

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


Dear Mr. Ambassador,


On behalf of my firm, I wish to thank you for the opportunity to meet with you and your staff yesterday.

This will confirm our oral agreement that this firm will render services as requested on behalf of the Embassy of Malaysia in connection with certain problems involving the use of palm oil in the United States. Disbursements and fees for services at our normal hourly rates will be billed at the end of each calendar month, as noted in earlier letters and in previous discussions with you and your staff. We understand that this may prove an interim arrangement, depending on developments during the upcoming visit of Malaysian officials.
