
Re: Contract for Services in connection with High Seas Fisheries Issues

Dear Mr. Ishikawa:

This letter will set out the terms on which Garvey Schubert Barer ("GSB") agrees to assist Global Guardian Trust ("GGT") in monitoring certain developments in the United States affecting Japanese fishing rights on the high seas, and related issues.

1. GSB agrees to monitor the activities of the U.S. Government, and related developments in the business and environmental community, affecting the interests of Japan's high seas fisheries, and to respond to specific questions GSB may receive from GGT from time to time. In this connection, GSB will monitor to the extent possible developments in the following areas:

- (i) position of U.S. in WTO negotiations on liberalizing fisheries trade, including reduction of subsidies and removal of non-tariff trade barriers;
- (ii) U.S. policies limiting domestic catch, including application of ESA to limit fishing of bluefin tuna;
- (iii) position of U.S. government and environmentalists on disciplining flag of convenience vessels and other illegal fishing, especially in light of WTO trading rules and implementation of a U.S. National Plan of Action, U.S. laws requiring reports on IUU activities of other countries, and U.S. approval of Port State Measures Agreement;
- (iv) efforts by environmental groups to restrict the sale of Eastern Pacific Tuna in the U.S. that are labeled "dolphin safe";
- (v) negotiation of tuna treaties, including South Pacific Tuna Treaty;
- (vi) implementation of the American Fisheries Act (AFA);



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(vii) reauthorization of the Magnuson-Stevens Act and the Endangered Species Act;
and

(viii) other changes in domestic U.S. fisheries policies and related litigation affecting fishing on the high seas, including legislation on sharks, and rules on marine mammal bycatch, and litigation in U.S. courts on fisheries issues.

2. GSB agrees to discuss developments in these areas with GGT and representatives of the Embassy of Japan, and to provide written reports, as appropriate, in response to specific questions or requests received in the future from GGT as to the above matters, or related matters concerning the fisheries policies of the U.S. The services GSB provides will be strictly monitoring in nature, and will not include any efforts to influence U.S. government policies on behalf of GGT or the government of Japan.

3. It is agreed that for the services provided under the terms of this contract, GGT will pay GSB the fixed amount of \$38,000. Payment of this amount shall cover all fees related to, and all expenses incurred in, the performance of the work described above from June 4, 2013 through March 31, 2014.

4. GGT shall pay GSB by wire transfer \$9,500 on or before June 30, September 30, and December 31, 2013 and March 31, 2014. Interest at the rate of 12% per annum will be charged on amounts which remain unpaid ten days after payment is due.

5. It is further agreed that this contract will terminate without further notice on March 31, 2014.

If this letter accurately describes the terms of our agreement with respect to the services described, please so indicate by signing this letter in duplicate and returning one of the signed letters to me for my files.
