- Encourage tourists to visit Québec, Canada; supplying information, brochures and other pertinent data to all interested parties.

Presentation of the Québec situation by a representative from Québec Government House to graduate students from the Columbia School of Journalism.

2. Department of Intergovernmental AffairsInformation and Communications

Following the appointment of a Director of Communications in April, 1978, this Department set as its primary objective the coordination of the political, tourist and general information functions within the Québec Government House.

Québec politics and economy

The adoption of Bill 101 (The Charter of the French Language) gave rise to a number of questions from the American business community. A seminar was therefore organized in New York on June 20, 1978. Businessmen and bankers met with the President of the Office de la Langue Française and two of his aides. Literature on the subject was distributed.

Legal documents and related information

Most requests for information have to do with divorce, death and birth certificates, drivers' licences, wills, health and automobile insurance, social security, income tax forms, real estate transactions, travel documents, immigration, regulations and fees applicable to foreign students in Québec Colleges and universities.

Education, arts and culture

The related activities in this field gain in popularity as Québec becomes better known. Querries deal mainly with the learning of French as a second language, student exchanges, Franco-American ancestry, summer camps, vacations on farms and in families, Québec cuisine, documentation to American students doing research papers for their Social Studies classes, information to art magazines and art media people.

In cooperation with the U.S. Olympic Committee, the Department organized a press conference on sports and physical fitness on June 6, 1978. The occasion was the launching of a scientific 10-volume collection entitled Physical Activity and Human Well-Being. Mr. Claude Charron, Québec Minister responsible for Youth, Recreation and Sports, met with interested sports and recreation commentators and writers.

In May, 1978, Québec House held a painting exhibition of Québec artist Gille E. Gingras.

In June, 1978, the Department lent its support to the New York Museum of Modern Arts in its month-long showing of Québec films.

Relations with the press

The press is always after statements, contacts for interviews, statistics, photographs and related information for the publication of articles on Québec.

On the occasion of Prime Minister René Lévesque's visit to New York, contacts were made by and for the written and electronic press. An interview with Mr. René Lévesque was arranged for Mr. Tom Brokaw, host of NBC-TV's Today Show. On June 18, the Prime Minister gave a press conference at the Québec Government House.

Mr. Pierre de Bellefeuille, parliamentary assistant of Québec Intergovernmental Affairs Minister Claude Morin, was invited to address the Center for Inter-American Relations in New York on June 15, 1978.

Mr. Guy Joron, Québec Minister responsible for Energy, came to New York on June 15 and 16, to meet with interested parties in the field of energy.

Documentation

From January 1st to June 30th, 1978, we received from Québec 19 new books dealing with socio-economics, politics and arts.

During the period in review, we edited 26 press reviews for the exclusive use of our personnel. We mailed 19 copies of Québec at a Glance and 234 copies of Le Québec en Bref.

As of May 8, 1978, the Department puts out a weekly newsletter entitled Québec Update. This typical publication, photocopied on the premises, gives a positive outlook of Québec. The mailing list amounts to roughly 1000 names from the press, business and political communities as well as interested members of the general public. Each issue of Québec Update is filed with the U.S. Department of Justice and a mention of this fact appears on the cover page.

3. Department of Industry and Commerce

In the past 6 months, the Economic Section of the New York Delegation has spent most of its time promoting the sales of Québec products in this territory. For instance, the Québec Government has sponsored the participation of several Québec manufacturers in the following trade shows:

- April 2-5, Menswear Show (NAMSB) at the Hotel Statler Hilton, New York,
- May 3-5, Premium Show, at the New York Coliseum,
- June 15, Montréal Fashion Imports (fashion presentation) at the St. Regis Hotel, New York.

In addition, the Government has organized the following trade missions:

- March 7-10, visit of the Pennsylvania Manufacturing Housing Show, Hartford, Connecticut,
- May 8-11, visit of the International Tool and Manufacturing Show, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

During the period in review, we have provided assistance to over 100 Québec manufacturers. As usual, we have devoted much of our time in the preparation of market studies and accompanying exporters in the field. We have made use of information available at the New York Chamber of Commerce, the World Trade Center and the regional offices of the U.S. Department of Commerce.

The officers of the Economic Section have continued their P.R. role of keeping in touch with Head Offices operating in Québec and also maintaining contact with the financial community.

4. Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

The principal functions of the department are to establish contacts and maintain relations with the representatives of the private sector of the travel and tourism industries, and the public in general in the States of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania, with the sole aim of promoting tourism to Québec.

During the period covered by this report, this office has:

These inquiries were fulfilled by literature distribution.

- lent out, through its distributor Association-Sterling Films, 1431 films which were shown to various audiences totalling 98,862 persons.
- participated to 7 Market Places under the auspices of the Canadian Government Office of Tourism of New York: in New York City, in Hasbrouck, N.J., in Philadelphia, Pa., in Westbury, L.I., Buffalo, N.Y., Rochester, N.Y. and Albany, N.Y. The CGOT field offices were responsible for the invitations sent to 953 travel agents operating in the Mid-Atlantic.
- participated to two ski seminars organized by Ski Group 78 in Philadelphia and New York City.
- provided assistance, in collaboration with CGOT, regarding familiarization trips for travel agents: the inspection tours of Montréal, Québec City and the Laurentians were done in cooperation with tour wholesalers such as Amtrack, Flyfair, Summit, Yankee Holidays, Canaplan. Some 40 tour desk operators for Eastern, Delta, Allegheny and Air Canada were taken for an inspection tour of the ski resorts. 20 ski influencers from New Jersey, New York ski clubs visited Mont-Tremblant in February.
- cooperated in a fam-tour organized by Amtrack for 220 travel agents of the New York Chapter; NYASTA in a visit of hotels in Montréal and the Laurentians.
- prepared travel itinerary for travel writers: freelance and editor for leading publications: Gourmet, Signature, Mademoiselle, Glamour, House and Garden, Argosy, Routes, Field and Stream Metro Newark, Hearst News Service, Newsday, Conde Nast, Doubleday, etc. These are sponsored by the public relation office of major hotel operators: Loews, Hilton International, Hyatt, Intercontinental; Air Canada and CGOT.
- maintained contact with member of the media by lending black and white photos, 35mm slides and travel features.
- participated to meetings held by NYASTA and ANTOR.
- helped a representative of Québecair in conducting a seminar for 300 reservation agents handling tour packages at Eastern Airlines reservation center in Woodbridge.
- entertained relations with 30 active tour operators and wholesalers in an effort to develop tour packages to Montréal, Québec and the Laurentians. A travel trade manual covering these tours in distributed to the travel agencies.

- distributed 801 "Québec Incentive Manual" to Incentive Houses Associations and Corporations.
- reorganized the office space for optimal utilization.

This office is now building better relationship with the Association of Travel Agents; is elaborating a Winter Travel Trade Manual promoting ski and winter sports; is working with tour operators developing student and senior citizen group travels.

Established the office. Arranged connection with the Canadian Consulate, the Governor of Georgia, the Georgia Chamber of Commerce, the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce - other associations such as the Atlanta Committee on Foreign Relations, the Southern Center for International Studies, Economic Forecasting Project, Georgia State University, the International Business Institute. Endeavored to become acquainted with certain business leaders of the areas.

2. Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Dispatched a news bulletin known as QUEBEC UPDATE to a list of some 90 people whom we feel appropriate to receive it.

Have furnished information to the press upon request.

Have arranged platforms and press conferences for senior economic officers.

Have arranged receptions for people from the business, university and government communities.

3. Department of Industry and Commerce

Have answered all requests for information concerning commercial, industrial and financial matters as they pertain to Québec, Canada.

4. Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

Have answered what inquiries have been received concerning tourism and Québec, but have worked closely with the Canadian Consulate General Tourism Department in this regard.

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B O S T O N1. Québec Government

On April the 19th, Mr. René Lévesque, Prime Minister of Québec, was invited by the Center for International Affairs to address a group of approximately 1200 people at the Sanders Hall under the sponsorship of the Jodidi Foundation Lecture Program; during the same day we organized series of visits and interviews for Mr. René Lévesque, namely a group of specialists in international politics from the different local universities, editors from the local media, an interview with Mr. John Kenneth Galbraith and a visit at the State House where he met with the Governor, Mr. Michael Dukakis and also the Speaker of the House.

2. Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Our Delegation was instrumental in obtaining 15 scholarship grants to members of the American Association of Teachers of French. We also organized a visit in Québec City of 5 executive members of the same organization. We offered similar grants to the North Eastern Modern Language Association.

As a province, we were invited by the Health, Education and Welfare Department to attend a session with the Mental and Health Commissioners of New England. This meeting took place in Auburn, Mass. and a Deputy Minister of our Government was present.

We organized in Québec City a hockey game between the Members of the State House of Massachusetts and our Assemblée Nationale. This hockey game was followed by a session of information held in the Parliament Building in Québec City.

We have submitted to our Government in Québec a project coming from the Center for International Affairs of Harvard University. It is suggested that we should supply Harvard University with funds to establish a Research Center on Québec.

Our Delegation was invited to attend a forum organized by the Centre d'Héritage Franco-Américain at Bates College, Lewiston, Maine. We subsidized one of the speakers, Mr. Henri Saint-Laurent, a Franco-American from New Jersey.

Our participation was requested at Lowell University. The University had organized a cultural week and we supplied the film entitled: "Kamouraska".

For the second year we are cooperating with Dr. Claire Quintal, President of the Federation Franco-Féminine and the Organization of the Congress of the Young Franco-American between ages of 16 and 21. The objective was to stimulate interests in the promotion of the French culture. These young people are invited to visit Québec and get acquainted with the Québec situation and its culture.

We have recently started publishing a newsletter on the Québec situation entitled: QUEBEC UPDATE; from Boston, we are mailing approximately 250 of those weekly letters. It is designed to counterbalance the negative press that Québec has been receiving recently.

The Delegate, Guy Brassard, was invited to attend a meeting at l'Union des Franco-Américains du Connecticut, Waterbury. He invited all Franco-American to attend on July 2nd and 3rd, the 370th Québec Anniversary celebrations. The Delegate was also invited to attend a proclamation of the month of May as the Month of the French Language in New Hampshire. This was organized by

the Commission Culturelle of New Hampshire and the Richelieu Clubs of the same State, this was presided by the Governor Melvin Thomson.

3. Department of Industry and Commerce

During the last six months we continued our efforts to interest companies to either establish a manufacturing base in Québec, or to consider joint ventures. We have also received a letter of commitment from a company, indicating that they would seriously consider establishing and manufacturing in our Province if they can secure the \$6,000,000 order from the Société des Alcools du Québec. We also have other companies that have expressed certain interest in Canada in particular Québec.

We have given assistance to a paint company in Québec City interested in acquiring an American company. One of the companies that the Delegate has suggested they should consider for acquisition is located in Taunton and already, a tentative agreement has been signed between the two parties and the acquisition is in process.

Our Commercial Division has, in the past six months, concentrated their efforts on developing market programs and finding sales representatives or distributors in various categories such as: architectural products, pots and pans, school furniture, cookies, cheese, toys, handbags, synoptic systems, wine, wrapping equipment, giftwares, tool boxes, gourmet products, building products, mural sculptures, sports equipment, pipes.

We participated in various shows, such as the Boston Gift Show where we had 7 Québec manufacturers, the New England Boat Show where we had 1 Québec manufacturer; we organized two missions, one in Providence where we had twelve Québec manufacturers who visited Brown and Sharp, and a high technology mission in Boston, where we had 5 Québec manufacturers that were interested in finding sales outlet.

39 Québec companies showed an interest in exporting to New England and we are still assisting quite a number of them. Most of them were interested in finding a representative or distributor.

3 American firms have shown a keen interest in finding a Canadian partner to manufacture in Canada and we have submitted their interest to our Department of Industry and Commerce in Québec.

4. Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

Requests for information about traveling to the Province of Québec came:

During the first six months of 1978, the Tourist Sector:

- worked with major New England newspapers towards a co-operative advertising venture,
- participated in various travel shows sponsored by the Canadian Government Office of Tourism, Travel Trade Industry, the Hartford Courant, etc,
- organized a site-inspection trip to Québec for decision-makers from the Credit Union League of Massachusetts which resulted in 2 meetings to be held in Québec City in 1979 and 1980,

B O S T O N (3)

- arranged trips to Québec for local newspaper representatives who, as a result, published articles about their experiences,
- planned a familiarization tour for the Tour Director of Gray Line of Boston, a tour operator offering three new tours this year to Québec,
- published a newsletter detailing tours to and specials in the Province which was mailed out to 1000 travel agencies,
- helped organize two familiarization tours for travel agents in conjunction with two major tour operators, Kaplan Tours and Beckman Tours,
- co-operated on a regular basis with the Canadian Office of Tourism,
- maintained regular contact with wholesalers and tour operators.

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C H I C A G O1. Québec Government

The Office coordinated the visit of Bernard Landry, Québec Minister of State for Economic Development, to the Midwest. The activities planned included a dinner-meeting with 15 Cleveland industrialists having business interests in Québec and meetings with 2 influential editors there (one publishes a widely quoted Canadian newsletter with national distribution); discussions with a major St. Louis company considering investment in Canada; and a speech to 60 Chicago businessmen having ties to Canada, as well as a private interview with the foreign editor of the Midwest's most influential newspaper. The office also undertook research projects for the Departments of Public Works, and Agriculture, and helped organize a meeting between the Montréal Region Mayors Council and a similar organization in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

2. Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The Office responded to some 25 requests for information on Québec's language legislation as well as to inquiries covering the fields of immigration, study, birth records, history and culture. Since May, the Office has been mailing the weekly QUEBEC UPDATE newsletter to approximately 250 persons in the business, financial, diplomatic and academic communities.

3. Department of Industry and Commerce

The economic section of the office grew to 3 people on the appointment of an economic counsellor to head this section. The commercial attachés worked with 15 Québec companies seeking to penetrate the Midwest market, most of whom subsequently appointed agents and/or made significant sales in the area. They also helped four U.S. companies find sources of supply in Canada, and helped promote the Montréal Leather Fair among Midwest buyers. The office coordinated 2 commercial missions which brought a total of 11 Québec exporters to national trade shows where they had excellent results. Two other shows on which the officers had worked were cancelled by the organizing groups.

The office also participated in the planning and execution of a technical mission which brought 12 Québec companies to a foundry show in Detroit, and gave a reception on this occasion. The commercial and economic officers also obtained information on or visited 6 other major shows covering both consumer and industrial goods, for purposes of evaluating them for future Québec participation. The economic counsellor represented Québec at a seminar entitled "America-Canadian Dialogue" attended by some 125 members of the business and financial communities of Minneapolis. In the area of investment and joint ventures, the officers worked closely with 3 Québec companies seeking contracts from American companies and assisted 8 American companies looking for Canadian partners.

Further to contacts made with the U.S. Society of Automotive Engineers, the economic counsellor recommended that Industrial Export Department prepare a report on the advantages of Québec as a site for the manufacture of aluminum castings, to be used in a campaign of industrial promotion aimed at this sector. The officers worked with 3 companies considering potential investment in Québec.

4. Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

During the last six months, the Tourism Section of the Chicago office concentrated its efforts on the promotion of incentives and general group movements to the Province of Québec. The tourist counsellor attended 8 trade seminars and coordinated 4 familiarization tours to promote Québec's tourist industry. The office also organized 3 tours of Québec for travel journalists who subsequently published articles on the Province. 3000 travel incentive manuals were mailed to associations, insurance companies, and wholesalers, and the office handled approximately 1250 inquiries from individuals and travel agents.

At the beginning of May, the Honorable Bernard Landry, Minister of State for Economic Development, met at a luncheon in Dallas with a group of some fifty businessmen and industrialists. The Minister took advantage of that meeting to inform his audience on the policies of the Québec government towards American investments in Québec.

This reception was sponsored by the Québec Delegation in Dallas.

2. Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

The Delegate spent a week in Québec in February to attend the annual meeting of the Québec Delegates in the U.S.

In March, invited by the Council on Foreign Relations, our Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, The Honorable Claude Morin, was guest speaker at the Council's Houston and Austin Chapters. In Austin, it was one of their largest audience.

Following these meetings, the Delegate attended the official opening of the Québec Government Delegation in Atlanta, Ga.

On his way back from a short vacation in Québec in June, the Delegate attended a one-day meeting at the Québec House in New York, before proceeding back to Dallas, Texas.

On the occasion of his tour of Texas, where he gave a series of concerts, a reception was given by the Delegation in Dallas in honor of the Québec baritone Thomas Goudie.

3. Department of Industry and Commerce

Six Québec manufacturers took part at the beginning of February in the National Home Center Exhibition, held at the Dallas Convention Center. The results were very satisfactory for the exhibitors, especially for one of them who was exhibiting weatherstripping kits and weatherstripping door sets. His sales went beyond his expectations.

Early in May, under the auspices of the Québec Department of Industry and Commerce, five Québec manufacturers participated in the Food Market Institute Convention and Exhibition, also held at the Dallas Convention Center. Three of these manufacturers were showing food products and the other two, equipment used by the food industry and the supermarkets.

In the course of the past six months, some twenty files were reactivated and seven new files opened. The Delegate undertook five business trips within his territory.

The Director of Foreign Relations of the Department of Industry and Commerce visited Dallas for a few days in May. It was his first visit to Dallas since his appointment last year and the main purpose of his trip was to discuss the moving into new quarters and the possible expansion of our office.

4. Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

During the last months, tourist inquiries have been numerous. The Québec Carnival usually raises a lot of interest, and this year even more so than usual.

With the constant publicity given Canada by Air Canada and American Airlines, who has a direct flight to Montréal, the tourist inquiries have kept on growing in our office.

A large Dallas based insurance company held its convention in Montréal and Québec City at the beginning of June. Over nine hundred people took part.

In May, the Delegate cooperated with the Québec Department of Tourism in the organization of two promotional luncheons for the Travel Agents held respectively in Houston and Dallas. On these occasions a film on Québec was shown and the Executive Secretary of the Québec Hotels Association was the guest speaker. The attendance was over a hundred guests at each event. Two air tickets to Québec offered by Air Canada were given away as door prizes.

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L A F A Y E T T E

1. Québec Government

From February 21 through the 23, was held in Québec City the annual meeting of all delegates of Québec leaving abroad.

From March 21 through the 23, was held in Québec City the annual meeting of the Louisiana - Québec Joint Committee. Louisiana was represented by Mr. James Domengeaux, Chairman of the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL) and Québec by Mr. Richard Pouliot, Assistant Deputy Minister of the Intergovernmental Affairs Department. At this meeting were discussed the exchange programs for the coming year:

- 50 Québec teachers of French in the Elementary schools starting August 26, 1978.
- 26 young Québécois in Louisiana families for three weeks at the beginning of August.
- 26 young Louisianians hosted by Québec families for a one-month period starting July 1st.
- 50 young college students to Jonquière to study French as a second language starting July 1st for four weeks.
- 40 second language specialists (S.L.S.) at Laval University for a one-month period starting July 1st for four weeks.
- 40 students from Louisiana State University in extra-mural campus program at Laval University for six weeks starting July 15.
- 100 Québec teachers of French as a second language at Louisiana State University for a one-month period starting July 1st.

The Québec Delegation works closely with the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL), the State Department of Education and Louisiana State University (LSU) in the preparation of these exchange programs.

Following the Louisiana-Québec Joint Committee, Mr. James Domengeaux, Chairman of CODOFIL, met privately with several ministers of the Québec Government and particularly with the Prime Minister, Mr. René Lévesque. On this occasion, Mr. Lévesque told Mr. Domengeaux about the celebrations of "Where it all began", the 370th anniversary of the founding of Québec City.

During the month of June, more than 150 Louisianians have shown interest in participating in these celebrations. A charter flight, Air Canada 727, was used for transportation.

The University of Southwestern Louisiana, CODOFIL, and the Federal Bilingual Center of New England organized the first Franco-American Conference which was held in Lafayette between March 3-8, 1978. On this occasion, the Québec Delegation provided the services of Mrs. Antonine Maillet, Acadian history writer as the keynote speaker.

Mrs. Maillet's work was so related to the Acadiana French Heritage that the local TV Public Broadcasting System or the Louisiana Educational Television Authority broadcasted seven plays of her series (30 minutes each) with the help of Canadian Broadcasting Corporation and the Québec Government. The Series started on April 17, 1978. They were broadcasted every Monday at 6:00 p.m.

During the visit in Louisiana of the Minister of Education from Belgium, Mr. Jacques Michel, the Québec Government was invited by CODOFIL to attend meetings and functions.

The Québec Delegation in Lafayette, Mr. Marcel Gaudreau, and the Louisiana Center for Acadian Folk and Creole Studies of the University of Southwestern Louisiana (U.S.L.), Mr. Barry Ancelet, were invited by PSB Radio in Dallas to broadcast a blockbuster of eight hours on the evolution of the French music in North America, principally Louisiana and Québec.

From June 21 through June 23, was held in New York a meeting of the Québec delegates in the United States.

Following that meeting a newsletter entitled QUEBEC UPDATE is being sent every week by the Québec Delegation to approximately 400 people in Louisiana.

Two interviews were given by the Québec Delegate to Mr. Leonard Anderson of the Wall Street Journal and to Mr. Jacques Picard of CHRC-FM in Québec.

2. Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Mr. Harold Gauthier, Superintendent of Education of the Lafayette Parish School Board and Mr. Allen Dugas, Director of Personnel at the Lafayette Parish School Board, went to Québec in May for the selection of the 50 Québec teachers of French for the coming year, 1978-79.

The Québec Government hosted meeting for several experts from Québec, France, Belgium and Louisiana from February 26 until March 14. They were in Louisiana to make an evaluation of the present CODOFIL program of French in the schools and to study the possibility for the native to take over the task of the foreign teachers.

The Intergovernmental Affairs Department arranged for Mr. Andrew Evans, Director of Treatment of the Lafayette Drug and Rehabilitation Center some meetings in Montréal with counterparts to discuss that important problem and share the experience.

Because of the long and friendly relationship between Rayne, Louisiana and Granby, Québec, both cities decided to officialize their relationship in a formal twinning which took place last February.

On several occasions, Mr. Michel Robitaille, Mass Media Technician, was asked by the principals and teachers of the Lafayette Parish Schools to entertain different groups with his own repertoire of French songs.

In the first part of April, the Québec Delegation organized a tour for a Québec singer, Diane Tell. She gave a series of 12 concerts in Louisiana high schools and universities.

We provided help and assistance to Jeanne Arsenault, Textile Curator of the Acadian Village in New Brunswick in finding old cotton weavers and spinners and compare the work done by the Acadians of New Brunswick and Louisiana.

A press conference as held at the Québec Delegation by Mr. Lionel Poulin, Director of Tourism, for Louisiana news media (radio-television-newspapers) for the launching campaign of "Where it all began", the 370th anniversary of the founding of Québec City, on May 24, 1978.

L A F A Y E T T E (3)

On June 13-15, Mr. Pierre Langevin, Director of Education at the Intergovernmental Affairs Department, came to Louisiana to analyze the development of the exchange programs.

The Québec Delegation hosted several meetings for the Louisiana State Department of Education, CODOFIL, and the representatives of France, Belgium and Québec at which meetings were discussed the action and the role of the educational consultants towards the work done by the foreign teachers of French in Louisiana.

The Québec Delegation gave its assistance to a Canadian university team directed by Dr. Gerry Gold, Professor of Anthropology at York University. This group is conducting a study on the survival of the ethnic group, the Cajuns in Louisiana. This study is sponsored by the Ford Foundation and the Canadian Art Council.

The Educational Consultant, Mr. Marcel Gaudreau, visited periodically the principals of the elementary and secondary schools where were stationed our Québec teachers of French to see how the program is doing, to help, assist and advise our teachers in their work and to maintain good relations in the milieu.

3. Department of Industry and Commerce

The Louisiana territory for the Department of Industry and Commerce is under the responsibility of the Québec Delegate in Dallas, Mr. Alfred Dansereau.

The Québec delegation continued to give its help and assistance to Mr. Dansereau when needed, especially with a Louisiana company which is importing from Québec "terra jet" (small vehicle for marsh land).

The delegate met and had discussions with the commercial counsellor of the French Government stationed in New Orleans, Mr. Jean-Pierre Levallois.

The delegate also met with Mr. Witnell of the Chamber of Commerce in New Orleans.

4. Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

The delegation answered several requests from Louisianians wishing to go to Québec in sending them literature, pamphlets and other touristic information on our Province.

The delegation also transmitted several touristic information through the Louisiana Tourist Commission in Baton Rouge for numerous Québécois wishing to visit Louisiana.

We answered a number of inquiries received by mail, telephone and from visitors during the period covered. Such inquiries were in regard with the Québec Health Insurance, Taxes, Québec Pension Plan, real estate and helping students to apply for grants, etc.

3. Department of Industry and Commerce

38 industrial visits have been made to different companies in our territory. Participated to the NEPCON Trade Show, the WESTEC 78 Trade Show, the Southern California Business Show, attended a seminar on Technology and Business Futures at the University of Southern California. Visited one company showing of Québec furniture manufacturer (Furnitrad) at the Pacific Design Center, where they were introducing their new line to potential buyers and distributors. Accompanied Mr. J. Desjardins from the Ministry of Agriculture of Québec in different visits in our territory to introduce Québec consumer products.

4. Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

Mr. Pierre Valiquette, Counsellor of Tourism from the Québec Government in Chicago, participated to 14 seminars organized by the Ontario Government in the promotion of Ontario and Québec. We answered requests for information on Québec to approximately by mail (150), by telephone (100) and visits to the office (60).
