

We were asked to provide public relations assistance and counsel in preparation for and during the week of September 21, 1991 for the visit of the candidate of the People's Progressive Party of Guyana to New York City and Washington, D.C. The fee agreed to was \$2500 plus out-of-pocket expenses not to exceed \$500.

Agendas International prepared and distributed to the media in New York and Washington a press release and biographical background on the candidate, arranged for press interviews in Washington and a personal briefing in New York. This service was provided by a senior media/public relations consultant and agreed to orally with the firm of Reichler & Soble.



DR. CHEDDI B. JAGAN

GENERAL SECRETARY, PEOPLE'S PROGRESSIVE PARTY (PPP) OF GUYANA

BIOGRAPHICAL BACKGROUND

Cheddi Jagan was born March 22, 1918, in Port Mourant, Corentyne, Berbice, Guyana, the eldest of five brothers and five sisters. Their parents, along with two grandmothers and an uncle, immigrated to Guyana as indentured plantation workers from Uttar Pradesh, India, not far from the birthplace of Jawaharlal Nehru.

He attended Queens College, Georgetown, from 1933-36, and then left Guyana for seven years of study in the United States. He matriculated at Howard University and Central YMCA College, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree, and in 1942, he received his Doctor of Dental Surgery (D.D.S.) degree from Northwestern University.

While working his way through college, he experienced various types of labor environments and workers' struggles. After returning to Guyana, his increasing contacts with working people led Dr. Jagan into the ranks of the labor movement.

In 1946, he became Treasurer of the Man Power Citizens' Association but was soon removed because of his objections to the way union funds were used and the union's collaboration with the sugar planters. Recognizing the need for a working class organization and a political newspaper, Dr. Jagan spearheaded the formation of the Political Affairs Committee in 1946 and its PAC Bulletin. Four years later, on January 1, 1950, he founded the People's Progressive Party and became its leader.

In 1947, after a bitter struggle against the sugar lords in "Booker's Guiana," as British Guyana was then called, Dr. Jagan won a stunning election victory, making him the first genuine voice of the working class in the colonialist-controlled Legislative Assembly. "We the people have won," he later told Guianese at a public meeting. "Now the struggle will begin."

A significant moment in Dr. Jagan's life was the massacre of the Enmore Martyrs in 1948. At their burial he made a silent pledge and later wrote: "The Enmore tragedy affected me greatly. There was to be no turning back. There and then I made a silent pledge -- I would dedicate my entire life to the cause of the struggle of the Guyanese people against bondage and exploitation."

Dr. Jagan was President of the Sawmill and Forest Workers' Union from 1950-54; President of the Rice Producers' Association (1955-57); Honorary President of the Guyana Agricultural and General Workers' Union (1970-present); and President of the Guyana Peace Council.

From April to October 1953, Dr. Jagan headed the elected government of the PPP and was Minister of Agriculture. He also spent six months in jail for breaking restriction orders. He headed the next elected PPP government from 1957-61 and was Minister of Trade and Industry. He headed the third elected PPP government from 1961-64 as Premier and Minister of Development and Planning. He was Leader of the Opposition from 1964-73 and from 1976 to the present. He has been General Secretary of the PPP since 1970.

Described as the "Dean of Socialism in the Caribbean" by his friend and revolutionary colleague, Grenada's former Prime Minister Maurice Bishop, Dr. Jagan has made a singular contribution to the unity and development of progressive forces in the Caribbean.

Personal Data: Married in August, 1943, to Janet Rosenberg of Chicago, Illinois; has two children -- Cheddi Bradlaugh, born in 1949, and Nadira Shanti, born in 1955.

DR. CHEDDI JAGAN, FRONT-RUNNER IN GUYANA'S COMING ELECTIONS,
HERE TO MEET WITH STATE DEPARTMENT AND MEMBERS OF CONGRESS

Washington -- September 23, 1991 -- Dr. Cheddi B. Jagan, leader of the opposition People's Progressive Party (PPP) and the acknowledged front-runner in Guyana's coming elections, arrives here today as part of a week-long program in the United States.

The 73-year-old former Prime Minister is meeting with State Department officials and members of the House and Senate through Wednesday. He plans to discuss the incumbent government's delay in fixing an exact date for national elections originally scheduled for earlier this year.

Guyana elections have been notoriously fraudulent since independence from Britain in 1966. With U.S. aid blocked until guarantees for free and fair elections have been put in place, the governing People's National Congress (PNC) party has made concessions that included the presence of international observers and verified voting procedures. Former President Jimmy Carter and the Council of Freely Elected Heads of State have been involved as observers. An amendment to the Constitution was passed allowing for the elections to be delayed while proper procedures are installed.

However, over 10,000 registered voters' names have disappeared recently from the computer list because of bureacratic error or possible fraud. Parliament is expected to be dissolved at the end of September, which would require national elections by the middle of December, unless further delays are sought by the government.

Dr. Jagan's Washington schedule also includes a Business Roundtable Discussion sponsored by the Caribbean-Central American Action, a lecture at American University and a fund-raiser dinner.

The PPP General Secretary was elected Prime Minister of British Guiana in 1953, but was removed from office after only four months when the British suspended its Constitution. Through fraud and manipulation, the PNC has been in power since independence in 1966.

Dr. Jagan began this U.S. tour with a fund-raiser dinner in New York last night.

On Wednesday, he travels to Chicago for a fund-raiser event and lecture at the University of Illinois.

He returns to the New York area on September 27 and 28 to meet with the Association of Concerned Guyanese.

#
