



The Department published the 8-page *Quebec Update* newsletter each month except April. The newsletter was mailed to some 2,000 individuals in the United States and distributed on an ad hoc basis out of the Quebec Government House's office in New York.

The Department also prepared a fortnightly 15-page review of articles and commentary from the Quebec press and distributed the review to some 180 individuals.

Documentation and photographs were routinely distributed to students, educators, editors and researchers. The Department also answered routine questions about Quebec from the general public and performed the necessary research.
