

Privacy Act Statement. 

¹Political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act means the dissemination of political propaganda and any other activity which the person engaging therein believes will, or which he intends to, prevail upon, indoctrinate, convert, induce, persuade, or in any other way influence any agency or official of the Government of the United States or any section of the public within the United States with reference to formulating, adopting, or changing the domestic or foreign policies of the United States or with reference to the political or public interests, policies, or relations of a government of a foreign country or a foreign political party.

AGREEMENT

By this Agreement entered into between Black, Manafort, Stone & Kelly, (hereafter Consultant), and the Republic of Equatorial Guinea (hereafter Equatorial Guinea), the Parties agree as follows:

Scope of Employment

Consultant will provide to Equatorial Guinea comprehensive government and public affairs representation. Such services will include: monitoring federal government activity; building understanding and support within key Congressional committees; providing hands-on communications and media relations support; and building relationships in the private sector.

Term

This Agreement will cover the period from October 5, 1995 to October 4, 1996.

Fees

Equatorial Guinea will compensate Consultant in the amount of \$180,000 U.S. annually, with one-half of the amount, \$90,000 U.S. payable upon execution of the agreement and the remaining \$90,000 U.S. payable on the first day of the sixth month anniversary of the agreement.

 Consultant will be reimbursed for all extraordinary expenses including travel, lodging, international phone calls, and meals and entertainment expenses related to client activity. Such expenses will be submitted at the end of each month and be due upon receipt. All expenses are subject to the review of the client, and if requested, prior approval.

Notwithstanding the above, this Agreement may be terminated within 30 days written notice, provided that if the Agreement should be so terminated, the Consultant shall repay to Equatorial Guinea such portion of the fees as may have been received by them on pro-rated monthly basis.


