ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS #22 & 24

Some of the letters forwarded to government officials may constitute "political propaganda" under the Act, and, as such, were labeled pursuant to the requirements of Section 4(e). The original typewritten letters, however, did not constitute "prints" under Section 4(a)(i) nor were they intended to be disseminated or circulated among two or more persons as described in Section 4(a)(ii). Thus, pursuant to Section 4(a), neither copies of the letters nor disseminated reports would need to be filed with the Justice Department.
