I MINISTRY OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

A. STATES COVERED BY THE QUEBEC GOVERNMENT OFFICE

The Québec Government Office in Atlanta, which represents the Department of International Affairs, has jurisdiction over eleven Southern States : Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee and Texas.
