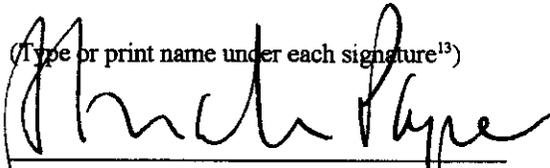

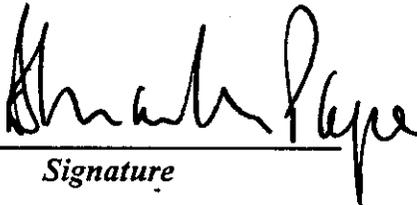

Republic of Costa Rica

Republic of Mexico

We undertook no activities for the Republic of Mexico during this reporting period.

The Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia

Pursuant to our agreement with Qorvis Communications, we have provided services to the Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia in respect to the Embassy's relationship with the U.S. Congress. Our activities have consisted of scheduling meetings with Members of Congress and Congressional staffers, accompanying an Embassy representative to these meetings, and providing comments and advice regarding the content of Congressional communications. We advised the Embassy on the status of legislation and legislative inquiries of interest to the Royal Kingdom, strategies for dealing with Congress and U.S. government officials, and strategies for improving the U.S.-Saudi bilateral relationship.

The Government of the State of Qatar.

We advised the Government of the State of Qatar with respect to its bilateral relationship with the United States Government, security and commercial issues. We provided advice in connection with official visits to the United States by Qatari officials, economic development initiatives in Qatar; procedures to protect the rights of Qatari citizens in the United States; initiatives to establish relationships with American universities; and issues relative to defense cooperation between the United States and Qatar. We also provided comments and advice regarding the content of speeches/remarks and other communications by Qatar officials, and their correspondence with the U.S. Government officials. We also provided legal advice to the Government of Qatar in matters involving international law, commercial investment, litigation and contracts.

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Sociedade Nacional de Combustiveis de Angola / Republic of Angola (SONANGOL)

Representation of certain interests of Sociedade Nacional de Combustiveis de Angola (SONANGOL) in the United States and, on behalf of Sonangol, advice and assistance to the Government of Angola on defined public policy issues. The principal activity during the period was advice on and assistance on financial transactions in anticipation of an application for credit assistance to the Export-Import Bank of the United States (Eximbank). In connection with this activity, we advised executives of Sonangol, the Finance Minister, and the Angolan Ambassador to the United States on human rights and transparency issues. Work on these issues involved, in part, discussions with senior officials at the International Monetary Fund and with officials of the Department of State, including the American Ambassador to Angola. At Sonangol's request, we also assisted the Angolan Ambassador to the United States in her efforts to establish Congressional relations and have advised her on trade relations between the United States and Angola, including discussion with officials at the United States Trade Representatives office and the Overseas Private Investment Corporation. From time to time we advised the Minister of Finance Julio Marcelino Vieira Bessa on Angola's relationship with the United States Department of Treasury and about the specific issue of Angola's status as "off cover" at Eximbank. We reviewed Angola's prospective qualifications before the Paris Club in the context of our review of Angola's bilateral debt, an issue relative to the Eximbank "off cover" status and Angola's relationship with the IMF. We reviewed procedures for inviting a Congressional delegation to visit Angola and assisted the Angolan Ambassador in initial preparation for this. We followed legislative activities that might impact on Angola and specifically the prospective Clean Diamond Act. We reviewed trade data between the United States and Angola and prepared a briefing book for the Ambassador for her use in discussions of a prospective Trade and Investment Framework Agreement with the United States Trade Representative.

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The Government of the State of Qatar

We engaged in no political activities for the State of Qatar.
