



1- Québec Government

Individual contacts with representatives of various sectors and organizations on the territory of our Office interested in Québec affairs: business and finance, universities (John Hopkins' School of Advanced International Studies, American University, Georgetown University, Princeton University, etc.), members of foundations and research groups.

Participation in organizing visits to U.S. by the following members of the Québec Cabinet:

- Visit by Mr. René Lévesque, Prime Minister, to Washington on January 25th: speech at the National Press Club, lecture at Georgetown University, meeting at the Georgetown Center for Strategic and International Studies, etc. (to help prepare that visit, the Québec Government hired temporarily a Québec journalist as press agent in Washington: Miss Evelyn Dumas).
- Visit by Mr. Bernard Landry, Minister of State for Economic Development to New York City on March 30th: speech at the New York Sales Executive Club, meetings with New York State and New York City officials.
- Visit by Mr. Guy Joron, Minister of Energy, to New York City on June 5th: inauguration of energy exchanges between Québec and the State of New York with Governor Hugh Carey and Energy Commissioner James Larocca.

Organization of visit to New York City by the following Québec official:

- Mr. Yves Michaud, Special Assistant to the Prime Minister for International Relations (February 22nd and 23rd): meetings with U.N. representatives and civil servants.

Contacts with Canadian and other Missions to the U.N. to get information and documentation in matters of competence and interest to the Québec Government.

Contacts with various departments at the U.N. Secretariat and affiliated organizations, in order to get documentation and to organize visits.

Relations with Canadian Government, business and press representatives in New York, Washington, D.C. and other cities. Canadian Embassy, Canadian Consulates General, Canadian Broadcasting Corporation.

Contacts with agencies and departments of U.S. and various State Governments, in order to get information and documentation, to organize visits and missions of Québec officials and civil servants.

Contacts with members of staff of members of the U.S. Congress, for same purpose.

Lectures by representatives of Québec Government House at seminars and meetings to present the Québec point of view (Yeshiva University, New York State Council for the Social Studies, etc.).

2- Department of Intergovernmental Affairs

Information and Communications

Between January 1st and June 30th, 1979, the Department of Communications exercised its specific function as a link among the various departments of the Québec Government House, the American and the Québec communities. This Department handled mainly political, economic, tourist and general information requested by the press, our staff and the public at large.

Québec Politics and Economy

The curiosity aroused by the ongoing Canadian constitutional debate continues unabated. This no doubt explains the invitation extended to and accepted by Prime Minister Lévesque to address the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., last January. While in the American capital, the Prime Minister also appeared on the McNeil/Lehrer Report television program and had talks with interested parties at Georgetown University and the Washington Post.

As a corollary, the Québec economy draws considerable attention. In January, this Department coordinated a joint effort of the Québec Industry/Commerce and Tourism Departments promoting hockey equipment and the Québec Carnival. The main activity was a hockey game between a Pee-Wee team from Muncie, N.Y. and an Atom team from Verdun (Québec) at the Rockefeller skating rink, with the Québec Carnival Snowman attending.

Legal Documents and Related Information

During the period under review, requests for information dealt mainly with divorce, death and birth certificates, drivers' licences, wills, health and automobile insurance, social security, income tax forms, real estate, land transfer taxes, travel documents. Since the recent Québec-Canada Agreement on Immigration, all persons wishing to immigrate to or study in Québec filed their queries with us.

Relations with the Press

The Communications Department now subscribes to a wire service which enables it to alert the press about events of special interest such as press conferences. The New York press was invited to two press conferences: one in March given by officials of the Montréal International Marathon and the second one, in June, given by Québec Energy Minister Guy Joron and New York State Energy Commissioner James Larocca, following the luncheon celebrating the Fort Covington Line at the

Plaza Hotel. The Canadian media attended a press conference given in our offices by Québec Economic Development Minister Bernard Landry, following the New York Sales Executive Club luncheon (March 30th) at which he was guest speaker. The Department made contacts for the American press seeking interviews with Québec personalities or wishing to cover certain events in Québec. It helped the foreign press based in the United States obtain interviews in Québec and it also assisted the Québec press reporting on Québec activities in the United States.

Documentation

From January 1st to June 30th, 1979, we received from Québec twenty-five (25) new books dealing with socio-economic, politics and the arts. To this must be added videocassettes, textbooks, literary and art publications in French sent to us by Québec publishers and audiovisual services for our library and our participation in educational conferences.

During the period under review, we edited twenty-four (24) press reviews for the use of our personnel.

This Department cooperated with the French Institute/Alliance Française and sent 2,000 leaflets announcing the performances of the Comédie Française in the United States.

Education and Academic Exchanges

Special emphasis on contacts with universities on this Office's territory to promote exchanges and to encourage them to include specific programs, seminars or lectures on Québec inside of a parallel to existing Canadian Studies programs. Among the universities which have been visited: SUNY (Plattsburgh), John Hopkins (School for Advanced International Studies), Georgetown University (Washington, D.C.), America University (Washington, D.C.), etc.. A program of Québec Studies has been inaugurated at Duke University (N.C.). Other contacts have taken place with the Federal Department of Education (HEW).

Contacts with foreign language departments of schools, colleges and universities in order to promote French speaking programs in Québec; contacts with various U.S. foreign language teaching associations (A.A.T.F., NEMLA, etc.) and with the President's Commission on Foreign Languages and International Studies.

Arts and Culture

In February, we cooperated in an exchange program organized by the artists of the Pleiades Gallery in SOHO and members of the Conseil de la Peinture du Québec.

On March 8th, Ms. Nicole Brossard, writer, gave a lecture at Rutgers University on the occasion of the International Women's Week.

In April, a group of drama students from the Drama Conservatory of Montréal, spent one week in New York meeting with people in the theatre field. This visit was organized with the collaboration of the Field Studies Center of New York.

On April 30th, we sponsored a recital by the Canadian singer, Julie Arel, at the French Institute of New York.

In May (18-20), we participated in the annual meeting of the French Institute in the United States held in Washington, D.C., and presented the Canadian singer, Pauline Julien, in concert.

3- Department of Industry and Commerce

From January to June 1979, the Economic Section of the Québec Delegation in New York has spent, as usual, some 70% of its time promoting the sales of Québec products in its territory. During that period, the Québec Department of Industry and Commerce has sponsored the participation of several Québec manufacturers in the following trade shows:-

10-14 February, RGA-Retail Jewelers Association at the Americana Hotel in New York

3-7 March, European Fashion Fair, 1 Penn Plaza, New York

Furthermore, during that period, five (5) individual showings were organized in the Trade Center of the Delegation in the fields of menswear, giftware, printing and publishing, furniture and fire protection systems.

We have highlighted in the windows rented by the Delegation in the International Building of Rockefeller Center, sporting goods equipment, luggage, mineral water and household apparatus and we have sent out two mailings of our publication entitled "Québec Economique", reaching on each occasion some 450 top executives.

During the period in review, we have provided assistance to over ninety (90) Québec manufacturers, to whom we have supplied market information and have accompanied many of these exporters in the field. Our market research has led us to use the good services of the New York Chamber of Commerce, the U.S. Department of Commerce and a number of trade associations.

One of the major events in which the Economic Section has been instrumental in its materialization, was the visit of Mr. Bernard Landry, our Minister of State for Economic Development, as guest speaker of the Sales Executive Club.

To conclude, the officers of the Economic Section have continued their public relations role of keeping in touch with U.S. head-offices having branch plants in Québec and also by maintaining contacts with the financial community.

4- Department of Tourism, Fish and Game

From January to June 1979, the Department of Tourism has been active in promoting tourism to Québec in the States of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Our Information Counter located at 17 West 50th Street in New York has handled 8,695 visitors, answered 7,406 requests by phone and sent touristic information by mail to 8,669 persons.

Our activities also consist of maintaining relations with the travel press and the media to keep them informed of the developments in the Québec Tourist Industry. We also assist them in their needs for material in the course of their promotional efforts.

We maintain contacts with wholesalers packaging Québec and with the travel trade in general, through the issuance of a Trade Manual distributed to travel agencies.

We have participated in seven (7) marketplaces under the auspices of the Canadian Government Office of Tourism in New York, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Erie, Syracuse, Buffalo and Rochester. These marketplaces are meant for travel agents and consist of travel exhibits by wholesalers and Provincial Tourism representatives.

The main goal of this office is to establish and maintain good relations with the Travel Industry in general and to promote Québec as a touristic destination within its territory, i.e. New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania States.

On February 2nd, the Delegate met with Mr. Towe, Canadian Ambassador to the United States. He also met with Mr. Jean-Charles Cantin, Canadian Consul in New Orleans, to discuss the Canadian participation in the Birmingham Festival.

On March 8th, the Delegate attended, as an observer, the Public Hearing of the President's Commission on Foreign Languages and International Studies in Houston.

The annual meeting of the Louisiana-Québec Joint Committee was held in Lafayette on April 1st and 2nd. The Louisiana State was represented by Mr. James Domengeaux, Chairman of CODOFIL (a State Agency), and the Government of Québec was represented by Mr. Robert Normand, Deputy Minister of the Québec Department of Intergovernmental Affairs, and three civil servants from his Department.
