The New Zealand Meat Board, whose operational name is Meat New Zealand, is a statutory board of New Zealand with a representative office in Washington. It is a board representing the meat farmers of New Zealand. Primary functions are to observe, monitor, and report on the meat market in North America. These functions being particularly related to imports of New Zealand meat into the USA, Canada, and Mexico.

- A. Monitor market developments through ongoing trade contact and report to New Zealand head office.

Meetings with Washington attorney and other interested parties to discuss implications of US tariff rate quota for lamb imports, lamb promotion order, mandatory price reporting, and country of origin labeling.

- B. To assist trade inquiries for New Zealand meat.

Responded to callers seeking information on New Zealand meat.

- C. To liaise with the New Zealand embassy, consulates, trade commissioners, and our attorney on developments that might affect New Zealand meat.

Kept informed on developments concerning US legislation that might affect imports of beef and lamb from New Zealand including temporary tariff rate quota on lamb imports, lamb promotion order, mandatory price reporting and developments in Mexican market for imports of New Zealand meat.

- D. To assist trade and farming visitors from New Zealand.

Made arrangements for business travel and meetings for Chairman, Chief Executive and other senior New Zealand-based staff.

- E. To liaise with farmer bodies in the USA and Canada, such as cattle and sheep farmer organizations, and also meat trade associations.

Attended conventions/meetings with Beef Promotion and Research Board, American meat importers, Meat Importers Council of America, National Cattlemen's Beef Association, American Sheep Industry Association, Canadian Meat Importers Council and Canadian Cattlemen's Association.
