RETAINER AGREEMENT


THIS AGREEMENT, made as of October 1, 1969, by and between the CONSULATE GENERAL OF JAPAN at Los Angeles and JACK P. WHITEHOUSE (International Public Relations Co., Ltd., California), contains the following provisions:

1. The term of this Agreement will be for the period October 1, 1969, through March 31, 1970.
2. The CONSULATE GENERAL OF JAPAN at Los Angeles thereby retains JACK P. WHITEHOUSE as public relations consultant to assist in the planning, preparation and dissemination of general information on Japan and on the activities of the CONSULATE GENERAL OF JAPAN at Los Angeles. JACK P. WHITEHOUSE agrees to extend such assistance upon request of the Consul General or his representative.
3. The CONSULATE GENERAL OF JAPAN shall compensate JACK P. WHITEHOUSE by means of a monthly retainer of Three Hundred Dollars during the term of this Agreement.
