

Privacy Act Statement. 

¹Political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act means the dissemination of political propaganda and any other activity which the person engaging therein believes will, or which he intends to, prevail upon, indoctrinate, convert, induce, persuade, or in any other way influence any agency or official of the Government of the United States or any section of the public within the United States with reference to formulating, adopting, or changing the domestic or foreign policies of the United States or with reference to the political or public interests, policies, or relations of a government of a foreign country or a foreign political party.

AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT effective as of the third day of May, 1995, between the GOVERNMENT OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF PAKISTAN ("GOP") and PRESTON GATES ELLIS & Rouvelas Meeds ("PRESTON").

WHEREAS, the GOP, during the 1980's, entered into numerous contracts with the Government of the United States (the "USG") to purchase from the USG certain military equipment (the "Equipment");

WHEREAS, the USG has refused to deliver to the GOP substantial amounts of the Equipment, including Equipment paid for by the GOP, on the basis that, in their opinion, the delivery of the Equipment would violate the so-called Pressler Amendment (found in Section 620 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended) (the "Pressler Amendment");

WHEREAS, the Equipment includes sixty (60) F-16 A/B aircraft purchased pursuant to a Letter of Offer and Agreement between the GOP and the USG with a price of over US \$1.4 billion (the "F-16's"), for which the GOP has already paid US \$ 658 million to the USG;

WHEREAS, all efforts to date by the GOP to secure delivery of the Equipment, including the F-16's already paid for, have been unsuccessful;

WHEREAS, special action by the Legislative and Executive branches of the USG would be required to secure delivery of the Equipment;

WHEREAS, the GOP wishes to retain a firm with excellent relations with the new leadership of the U.S. Congress to persuade them to honor the said contracts and make delivery to the GOP of the Equipment (the "Required Services"); and

WHEREAS, Preston represents that it is ready, willing and able to provide the Required Services, and that doing so would not represent a conflict of interest for it.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Preston will provide the Required Services and register and report its activities on a periodic basis to the GOP and to the extent required by law pursuant to the Federal Regulation of Lobbying Act and the Foreign Agents Registration Act. It is understood by the parties that Preston's representation of, and obligations to, the GOP is strictly limited to the Required Services.

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2. The GOP agrees to pay to Preston, a retainer of US \$ 165,000 by cable transfer to Preston's bank account which is:

3. All expenses incurred in the lobbying effort including local and international telephones and fax etc. will be covered by the retainer fee. However, when Preston is required by the GOP to send representatives to Pakistan or elsewhere for consultations, the GOP will reimburse Preston for travel and related expenses.
4. The Term of this Agreement shall be six (6) months; provided, however, if at the expiration of the said six (6) months there is legislation in either House of the United States Congress designed to permit, or which would permit, the delivery of the Equipment, or any part of them, then this Agreement shall be extended until the said legislation has been signed into law and implemented, until the said legislation dies or two (2) months, whichever is sooner (the "Term").
5. Preston shall keep the GOP informed of its activities through a progress report provided to the United States Ambassador of the GOP and to the GOP directly, as requested. The progress report shall be provided on a weekly basis, or less frequently as reasonable.
