary Mission of the Québec National Assembly under the leadership of the Honourable Robert Burns, House Leader and Minister of State for Parliamentary Reform, visited with the Fair Political Practive Commission in Sacramento on February 10, 1977.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Assistance was provided to 17 Stanford University fellows of the School of Journalism in their planning of a trip to Québec, and various encounters with government and press representatives.

Information on the California Occupational Safety and Health Act was obtained for the Ministry of State for Social Development.

Information was provided on the Charter of the French Language (Bill 1) to R. Soble of the Los Angeles Times and Jeff Jarvis of the San Francisco Examiner, two journalists writing on the topic.

The first Québec Film Festival in the United States, was held in Los Angeles from May 11 through June 22. Six Québec films including "La Vraie Nature de Bernadette", Eliza's Horoscope and "Les Ordres" were shown during the 6 week period.

Seminars organized jointly by the Canadian Consulate in San Francisco and this office was held on April 30th for the Association of French Teachers of California.

INSERT ITEM 113) Department of Industry and Commerce

The following trade development activities were initiated or supported by this office:

- A sale mission of 5 metal working and machining companies from Québec, met with a total of 26 California companies, from June 5 through 10th.
- Continuing assistance was provided to defense contractors and sub contractors, on their Canadian sourcing efforts.
- Assistance to Québec manufacturers in their marketing efforts on the U.S. West Coast with emphasis during the past 6 month period, on food products, contract furniture, fashion goods and other industrial products purchased through international engineering firms.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

This office provided assistance to the producers of the Dorothy Hamill at the Québec Winter Carnival Show, shown on the Television Network "ABC" last March 2nd.

The Minister of Tourism, The Honourable Yves Duhaime visited Los Angeles on a brief fact finding trip on May 1st. Meetings and receptions were arranged with local representatives of the travel community.

LAFAYETTE1) Québec Government

The Québec Delegation participated in four (4) meetings with the Louisiana State Department of Education, the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL) and the representatives of Franch, Belgium and Québec at which meetings were discussed the action and the role of the educational consultants towards the work done by the foreign teachers of French in Louisiana.

The Québec Delegation had several meetings with the Louisiana State Department of Education and the authorities of the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL) to discuss and plan exchanges in the educational and cultural fields between Québec and Louisiana.

The Québec Delegation organized through Michel Robitaille, Québec Resource teacher, a French week in Lake Charles. On this occasion, the Québec Delegation provided the general public with documentation, pamphlets and touristic information on Québec.

The Delegation attended the reception honoring the Canadian Ambassador to the United States.

The Québec Delegate received and had a friendly reunion with Mr. Jacques Cousineau, Consultant to the Canadian Embassy in Washington.

The Delegation helped two crews of Radio Canada and one crew of CTV (Canadian Television Network) to gather material for their shows.

The Delegate, Jules Poisson, was interviewed by Radio Canada (radio) Montreal for the programs "Present" and "Aux Vingt Heures" and by Radio Canada (TV) Québec. He also was interviewed by the Montreal Star, Toronto Globe and Mail and CKVL-Radio, Montreal.

INSERT ITEM 11LAFAYETTE (CONTINUED)2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The Delegation and other Québec officials held their annual meeting with representatives of the Louisiana government to iron out details of the different mutual programs for the coming year.

At this meeting, the Louisiana and Québec officials inaugurated a new program for young Louisianians to have a four-week stay in french-speaking families in Québec. This summer 30 young Louisianians will participate.

The Delegation organized and piloted in Louisiana two representatives of the College of Jonquièrre on a one-week mission in order to recruit participants and give the details of a four-week study program of French to be held at the college this summer.

The Delegation helped in the organization of a one-week mission to Québec for representatives of Louisiana State University to work out the details of a four-week study program at LSU in Baton Rouge for 100 Québec teachers of English.

The Delegation organized a two-day visit to Louisiana of Mr. Claude Morin, Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs Department of the Québec Government whose objectives were to study the Québec representation in the Southern States.

The Québec Delegation organized and piloted a one-week mission for Mr. Jacques Plante, Director of Exploration and Production, of the Société Québécoise d'Initiatives Pétrolières (SOQUIP) to New Orleans, Lafayette, Lake Charles and Houston to promote interest from independents in oil field and exploration in Québec.

The Delegate attended and participated in the annual meeting of the Québec delegates held this year in Québec City.

The Delegation hosted a reception for the arrival in Louisiana of the group of "La Salle: Expedition 11" from Chicago which was a bicentennial project and was retracing the voyage of Robert Cavalier Sieur De La Salle from Québec to New Orleans.

The educational consultant, Marcel Gaudreau, visited periodically the principals of the elementary and secondary schools where were stationed our Québec teachers of French to see how the program is doing, to help, assist and advise our teachers in their work and to maintain good relations in the milieu. He also had several meetings with the officials of the local parish school board.

The educational consultant participated in Québec to the selection of the new group of teachers of French for the coming school year 1977-78.

The Delegate participated in the awarding of 15 scholarships for the summer study program in Jonquièrre, Québec. These scholarships were awarded at the meeting of the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE).

The Delegation participated in the ceremonies for the unveiling of three Louisiana historical markers in French in Lake Charles, New Iberia and Donaldsonville.

The educational consultant in collaboration with teachers from Québec and Belgium and Louisianians had adapted a Louisianian fairy tale into a play. This play was presented approximately ten times in the French-speaking communities of Southwestern Louisiana.

INSERT ITEM 11LAFAYETTE (CONTINUED)

The educational consultant in collaboration with four teachers from Québec had formed a musical ensemble. They performed at different cultural events in Louisiana throughout the year and toured the elementary schools of Lafayette Parish at the end of the school year. The show featured folk songs from Louisiana and Québec.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

The Delegate had several meetings and discussions with Mr. Alfred Dansereau, Delegate in Dallas, for the collaboration of work and future meetings with Dansereau's contacts on the Louisiana territory in that field.

The Delegate met and had discussions with the commercial counsellor of the French Government stationed in New Orleans, Mr. Jean-Pierre LeVallois.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

The Delegation answered several requests from Louisianians wishing to go to Québec in sending them literature, pamphlets and other touristic information.

The Delegation also transmitted several touristic information through the Louisiana Tourist Commission in Baton Rouge for numerous Quebecers wishing to visit Louisiana.

CHICAGO1) Québec Government

During the first 6 months of 1977 two newly elected ministers chose to visit the Chicago region, and the office helped coordinate these trips. In January the Minister of Industry and Commerce, Rodrigue Tremblay, visited Cleveland and Chicago. He met with some 30 members of the business community, as well as with prominent publishers, in Cleveland. In Chicago he addressed a seminar organized by Northwestern University and attended by some 150 bankers and businessmen. In April Yves Duhaime, Minister of Tourism, visited Chicago and the office organized tours of convention facilities in Chicago and hosted a luncheon in his honor attended by some 40 key members of the travel industry. The office helped organize a week-long tour of law enforcement facilities and resources in Michigan for 2 members of the Québec Police Institute. The office was also involved in the planning of the ceremonies surrounding the successful conclusion of the LaSalle Expedition II (Québec's official bicentennial project). The director of the office represented Québec at a seminar on Canadian-U.S. relations organized by the Canadian Consulate in Kansas City, Missouri.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The office continued to provide assistance to students interested in doing research on the Province or in taking courses in Québec. Members of the staff spoke to student groups in two area high schools. As part of the office's continuing involvement in Northwestern University's Canadian Studies Program, the director of the office was instrumental in persuading the Québec Dept. of Intergovernmental Affairs to award scholarships for summer study in Québec to 2 students enrolled in the program. He also met with Québec M.P. Richard Guay who gave a lecture at Northwestern in the context of this program. The office assisted two Québec artists, whose works were exhibited at the Canadian Consulate and in a prestigious local art fair. The director of the office worked with the Illinois Historical Society on projects involving early French Canadian influence in the Illinois Territory.

INSERT ITEM 11CHICAGO (CONTINUED)3) Department of Industry & Commerce

During the first 6 months of 1977, the office worked closely with 8 companies who are seriously contemplating manufacturing investments in Québec. One company is planning to open a plant in St-Laurent. In the field of joint ventures the economic counsellors worked with 6 U.S. companies interested in some form of association with Québec companies and with 2 Québec firms who are looking for partners. The office also represented the Province at the World Fair for Technology Exchange, which brought together companies and countries interested in buying and selling technology. Several leads were passed on to the Division of Industrial Accords in Montréal. The director of the office participated in business seminars on Canada sponsored by the Chicago Council on Foreign Relations, the Bank of Montréal, (Chicago) and the Bank of Nova Scotia (Cleveland). He also addressed a conference of businessmen organized by the Mercantile Bank of St. Louis.

The commercial officers organized Québec's participation in 2 major shows which engendered over \$200,000 in sales for the 12 participating companies. The office also coordinated 2 technical missions which brought 12 Québec companies to the Midwest to learn about the market and technology in their sectors. The Commercial officers worked closely with 15 Québec companies seeking to penetrate the Midwest market, and evaluated various ways of capturing a share of the growing women's apparel market in Chicago for Québec manufacturers. The permanent showroom for Québec contract furniture continued to generate sales for the 4 participating companies.

4) Department of Tourism

During the first 6 months of 1977 the Québec Office of Tourism has worked with American Airlines to help promote its new Chicago-Montréal route, and with Travel Systems International, a Chicago wholesaler now offering package tours to Québec. A familiarization tour for 45 travel agents was organized to acquaint them with these new services. Another familiarization tour in collaboration with Air France was planned for 6 travel writers.

In the spring the tourism counsellor attended several consortia and travel trade shows in order to acquaint travel agents with Québec's tourist attractions. To further promote the Province the office sent out a newsletter and a list of tourism publications to over 900 travel agencies. This mailing resulted in more than 300 requests for additional information.

The tourism counsellor continued his efforts to develop close contacts with companies in the field of motivation and incentive travel. He attended Canada Day promoted by E.F. MacDonald, and organized a familiarization tour to Québec for members of Maritz's sales force.

The office's ongoing efforts to interest wholesalers in Province of Québec tours bore additional fruit when Cartan, a major wholesaler, included Québec in its itinerary. A Cartan executive is currently touring the Province under the auspices of the office.


