- 3. By signing this engagement letter, you acknowledge complete disclosure of the circumstances of this fee arrangement, and consent to our representation.

To maintain our duty of confidentiality to your Government, our monthly statements shared with Arton capital will set out only the total amount of legal fees and costs and expenses for the period in question, without providing a specific description of the work performed on your behalf.

Only in the unlikely event that Arton Capital fails to make timely payments will we look to [client] for payment of our statements for services rendered.

The specific SPB scope of work for this initial phase of the representation is enclosed. This engagement will extend for one year. Fees for this phase are fixed at \$150,000.00 US.
