

MARCEL BERGERON (New York)

Under the authority of the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs, the Delegate General in New York :

1. Officially represents the Government of Québec, its departments and affiliated organizations.
2. Plans, coordinates and directs all the activities of the Québec Government House.
3. Establishes and maintains close ties between the people of Québec and their American neighbors with a view of promoting business, financial and cultural contacts on a mutual basis.
4. Promotes two-way trade between Québec and U.S.A. as a whole, and assists American industries in manufacturing their products in Québec.

JEAN-MARC BLONDEAU (New York)

Under the authority of the Delegate General in New York :

1. Individual contacts with representatives of various organizations and sectors on the territory of our office (mainly New York), interested in Québec affairs : press, business and finance, university, members of Foundations (Council on Foreign Relations, World Peace Foundation, etc).

2. Participation in organizing visits to New York City by Ministers from Québec: Mr. Claude Morin, Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs (Sept. 29-Oct. 1); Mr. Jacques Parizeau, Minister of Finance (Oct. 27).

3. Organization of Québec missions to New York, mostly to the United Nations :

- Visit by members of Québec National Assembly, representing all parties, to the United Nations headed by its president Mr. Clément Richard, under the auspices of the International Association of French-speaking parliamentarians.
- Appointments at UN secretariat and missions for Mr. Yves Michaud, Québec Delegate to international organizations (sept. 11-17).
- Visit to UN Secretariat TV facilities by Québec Government specialists appointed to study the possibility of televised debates in Québec National Assembly.

4. Contacts with various departments at the UN secretariat and in affiliated organizations in order to get documentation, to organize visits (see above) and participation of Québec specialists to UN conferences and programs, etc. - Contacts with Canadian and other missions to the UN (mainly French-speaking) to get appointments for Québec visitors.

5. Relations with Canadian government, business and press representatives in New York and Washington DC : Canadian Embassy, Canadian Consulate General, Canadian Broadcasting Corporation/Radio Canada, etc.

6. A representative of the Québec Government House attended in Washington DC a concert of the Québec Symphonic Orchestra - he met on that occasion the Deputy Director of the Canadian Office, State Department, Mr. Carl Clement.

7. A representative from the Québec Government House attended the Seminar on U.S.-Canada relations at Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass.

8. Contacts with two public relations agencies in view of possible use by the Québec Government of such agency in a future public relations program in the United States (not yet implemented).

9. Presentation of the activities of our office to groups of students from Québec.

2) Department of Intergovernmental AffairsINFORMATION

The high volume of queries, special requests and expressions of astonishment which followed the November 1976 elections in Québec has greatly subsided. Hence, the flow and nature of information handled by this department has somewhat returned to normal.

INSERT ITEM 11Québec politics and economy

We received a good number of requests for documentation regarding the language Act (Bill 101) and its effects on publicity or advertizing, the Parti Québécois platform and ministerial statements. Banks, Hydro-Québec, the settlement arrived at between the Québec Government and the native populations of James Bay, the general state of the economy and investment possibilities in Québec pretty well sum up our information activity in this matter.

Legal documents and related information

We get a steady flow of inquiries about regulations governing marriage, divorce, death and birth certificates, drivers' licences, wills, health insurance, social security, income tax forms, real estate and school taxes, transactions, maritime and railway transportation, crime rates and police forces, travel documents (immigration and customs).

Education, Arts and Culture

This area proves to be extremely popular. We get questions on Québec's education system and institutions and the possibilities of learning French as a second language there. Information is sought on students exchanges, genealogical societies of interest to Franco-Americans, summer camps and vacations on farms and/or in families, museums, artistic events, artists, folklore, crafts and French-Canadian cuisine.

Relations with the press

The fourth estate sometimes seeks official statements, statistics and photographs for the preparation of articles, or requests to be put in contact with the competent department in order to obtain an interview.

As much as possible, we try to oblige those asking for telephone numbers and/or addresses of Québec concerns, weather information, legal holidays and related matters.

Among lists which we have out are those of registered Canadian companies, translators, Québec Universities and a partial list of book stores.

Documentation

In the latter half of 1977, we acquired twenty-six (26) new books on the socio-economic, political and artistic activity taking place in Québec.

During the period under review, we edited, for the exclusive use of our personnel, 21 press reviews. The practice of Daily Inserts was dropped along the way.

We mailed 14 copies of Québec at a Glance and 139 copies of Le Québec en Bref.

INSERT ITEM 113) Department of Industry and Commerce

The period just ending was highlighted by the Québec day in Atlantic City on August 25th. This event was intended to promote the Province of Québec image in a well known area to Québec vacationers.

During a full day, one could see advertisement on Québec throughout Atlantic City. A dinner followed by a fashion show was given and prominent public figures from Atlantic City and neighboring cities were featured as guests of honor.

In conjunction with the Québec Department of Industry and Commerce, our office was instrumental in making the National Shoe Show and overwhelming success. This event was held at the New York Collesseum from October 6th to the 9th. In addition, we also participated in the NAMSB Show which took place at the Statler Hotel in New York from Oct. 16 to 19th. Seven Québec men's sportwear manufacturers displayed their spring and summer lines. At the Food Brokers Show - Dec. 2nd to 7th, five Québec firms in the food business exhibited their products at the Drake Hotel, a few blocks from the main exhibition.

We also have, during this period of time, visited several trade shows, attended receptions at the Canadian Consulate, the Canadian Club and spent some time frequenting the premises of Canadian and U.S. Banks, U.S. financial and management consultants.

We have also answered much correspondence and phone calls from either U.S. or Canadian Corporations and citizens. This has led us to provide market studies and soliciting data from U.S. governmental agencies and from the private sector and cooperation has always been prompt and cordial.

The continuance of close contacts with U.S. Corporations having branch plant or offices in Québec has been adhered to as usual.

4a) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game (New York Area)Principal function

To establish contacts and maintain relations with the representatives of the travel industry and the public in general in the States of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania, with the sole aim of promoting tourism to Québec.

- lent out, through its distributor Association Sterling, 532 films which were shown to various audiences totalling 80,523 persons.
- participated in five ski seminars under the auspices of the Canadian Government Office of Tourism of New York. The CGOT field offices were responsible for the invitations sent to 628 travel agents operating in the New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania States.

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INSERT ITEM 11

- Provided assistance, in cooperation with the CGOT, regarding familiarization trips for travel agents. These inspection tours of Montréal, Québec City and the Laurentians were done in co-participation with tour wholesalers such as : Academia Ltd, Amtrack, Canaplan, Leisure Packages, Moreno Tours, Pathmark Tours, Peak Escort Tours, Summit Ski Travel, Teachers' Tours, Wider Horizons Project and Yankee Holidays. Our participation was to coordinate the sightseeing activities in the Province of Québec.
- In cooperation with Amtrack and Loews Hotel, one of our counsellors have accompanied a group of travel writers to Montréal and Québec.
- Maintained contacts with the Society of American Travel Writers.
- Entertained relations with 64 tour operators and wholesalers in an effort to develop tour packages to Montréal, Québec and major ski resorts.
- Developed contacts with various associations for the promotion of Québec as a convention destination. In this regard, brochures were mailed to 450 professional associations and two groups were invited to Montréal and Québec for inspection purposes.
- Attended one ski symposium intended for consumers in the State of New Jersey.
- Assisted Amtrack and Yankee Holidays, an American tour wholesaler, during 3 breakfast seminars promoting tourism through mass transportation.

This office is now in the process of organizing different packages to Québec and Montréal for wholesalers interested in youth and senior citizen groups.

4b) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game (Atlantic South Area)

During the period covered by this report, the Tourist Counsellor for the above named has :

- developed contacts with associations for the promotion of Québec as a meeting and convention destination.
- participated in travel promotion shows and seminars in Baltimore, Washington, Miami, Fort Lauderdale, Jacksonville and Charlotte N.C.
- given assistance to Tour Operators, wholesale Travel Agencies and Automobile Clubs in the preparation and marketing of travel packages and tours to Québec.
- assisted Travel Agencies (wholesale and retail) in their travel promotion to Québec.
- organized several familiarization trips to Québec for travel agents and airline personnel (tour and reservation desks).
- also coordinated several such fam-trips to Québec for association executives and incentive travel specialists.
- attended the 1977 Congress of the American Society of Association executives in Phoenix, Ariz. (November) as well as the Incentive Travel Show in Chicago (November).
- maintained a regular cooperation with the Canadian Government Office of Tourism in Atlanta and Washington DC for the purpose of joint travel promotions, fam-trips, receptions, seminars, etc.

INSERT ITEM 11BOSTON1) Québec Government

The Québec Government having an active interest in the hydro-electric project, Dickey Lincoln in Maine sent several representatives of its Lands & Forests Department in Boston whom we accompanied to consult with the US Corps of Engineers. In order to make Congress aware of our Government's reactions, we will arrange further meetings with representatives of various other departments who will be involved to enable them to analyze any negative effects and present their comments.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The Delegation has participated in the White Mountains Festival for the Arts in New Hampshire during the month of August. Two Québec sculptors were invited to the workshop. We provided interested people with information on different aspects of the culture of Québec.

The Delegation presented a group of musicians "Claude Gervaise" at the "Congrès de la Fédération Féminine Franco-Américaine" held on November 5th in Boston.

In July, the delegate represented Québec at the Franco-American Festival in Lewiston, Maine.

We also participated in other events such as the New England Library Association book-show in Sturbridge, Massachusetts, on December 25, 26 and 27 and the Harvard seminars on Canada-U.S. relations.

Besides attending these events, we also provided New England high schools, colleges and universities with cultural information such as books and educational films on Québec.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

During the last six months, we continued our efforts to interest companies to either establish a manufacturing base in Québec or to consider joint ventures. Out of 3 projects, one has retained our attention.

We gave assistance to two Québec companies who are interested in acquiring American companies in the New England area. To this effect, the delegate spent considerable time in locating companies receptive to this endeavour. Although a final decision has not been made as yet, two American companies are seriously being considered for acquisition.

Our Commercial Division has in the past six months concentrated their efforts on developing market programs and findings sales representatives or distributors in various categories such as :

Pre-fabricated refrigerated warehouses, street sweeping & cleaning equipment, ventilating & air conditioning equipment, overhead bridge & gantry cranes, manual and electric chain hoists, non-ferrous processors, wire extrusions, winter booties & leather slippers, insulating material with polysterene base, decorative lucite objects, school furniture, low-bed chassis, dump trailer, custom made kitchen cabinets, gourmet kitchen woodenware, stainless steel cooking utensils, flower pots, dry cod fish, electric heating equipment for home and industry, printing equipment, Indian art gifts, wooden sculptures, cookies, confectionery, yoghurt making machine, wooden discs, cheese, wine.

We helped to promote various shows that had any commercial interest such as :

The Boston Gift Show which was again attended by several Québec companies; 14 participants displayed their goods.

The Recreational Vehicle & Van Conversion Show.

The Newport International Sailboat Show.

38 Québec companies showed an interest in exporting to the New England area. We did and are still assisting quite a number of them. Most of them were interested in finding a representative or a distributor. One large Montréal company opened an office in Boston and is now distributing its goods throughout the United States. One company is now affiliated with a Rhode Island company, and they are planning to start distributing their product soon.

We are in the process of assisting in the formation of a company to facilitate, at a low cost to the manufacturer, the exportation of Canadian apparel into the retail market. It is oriented to bring to the American retailer the chance of greater profitability by means of an alternative to the promotionally minded American brand names.

A mission of Québec manufacturers of products for the building supply industry came to Boston in November. During their stay they toured New England and visited more than 42 American companies. The mission was prepared so that Québec and New England manufacturers could compare their respective products and come up with a more efficient line of material.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

During the last six months of 1977, the Tourist Sector :

- participated in cooperative advertising campaigns with three major city newspapers promoting both Montréal and Québec as vacation destination.
- was instrumental in assisting Crimson Travel Service, one of the most important wholesalers in the area, and Tri-Rep Incentives to put together a Carnival program for the first time.
- made all the arrangements for press coverage of the visit to Boston of Bonhomme Carnaval, the official representative of the Québec Carnival, who came to promote skiing in Québec at the New England Ski Show.
- participated in fam tours for local writers, travel agents, and tour operators.
- put together a newsletter, a first for this office, which detailed the Québec tours of local tour operators as well as the new Montréal Snowball program.
- succeeded in establishing a financial assistance program for two major local wholesalers.
- cooperated on a regular basis with the Canadian Government Office in New York and in Boston for travel promotions and their consortium.

- participated in several local Travel Shows.
- maintained regular contact with wholesalers and tour operators.

The Tourist Sector experienced a change of personnel as the Director of Tourism was transferred to Québec in August. His replacement had been working in a comparable position in Chicago for the past four years.

CHICAGO1) Québec Government

Québec participation in the Premium and Incentive Show brought to Chicago the Québec Minister of Tourism, Yves Duhaime. The office organized a dinner for some 85 officials in the incentive travel industry at which Mr. Duhaime made a presentation on Québec's new incentive travel manual.

The delegate helped arrange and coordinate the participation of 5 members (including the president) of the Québec National Assembly in the National Conference of U.S. State Legislators, and assisted in the follow-up of contacts made on that occasion.

The office set up appointments for 4 members of the Mayor's Council of suburban Montréal with a similar organisation in St Paul, Minnesota.

The office also coordinated the visit of 2 officials of the Québec Department of Agriculture to the American Meat Institute Show in Chicago.

The office researched the Illinois Occupational Safety and Health Act on behalf of the Secretary of State for Social Development and the purchasing policies of the U.S. states in the Midwest on behalf of the Deputy Minister of Industry and Commerce.

The delegate visited the principle U.S. meeting and convention centers and made a report to the Department of Tourism in connection with the feasibility studies for the Montréal meeting center.

In the area of press relations, the office nominated an influential local journalist to go on a tour of Québec organized by the Department of Industry and Commerce which included discussions with prominent members of the Government. The office also submitted names of editorial writers from midwestern newspapers who attended the National Conference of Editorial Writers, in order to help support Prime Minister Lévesque's address to that meeting.

The delegate and industrial counsellor represented Québec at a conference organized by the Chicago Chamber of Commerce on "What's ahead for Canadian-U.S. economic relations".

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The office continues to support the Canadian Studies program at Northwestern University and to assist individual students doing research on specific areas of Québec society and government.

The office also had assisted the producers of a French-language radio program in Chicago in obtaining taped material from Québec suitable for use on the program.

INSERT ITEM 11

The office answered numerous inquiries about the new language legislation and sent copies of Bill 101 to ten companies which requested them.

The office helped arrange and promote Québec's entrance into a prestigious local film festival.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

During the last six months of 1977, the office worked with two companies which plan manufacturing investments in Québec. The industrial counsellor coordinated trips to Québec for these companies, where they met with representatives of the Montréal Urban Community to discuss sites for their plants. Ten new industrial files were opened during the six-month period.

In the area of licensing and joint ventures, the industrial counsellor worked with fifteen U.S. companies looking for Québec licensees, as well as with Québec companies seeking U.S. partners. Several of these companies are pursuing discussions concerning possible association.

The commercial counsellors organized Québec's participation in three major trade shows which brought 16 companies to Chicago where they opened new markets. They also helped promote a national show held in New York in which 8 Québec companies participated.

They attended shows in the sectors of food, clothing, furniture, electronics, automobile parts and giftware in order to evaluate their potential for Québec and make contact with agents and buyers in these various fields.

The commercial counsellors also worked with 30 Québec companies interested in exporting to the Midwest and carried out market or product research in the fields of knockdown furniture, food packaging, and wood pulp substitutes.

The commercial counsellors both made learning trips to Québec in order to increase their knowledge of certain regions and products sectors.

The office coordinated a technical mission which brought 8 manufacturers to the Triple Engineering Show and acquainted them with opportunities in this field (materials, hydraulic equipment, power systems).

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

A new tourist counsellor was appointed (replacing the previous one who was transferred to Boston), and spent the early part of the six month period getting acquainted with individuals and organizations in the travel industry with whom he will be working. The tourist counsellor participated in 10 travel agents' seminars held in cities covered by the Chicago office, at which some 1500 agents were exposed to what Québec has to offer in this field.

In order to further familiarize agents with Québec's tourist attractions, the tourist counsellor helped organize three fam tours which brought over 100 Midwest travel agents to Québec. Another fam tour was organized for the administrative personnel of E.F. McDonald, one of the leaders in the incentive travel field.

The office replied to inquiries and distributed literature to both the public and the trade, and also made special mailings of ski brochures to travel agents.

INSERT ITEM 11DALLAS1) Québec Government

The Center of International Business of Dallas, responsible for the organization of the Fifth Annual International Trade Conference of the Southwest to be held in Houston, Texas, in April 1978, approached us to inquire if the Premier of Québec would accept an invitation to be one of the main speakers during the Conference. Unfortunately, after contacting the authorities in Québec, we found out that our Premier was not available on the date of the Conference.

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Invited by the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs, a newspaper man from Forth Worth, Texas, spent a few days in Québec during October, visiting Department Heads and meeting Deputy Ministers and Ministers of different Departments in our Government. Included also in the program were a visit to the James Bay project, the Olympic site and meetings with business people.

Our delegation held a reception for about 100 people at the beginning of June as a goodwill gesture and to celebrate Québec National Day.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

- a) A company from Arkansas has decided to establish in Trois-Rivières to manufacture metal wire cloth and plastic fabrics for the pulp and paper industry as well as the asbestos industry. The investment involved is approximately one million dollars.

A manufacturer from Oklahoma has opened a Sales Office in Montréal. They manufacture different types of trenchers.

During the past six months, we were in contact with twenty-six companies that have shown an interest in establishing manufacturing in Québec. Forty files have been reactivated.

The delegate undertook five business trips in his territory. He also attended two seminars on "Investment in Canada" sponsored by the Canadian Consulate in Dallas. These seminars were held in Houston and Dallas, Texas. In October, he represented the Department of Industry and Commerce at the Fall meeting of the Industrial Development Research Council in San Antonio, Texas.

Early December, the delegate went to Québec for a meeting of the economic counsellors abroad, sponsored by the Department of Industry and Commerce.

b) Trade promotion

A Québec manufacturer of boats and canoes participated in the Southwest Boat Show held in August, in Dallas, Texas.

Sponsored by the Federal Department of Trade and Commerce, five Québec furniture manufacturers participated in the Fall session of the Southern Furniture Show held in High Point, N.C.

During this last 1st semester many Québec manufacturers visited our office in search of representatives to handle their products in this territory. We were able to introduce them to reliable reps with whom most of them concluded some mutually profitable agreements.

INSERT ITEM 114) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

Because of the Intensified publicity and advertising by Air-Canada, American Airlines and Delta Airlines of their regular flights to Montréal, tourist inquiries directed to our office are increasing constantly.

The delegate has attended in the past six months, four meetings pertaining to the promotion of Tourism in Canada sponsored either by the Canadian Government Office of Tourism or some of the Airlines. Such exposure usually prompts multiple requests for tourist information on Québec, even though tourism is not a main function of this office.

The Southwest surely seems to have an interesting potential in that field of activity and gradually Québec is taking its share of it.

LAFAYETTE1) Québec Government

The Québec delegation hosted four meetings for the Louisiana State Department of Education, the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL), and the representatives of France, Belgium and Québec at which meetings were discussed the action and the role of the educational consultants towards the work done by the foreign teachers of French in Louisiana.

The Delegate, Jules Poisson, met with Mr. Louis Robichaud, Canadian Senator and former Prime Minister of New Brunswick and members of the International Relations Association of Acadiana (TIRAA) to discuss closer relationship and friendship between these states and the two countries.

The Québec delegation helped a crew of Canadian Broadcasting Corporation with contacts for interviews and also to gather materials for their show.

The Delegate was interviewed by Mr. Walter Stewart, Journalist for the "Maclean Magazine".

The Québec Delegation participated in the ceremonies for the unveiling of two Louisiana historical bilingual markers in Houma and in Jennings.

Mr. Robert Burns, Minister of State for Parliamentary Reform participated in the annual meeting of the National and Municipal League in New Orleans in early December. The Québec delegation took that opportunity to give a luncheon where Mr. Burns discussed the present political situation in Québec. The guests were Louisiana politicians including the Attorney General, William Guste, journalists and heads of Political Science Department of Louisiana universities.

Following the visit of Minister Burns, the Delegate, Jules Poisson, was interviewed by TV-3 Lafayette on the role of Québec in Louisiana and the different programs of cooperation.

The Québec delegation gave its assistance to a Canadian university team directed by Dr. Gerry Gold, Professor of Anthropology at York University. This group is conducting a study on the survival of the ethnic group, the Cajun in Louisiana. This study is sponsored by the Ford Foundation and the Canadian Art Council.

INSERT ITEM 112) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The Québec delegation in Lafayette participated in and helped in the organization of a four-week study program at Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge for 100 Québec teachers of English.

The Québec delegation also participated in and helped the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL) and the Louisiana State Department of Education in Baton Rouge in the selection of second language specialists and young students (80 participants in all) to attend a four-week program of French held at the CEGEP de Jonquière in the Province of Québec.

The Québec delegation also helped in the organization of a new program where 30 young Louisianians spent four weeks in French-speaking Québec families.

The Québec delegation participated in a three-day training program held at Capitol House Hotel in Baton Rouge for its 40 French teachers which was organized by the Louisiana State Department of Education and CODOFIL which was following an intensive training program held in Cap Rouge, Québec.

The Québec delegation had several meetings with the Louisiana State Department of Education and the authorities of the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL) to discuss exchange in the educational field between Québec and Louisiana.

Our educational consultant, Marcel Gaudreau, visited periodically the principals of the elementary and secondary schools where are stationed our Québec teachers of French (40) to see how the program is doing, to help, assist and advise our teachers in their work and to maintain good relations in the milieu.

Mr. Pierre Duguay, International Cooperation of the Québec Department of Intergovernmental Affairs came to Louisiana in late October to have preliminary discussions with the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL) and the Louisiana State Department of Education in the different field of cooperation which will be discussed at the Québec-Louisiana annual meeting to be held in February.

Dr. Jack Guilbert and Dr. Galler of Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge (Extra-mural teaching) were sent to Québec in November to plan and organize with the Québec Government a new summer study program of French, civilization and history, for students of Louisiana State University.

Mr. Michael Hébert, Supervisor of Bilingual Education for the State Department of Education went to Québec accompanied by our Educational Consultant, Mr. Marcel Gaudreau, to plan and organized a summer program at Laval University, Québec, for second language specialists from Louisiana (40).

During the month of November, the Québec delegation organized a tour for two folk singers from Québec, Jim Corcoran and Bertrand Gosselin. They gave a series of twelve concerts in Louisiana high schools and universities.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

The Louisiana territory for the Department of Trade and Commerce is under the responsibility of the Québec Delegate in Dallas, Mr. Alfred Dansereau.

The Québec delegation continued to give its help and assistance to Mr. Dansereau when needed especially with a Louisiana company which is importing from Québec some "terra jet" (small vehicle for marsh land).

The Delegate met and had discussions with the commercial counsellor of the French Government stationed in New Orleans, Mr. Jean-Pierre Levallois.

The Delegate also met with Mr. Witnell of the Chamber of Commerce in New Orleans.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

The Québec delegation was invited to attend and participated in a seminar organized for foreigners and local agents by the Louisiana Tourist Commission.

The delegation answered several requests from Louisianians wishing to go to Québec in sending them literature, pamphlets and other touristic information on our Province.

The delegation also transmitted several touristic information through the Louisiana Tourist Commission in Baton Rouge for numerous Québecers wishing to visit Louisiana.

LOS ANGELES1) Québec Government

2) Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, the Honourable Claude Morin visited California from November 17 through November 27.

Mr. Morin met with the Committee on Foreign Relations in San Francisco and Los Angeles, the Commonwealth Club in San Francisco and Town Hall in Los Angeles, a group of students at Stanford University and the Press in both cities.

A representative of the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs participated to the American Council on Teaching of Foreign Languages and the American Association of French Teachers meeting held in San Francisco on November 21-27.

This office participated at a seminar on Canadian Affairs at the Colorado College in Colorado Springs in July.

3) Department of Industry and Commerce

The Office piloted a sales mission to California from October 2 through the 7th. The participants were Amber Electronics, Circo Craft, Cusco, Electrovox, Gen-Tec, Morgan Shaeffer. These companies established representation on the West Coast.

We have continued to work with Lockheed, I.T.T., Gilfillan, Northrop and the other defense contractors, on Canadian offset purchase opportunities. Again on offset matters, 19 prime contractors on Canadair's Challenger program will be contacted.

A licensing arrangement has been negotiated between Nosecone Manufacturing of La Habra and Crorak of St Georges de Beauce, Québec, for the sale and manufacturing in Canada of their products.

We have assisted a Québec firm seeking to acquire a company in the field of heating and air conditioning.

We have arranged for 3 California-based companies to visit Québec on industrial development matters.

We have assisted different Québec manufacturers in the consumer goods area in their analysis and penetration of the local market.

4) Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

Global Sports Tours of Beverly Hills has developed 3 ski tours to Québec, with our assistance.

The Bonhomme Carnaval, the Host of the Québec Winter Carnaval was in Los Angeles for the Rose Parade on January 2nd. Various tourism promotion activities took place during his stay.
