

Dear Mr. President:

The upcoming visit of President Patricio Aylwin of Chile will provide an opportunity for the United States to strengthen its friendship with the newly democratic government of Chile and further the objectives of the Enterprise for the Americas Initiative. One issue for discussion during the visit is the question of when the United States and Chile will begin negotiations leading to a Free Trade Area. In our view, it is important that the United States begin these talks soon.

Recent events in Peru and Venezuela are dramatic reminders to all of us of the fragility of the democratic successes in our hemisphere in the last decade. The United States should do what it can to strengthen democracy in South America.

A Free Trade Area with Chile also would promote U.S. economic growth by guaranteeing increasing access to and investment opportunities in Chile.

Your Administration has identified a Free Trade Area with Chile as the next logical step in the Enterprise for the Americas Initiative. In this regard, however, there seems to be some concern with initiating the process for negotiations before the completion of the North American Free Trade Agreement ("NAFTA"). We would like to point out that the NAFTA negotiations need not be a bar to an announcement that the Administration will begin the process leading to negotiation of a Free Trade Area with Chile.

An announcement and notification to the Congress of the Administration's intention to enter into negotiations would simply allow the House Ways and Means and Senate Finance Committees to begin their preliminary review of the Free Trade Area and set the stage for negotiations at a later time of your choosing. In the meantime, the demonstrated intention of the United States to enter into negotiations would be an important symbol to Chile of our partnership.
