^{1/} Political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act means the dissemination of political propaganda and any other activity which the person engaging therein believes will, or which he intends to, prevail upon, indoctrinate, convert, induce, persuade, or in any other way influence any agency or official of the Government of the United States or any section of the public within the United States with reference to formulating, adopting, or changing the domestic or foreign policies of the United States or with reference to the political or public interests, policies, or relations of a government of a foreign country or a foreign political party.

ATTACHMENT TO EXHIBIT B

4. Describe fully the nature and method of performance of the above indicated agreement or understanding.

Registrant will undertake to enhance and promote political objectives and economic progress of Liberia, by fostering a more sympathetic climate within the United States Government, the business community, and the public at large. Specifically, registrant will endeavor to:

- a) educate key government officials (both in the Executive Branch and the Congress) on the problems and needs of Liberia, as well as its importance to the United States as a friend and help-mate in the international community;
- b) develop and maintain key contacts at AID, the Department of Defense, the development banks, appropriate Congressional committees, and possibly selected United Nations organizations for the purpose of improving the chances for increased development assistance to Liberia on selected projects;
- c) enhance Liberia's attractiveness to the American business community as a host for new investment in sectors where Liberia seeks economic expansion; and
- d) improve the public image of Liberia in the United States so as to ensure broad political support for Liberia's friends in Congress and the Administration.

Registrant will engage in political activity and the dissemination of political propaganda. Specifically, the registrant will advance the interests of Liberia through:

- a) lobbying in Congress, the Executive Branch and with international financial institutions;
- b) providing legal advice to Liberia, particularly advice concerning legislation pending or to be introduced in Congress;
- c) developing an overall strategy for promoting public sympathy for Liberia's political objectives and investor confidence for investment in Liberia (in this connection, registrant will retain and oversee the activities of public relations counsel);
- d) consulting closely with the Government of Liberia to ensure that efforts made on its behalf in the United States are consistent with domestic political and economic objectives in Liberia; and
- e) endeavoring to ensure that American journalists are currently informed on the political and business climate in Liberia.

Duration and fees. Registrant was engaged as an agent for a period of two years, commencing on May 24, 1979. The fees have been fixed for the first year of the engagement at \$325,000, such amount to include services and out-of-pocket disbursements (including the cost of retaining public relations counsel). The fees for the second year will be negotiated at the end of the first year.
