

JONES, Robert G. (Los Angeles)

- By the establishment of contacts at the Federal and State government levels and within the business and financial community of the Western States, thereby enhance bilateral trade and technology transfer between U.S. firms and Québec-based companies. Ancillary to this activity is the encouragement of manufacturing activity within Québec Province.

JOHN, Theodore H. (Los Angeles)

- Investigate opportunities for Québec manufacturers developing markets for their products in the Western U.S.. Arrange appointments when they come to this region and assist them in participation in local trade shows.

VILLENEUVE, Gérard D. (Boston)

- Establish close ties between the people of Québec and their American neighbors, with a view to promoting business and financial contacts on a mutual basis.
- Promote two-way trade between Québec and U.S. as a whole, and to encourage and assist American industries in manufacturing their products in Québec.

GAUDREAU, Marcel (Lafayette)

1- Québec Government

Individual contacts with representatives of various sectors and organizations on the territory of our Office, interested in Québec affairs: business and finance, universities and colleges (Columbia, SUNY, Duke, etc.), international affairs foundations (Center for inter-American Relations, etc.), Federal and State Departments and Agencies.

Organization of visits to our territory for a Québec official:

Mr. Pierre de Bellefeuille, member of the Québec National Assembly and Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister for Intergovernmental Affairs, who was invited as lecturer at annual meeting of American Philosophical Society in Philadelphia (November 9th, 1978), at Atlantic Community Seminar at Columbia University (December 12th, 1978), and participated in a debate on Québec at the American Whig-Clisosophic Society at Princeton University (December 12th, 1978).

Participation in organizing the coming visit to Washington (January 25th, 1979) of our Prime Minister, Mr. René Lévesque.

Contacts with US Government, States (mainly New York) and New York City agencies and departments to obtain information and to organize missions of Québec civil servants.

Contacts with various Departments of the United Nations Secretariat and with affiliated organizations in order to get documentation, to organize missions, to help in presenting candidacy of a Québec civil servant to the post of Director of the UN International School; contacts with the Canadian and other Missions to the United Nations in matters of competence and interest to the Québec Government.

Relations with Canadian Government representatives: Canadian Embassy in Washington, Canadian Consulates General in New York City, Philadelphia, etc., Canadian Broadcasting Corporation.

Participation by representatives of Québec Government House at meetings and seminars on US-Québec and Canada relations (SUNY, Postdam, Cercle Français of Princeton University, American Association Teachers of French - Washington Branch).

Lectures by representatives from Québec Government House (Alliance Française of New Brunswick, N.J., American University of Washington).

2- Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Information and Communications

The main function of the Communications Department is to coordinate the political, tourist, industry and commerce and general information at the Québec Government House.

Following the first seminar organized in New York City in June, a second meeting on Québec's new language policy was held in

Washington on September 6th for the personnel of the Canadian Embassy, which was followed by a meeting between officials of the Office de la Langue Française du Québec and members of the Office for Canadian Affairs at the US State Department.

Legal documents and related information

Most requests for information have to do with divorce, death and birth certificates, drivers' licences, wills, health and automobile insurance, social security, income tax forms, real estate transactions, travel documents, immigration, regulations and fees applicable to foreign students in Québec Colleges and Universities.

Relations with the press

The press seeks out documentation, interview opportunities, statistics, photographs and related information on Québec.

A Canadian Grand Prix press conference was organized in our offices.

Coordination of information trips made by American journalists to Québec, as far north as James Bay.

News releases to the American media sent out from time to time through a newswire service. Such releases deal with events likely to be of interest to both the American and Québec communities.

Documentation

During the period under review, we received twenty-four (24) new books from Québec dealing with socio-economics, politics and the arts. We also edited twenty-five (25) press reviews for the exclusive use of our personnel.

Fifty-nine (59) copies of Québec at a Glance and two hundred and eighty-eight (288) copies of Le Québec en Bref between July 1st and December 31st, 1978.

We send out a weekly newsletter, which is photocopied on the premises. Our mailing list now comprises close to 2,000 names from the press, business, political and academic communities, and the general public. Each issue of Québec Update is filed with the U.S. Department of Justice and a mention of this fact appears on the cover page.

Education, Arts and Culture

Québec Government House jointly organized with Columbia Artists a concert by Québec pianist André Laplante, silver medalist at the Tchaikovsky Competition held in Moscow in June of this year. Concert took place at Carnegie Hall on October 21, 1978.

Assisted Québec artist Jacques Charbonneau in presenting a one-man exhibition at the West Broadway Gallery, Oct. 28 - Nov. 16, 1978.

Participated with Danielle Grondin of Wild Life Gallery, New York in exhibition of works by Québec artists. December 1978.

During the past six months, contacts were established or developed with various universities in order to help them organize or enlarge their programs of studies on Québec (often inside of already existing Canadian Studies programs), through scholarship, exchanges, gifts of books, aid in organizing seminars, etc.. A new program on Québec was set up with Duke University of North Carolina and relations of various kinds were discussed with John Hopkins, SUNY-Plattsburgh, Radford College, etc.

Missions

A short mission to Washington was organized on August 2-3 for Professor Pierre P. Proulx, who wanted to interview a few specialists in government (Departments of Commerce and of State) and in private organizations (Brookings Institution) in the framework of a study commissioned by the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs on the constitutional future of Québec.

Another short mission was organized for two experts from the Québec Department of the "Fonction Publique" (Civil Service), who discussed salary policies with specialists at US Civil Service Commission.

At the end of August, a Québec journalist, Mr. Guy Lamarche, was commissioned by the Information Division of the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs to make a short study of the perception of the press in Washington, D.C. with regard to Québec. He spent two weeks in Washington for that study.

3- Department of Industry and Commerce

The period under review was highlighted by the Québec participation in five major activities:

- In June, we have put on a major fashion show at the St. Regis Hotel. All garments were from Montréal designers and attendance in total topped 300 people.
- In July, we led a mission of top Québec furniture manufacturers to the High Point Furniture Show in North Carolina.
- In August, Québec participated in the National Shoe Fair Association Show at the New York Coliseum.
- In October, a group of 9 menswear manufacturers participated in the "NAMSB - National Association of Men's Sportswear Buyers" Show, held at the Statler Hilton Hotel in New York.
- In November, a group representing nine (9) Québec cooperatives participated in the Clusa/ICA Cooperative Trade Conference held at the St. Moritz Hotel and the New York World Trade Center.

In addition, we have provided our assistance to over sixty individual firms from Québec looking to expand their sales in the U.S. market. We have organized three mailings of our publication "Québec Economique". As indicated in previous reports, we have kept close contacts with Federal Government agencies, State Departments, local Chambers of Commerce and other groups, to either supply them with information on Québec or to request data for our own governmental needs or for the Québec firms interested in the U.S. market.

Our counsellors continued their PR role of keeping in touch with head offices of companies operating in Québec and also maintaining contact with the financial community.

4- Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

The principal functions of this Department are to establish contacts and give assistance to representatives of the American travel and tourism industries interested in promoting Québec as a vacation destination; answer inquiries from prospective visitors and the public in general in the States of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania; give technical assistance to travel writers.

During the period covered by this report, this Office has:

- handled 21,215 inquiries initiated by mail, telephone calls or visits; travel brochures were sent out to fulfill these demands.
- lent out, through its distributor Association Sterling Films, Inc., 695 films which were shown to various audiences totalling 30,735 persons.
- participated in five (5) Marketplaces organized by the Canadian Government Office of Tourism held in New York City, Buffalo, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh and Rochester. The CGOT offices were responsible for the invitations sent to the travel agents and the co-participants of these seminars.
- participated in the New Jersey Ski Council Jamboree; the Henry Davis Show at Hauppauge.
- participated in functions held by NYASTA and ANTOR.
- provided assistance for two familiarization trips organized by AMTRAK
- arranged inspection site tour for marketing representatives of Academic Arrangements.
- contacted and gave assistance to tour operators developing student group travel packages: Academia, Academic Arrangements Abroad, American Leadership Study and Teachers' Tours.

- travel agencies with the publication of the Summer Travel Trade manual;
- group influencers: students, skiers, senior citizens with the development of travel tour packages from AMTRAK; and
- travel writers with the planning of their visits to special events and countryside travel.

During the last six months, from July 1st to December 31, 1978, our Office was involved in the following:

- Organization of the project entitled: "International Heritage Trail" with the cooperation of the New England Governor's Conference.
- The Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Company is interested in negotiating an agreement with the Québec Government to purchase additional electrical power by the end of 1980.
- A \$10,000 subsidy has been given to Boston University for the preparation of a booklet entitled: "Wide Horizons". The Province of Québec will be the subject of this booklet. This is destined to students travelling in Québec.
- The Director of our Office attended a seminar organized by Probe International and Fletcher School of Diplomacy, entitled: "Political Realities and U.S. Business Abroad".
- The Director also attended many conferences sponsored by the Center for International Affairs, Harvard University.
- An agreement has been reached between the State of Maine and the Québec Government in regard to the truckers crossing borders.
- The Director participated in a seminar in Orono, Maine, on Canadian-American Relations. This meeting was organized by the Canadian Government and the Maritime Provinces. Three conferences related to French were held: "Québec Relations with New England", "The Acadians of Atlantic Canada" and "The Franco-Americans in New England". Dr. Ron Tallman, Director of the Center for Canadian Studies, mentioned that the University of Maine had received a grant of \$332,000 from the National Endowment for Humanities to promote Canadian Studies and especially Franco-American Studies.
- The Executive of the New England Governor's Conference wants to revive the "Heritage Trail" project. Steps have been taken in order to inform the interested authorities of the Québec Government.

2- Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

We organized a study trip in some localities of New England for members of a group representing the Department of Cultural Affairs, the City of Sherbrooke and the Historical Society of Eastern Townships. They were interested to see the process and the result of recycling old buildings in New England cities, such as Boston Waterfront area, Lowell Mills and the National Urban Park, and Manchester Mills.

It is now possible to receive French language programs in Lowell, on cable television. The programs are sent out by CKSH - Channel 9 in Sherbrooke, Province of Québec.

In Dallas, His Excellency Mr. Peter M. Towe was guest speaker at a dinner of the Dallas Council on World Affairs and, in Houston, he was guest speaker at a dinner held under the auspices of the Institute of International Education.

3- Department of Industry and Commerce

In this last semester, two American companies with head offices in the territory of the Dallas Delegation have decided to set up manufacturing operations in Québec.

The first, from Arkansas, will manufacture wire mesh and plastic screens for the paper and asbestos industries. The second, from San Antonio, Texas, is a manufacturer of laundry and dry cleaning equipment. The investment involved will be approximately three million dollars.

A Dallas company has given a manufacturing licence to a Québec firm to manufacture portable plastic kennels. These cages of different sizes are used by the various airlines to carry small animals.

In August, a Québec manufacturer showed his pedal boats and canoes at the Southwest Marine Industry Show held in Dallas, Texas.

Québec was represented at the following exhibitions: American Dietitians Association, in September, and the Food Brokers Association, in December, both being held in New Orleans, La. Some ten (10) manufacturers attended these meetings.

In the course of the past six months, twelve (12) new files were opened and some fifteen (15) files were reactivated. The Delegate undertook three (3) trips within his territory.

In November, the Director of the International Relations of the Department of Industry and Commerce visited our new Office. He took this opportunity to call on the Canadian Consulate. The main purpose of his trip was to discuss the 1979 programming for the Dallas Office. The State of Kansas has been added to our territory, which now comprises the following six States: Texas, Kansas, Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and New Mexico.

In December, the Delegate attended meetings in Montréal and Québec City under the auspices of the Department of Industry and Commerce.

- One Hundred (100) Québec teachers of English as a second language attended advance courses at Louisiana State University from July 4th to July 31st, 1978
- A Louisiana pedagogue participated in Québec in a seminar organized for thirty-three (33) Québec candidates as teachers of French for Louisiana.
- Two Québec pedagogues participated in an in-service workshop on orientation and training of associate French teachers in Baton Rouge from August 26th to 31st, in co-operation with the Louisiana State Department of Education.

The Québec Delegation worked closely with the Council for the Development of French in Louisiana (CODOFIL), the State Department of Education and Louisiana State University in the realization of these exchanges.

Forty-five (45) Québec associate teachers of French as a second language signed a contract with CODOFIL for the school year 1978-79, including eighteen (18) renewals. Twenty-six (26) of them are involved in ESAA program in the Lafayette Parish.

One interview was given by the Québec Delegate at KPEL radio station in Lafayette during the month of October on the Québec-Canada issue.

A newsletter "Québec Update" was sent weekly to 400 personalities in Louisiana.

A TV crew from Channel 10 in Montréal came to Louisiana on November 14th and remained until the 17th, to make a film on "La Louisiane Française". Mr. Pierre Langevin, Québec Delegate, and Mr. James Domengeaux were interviewed. This 30-minute film was shown on Channel 10 in Montréal on November 30th, 1978.
