Pakistan People's Party Official Sarmad Mansoor Dies in Jail

-- Official was among several opposition party members unlawfully arrested by the military regime --

June 14, 2007

After being tortured and denied proper medical treatment in jail, Pakistan People's Party's (PPP) Gujrat District Finance Secretary Sarmad Mansoor, today died of a heart attack in Lahore's central jail. He was among the opposition party officials that were unlawfully detained in the recent wave of arrests by the military regime to curb the Chief Justice welcome movement.

Mansoor was arrested despite strong advice from his attending physicians at Gujrat Hospital that imprisonment would severely compromise his health. Not only did the police disregard the doctors' warnings, they held him under barbaric and inhumane conditions, and tortured him while moving him to Lahore's *Kot Lakhpat* jail. Subsequent requests by PPP Secretary General to move Mansoor to a hospital were also denied by the authorities.

PPP Secretary General noted that detainees from Gujrat continue to be tortured and held in harsh conditions, as punishment for the historic reception accorded to Chief Justice Chaudhry on May 5, 2007. The PPP has also learned that detention orders for 68 more political workers have been issued by the government.

Former Prime Minister and Chairperson of the Pakistan People's Party (PPP), Benazir Bhutto, has strongly condemned the civil war conditions created by the ruling party in Karachi, which resulted in the murder of 14 PPP workers and injuries to scores of people.

She expressed the concern that coalition members of the regime were creating these conditions to impose emergency to strengthen dictatorship and prolong the unrepresentative anti people forces that emerged from the rigged elections of 2002.

The PPP received reports that its rallies were surrounded by trucks and buses to besiege them. Then firing was started by MQM workers, police, law enforcement and men in plain clothes and masks, with intent to injure and kill. Reports were also received that the offices of Aaj TV, an independent network headquartered out of Karachi, was subjected to gunfire for six continuous hours, while no police or law-enforcing agencies intervened.

Mrs. Bhutto said the democratic and constitutional right of the lawyers to welcome the Chief Justice, who was to address the Karachi bar, was punctured by government-sponsored shooting with dead bodies lying in the roads and blood flowing on the streets.

She condoled with the families of the deceased and said that her heart went out to those who had lost their loved ones. "The sight of the sons of Pakistan bleeding to death in the street of Karachi is a shocking insight into the cruelty of the present regime," the Former Prime Minister said.

Mrs. Bhutto called upon the Supreme Court to register criminal cases against the law enforcement and MQM members involved, and called for their arrest.

TIME Magazine Adopts Policy on the Armenian Genocide, Distributes Documentary

February 2, 2007 – WASHINGTON D.C.: The Feb. 12, 2007 issue of the European edition of TIME magazine -- available in newsstands throughout Europe as of Feb. 2nd -- carries a full-page factual announcement on the Armenian Genocide, along with a complimentary DVD, in English and French, which contains a compelling 52-minute documentary on the Armenian Genocide by French director Laurence Jourdan. The DVD also includes a 46-minute interview with Dr. Yves Ternon, a leading expert on the Armenian Genocide.

Michael Elliott, the Editor of TIME International, issued the following public statement: "Please be advised that, in common with other leading news organizations, it is TIME's policy and practice to refer to the Armenian genocide as a historical fact. Accordingly, I will be informing our correspondents and editors that the term 'Armenian genocide' should be used without qualification."

Both the DVD and the full-page ad were provided free of charge by TIME Europe after realizing that its staff, without proper review, had inserted in the June 6, 2005 issue of TIME Europe a Turkish DVD as a paid advertisement under the guise of promoting tourism to Turkey. The Turkish DVD, paid for by the Ankara Chamber of Commerce, was a deceitful attempt to spread malicious lies and denialist propaganda on the Armenian Genocide.

To correct this error, TIME (Europe) published, in its October 17, 2005 issue, a critical page-long letter to the editor jointly signed by the following five French organizations: Memoire 2000, the Coordinating Council of Armenian Organizations of France (CCAF), Comité de Defense de la Cause Armenienne (CDCA) – ANC France, J'Accuse, and the Movement Against Racism and for Friendship Among Peoples (MRAP). In an Editor's note appended to the letter, TIME apologized for disseminating the Turkish DVD.

Armenian Parliament Approves Extension of Troops' Mission in Iraq

December 7, 2006 – WASHINGTON D.C.: The Armenian National Assembly yesterday voted – by 85-19-1 – to extend the mission of its troops serving in Iraq for another year. The vote follows Tuesday's debate in which Defense Minister Serge Sargsian stressed the importance of Armenian peacemakers' participation in Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Addressing the parliament on Tuesday, Sargsian said that the Armenian troop presence "adds to Armenia's international standing and strengthens the trust in the Armenian armed forces."
