Privacy Act Statement. Monitor and analyze (i) legislative actions relating to the Clean Air Act and other related statutes, involving international environmental impacts, (ii) Environmental Protection Agency regulatory actions, especially as they affect the problems of acid rain, (iii) legislative and administrative actions relating to the extraterritorial impacts of the Endangered Species Act, the Magnuson Fisheries Conservation and Management Act and related Pacific fishery regulations, (iv) legislative actions related to the Garrison Diversion Project in North Dakota, and (v) government policy pertaining to environmental cleanup responsibilities associated with closure of U.S. military bases.

The total maximum charge under this appointment will hereby be increased from U.S. \$120,000 to U.S. \$149,000. All other terms and conditions will remain the same.


