



AGREEMENT FOR PUBLIC RELATIONS CONSULTING SERVICES

BETWEEN

THE KOREA SEMICONDUCTOR INDUSTRY ASSOCIATION

AND

DANIEL J. EDELMAN, INC.



1. Parties

This contract for public relations consulting services is entered into between the Korea Semiconductor Industries Association (the "KSIA") and Daniel J. Edelman, Inc., 1429 K Street, N.W., 10th Floor, Washington, D.C. 20905 (the "Consultant").

2. Services to Be Provided

The Consultant will assist in drafting and placing in major newspapers opinion-editorial pieces regarding the possible effect of antidumping duties in connection with the investigation by the U.S. Government of Dynamic Random Access Memory Semiconductors of One Megabit and Above from the Republic of Korea. In furtherance of this objective, the consultant will target and work with third-party authors, assist in drafting and editing opinion-editorial articles, and submit the articles for placement on the opinion-editorial pages of state and national newspapers. The Consultant will also, to the extent necessary, conduct independent research to support the conclusions stated in the articles.

3. Fees



The KSIA will pay the Consultant its hourly rates charged for time spent in connection with this matter, provided, however, that total cumulative fees will not, in any case, exceed \$30,000 without prior, written authorization from the KSIA. The Consultant represents that this \$30,000 fee is sufficient for the work described in Paragraph 2 above.

4. Expenses

The KSIA will reimburse the consultant for direct expenses (plus an additional 17.65% processing fee) associated with the work, such as the direct costs of travel, telephone, telefaxing, and copying, couriers and computer research. However, these direct expenses are not to exceed \$5,000 without prior written authorization from the KSIA.

5. Confidentiality

Any information obtained from the KSIA concerning member activities shall be held in the strictest confidence and shall not be released without permission of the KSIA. This confidentiality requirement will remain effective after the termination of this contract with respect to any non-public information obtained from the KSIA.

6. Cancellation of the Contract

If the services provided by the Consultant are regarded as not satisfying the requirements of the KSIA, the KSIA may



request termination of the contract. The Consultant then will prepare a special billing statement of services rendered. To that effect, the Consultant shall at all times keep accurate records of professional time spent on services to the KSIA.

If the Consultant breaches the terms or conditions of this contract, especially the duty of confidentiality, the contract will be terminated at the option of the KSIA and the Consultant may be liable for damages as determined by law.

7. Modification or Extension

This Agreement may be modified, extended or amended in writing by mutual agreement of the parties.

8. Effective Date

This Agreement for consulting services shall be effective as of November 25, 1992, and shall be valid for the period November 25, 1992, through March 31, 1993.


