Gérard Vézina, Delegate (Chicago)

Under the authority of the Department of International Affairs, the Delegate in Chicago :

- officially represents the Government of Québec, its departments and affiliated organizations in the Midwest;
- plans, coordinates and directs all activities of the Québec Government Office;
- maintains and develops close relations between the Province of Québec and the Midwest states in various sectors of activities (economic, cultural, academic, touristic, immigration and public affairs).

Charles-Robert Dionne, Director (Atlanta)

Trade Promotion :

- introduction of Québec-based companies, of products and services to agents and buyers of the Southeast. Assist Québec-based companies to set up sales offices in the Southeast. Market surveys, market test and market information for Québec-based companies;

Industrial Promotion :

- representation to Southeast companies of Québec as a location to establish a plant, office or operation in Canada through promotion activities such as seminar, speeches and visits. Joint ventures/partnership between Southeast and Québec companies are also seek.

Technology Exchange :

- facilitates exchange of technologies between Québec-based companies and Southeast companies through existing channels such as universities, research centers and agencies or directly between company executives;

Public Affairs :

- to represent the Government of Québec and to promote academic, cultural and social relations between Québec and the Southern United States. Assistance and support to the Québec Government Office Public Affairs Attaché.

Lise A. Lambert, Cultural Affairs Counsellor (New York)

Representation, cooperation, information, support and diffusion of Québec culture:

- visual arts, design and crafts, performing arts (theatre, dance, music and variety performances), cinema, literary creation, folk life, etc.

Robert-Louis Varin, Immigration Counsellor (New York)

Under the authority of the Delegate General of the Québec Government in New York and in connection with the Ministry of Cultural Communities and Immigration in Québec, the Immigration Counsellor :

- conducts interviews of selection of candidates whose destination is Québec and interviews of information;
- receives visitors and provides with literature on Québec.

I MINISTRY OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

IV Ministry of Cultural Affairs

The Cultural Affairs division of Québec Government House pursued work in order to develop relations, cooperation and exchanges in the field of culture within the territory served by the office. During the period served by the report, activities focussed mainly on the following areas:

V MINISTRY OF CULTURAL COMMUNITIES AND IMMIGRATION AFFAIRS

Pursuant to a 1978 agreement between the Government of Canada and the Governemtn of Québec, the Immigratino section is responsible for the recruitment and selection of prospective immigrants to Québec.

To this end the Immjigration Counsellor interviews applicants individually in order to ascertain whether they meet the Immigration requirements and to verify whether they can establish themselves successfully in the Province of Québec. He also interview students wishing to pursue their studies in Québec and workers seeking temporary employment.
