ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
FREE ANGOLA FOUNDATION, INC.

To: The Recorder of Deeds, D.C.
Washington, D.C.

We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or more, acting as incorporators of a corporation adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation pursuant to the District of Columbia Non-Profit Corporation Act.

FIRST: The name of the corporation is the Free Angola Foundation, Inc.

SECOND: The period of duration is perpetual.

THIRD: The purpose or purposes for which this corporation is organized and for which it shall exist are to operate solely and exclusively as a charitable, literary and educational organization, not for profit, with the power to administer, hold, invest and reinvest such funds as may be received by it from gifts, wills, bequests, grants, contributions or otherwise, which together with the earnings shall be used exclusively for charitable, literary and educational purposes and the administration thereof; including but not limited:

(a) To contribute to the national interest of the United States by furthering public knowledge about the aims and objectives of democratic elements in Angola seeking freedom and political independence from imperialist and colonialist forces;

(b) To educate the American public and national policy makers by means of seminars, bulletins and informational mailings concerning the activities and needs of freedom-seeking Angolans in order that the public will better understand the relationship between freedom in Angola and the national security and well-being of the United States;

(c) To educate the public and public policy makers by means of seminars, bulletins and informational mailings about the role and goals of

anti-democratic imperialist and colonialist forces in Angola and southern Africa and their impact on the national security and well-being of the United States;

(d) To provide charitable, humanitarian and other assistance to individuals and organizations seeking freedom from totalitarianism in Angola and southern Africa; and

(e) To engage in any and all lawful activities sanctioned by the District of Columbia law and consistent within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and regulations issued thereunder.

FOURTH: No part of the earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, Directors, Officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Section Three hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law).

FIFTH: The corporation shall have no members.

SIXTH: The manner of election or appointment of the Board of Directors of the corporation shall be provided for in the By-Laws of the corporation.

SEVENTH: In the event of the liquidation, dissolution or winding up of the corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, or whether by operation of law or otherwise, none of the property of the corporation, nor any proceeds thereof, nor any other assets of the corporation shall be distributed or shall inure to the benefit of any Director or Officer or any other private individual, but all such property and assets shall in such case be applied to

accomplish the general purposes for which the corporation is organized. In no event shall such property and assets be distributed otherwise than to organizations which would then meet the requirements for exemption under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code as now in effect or as they may hereafter be amended, or corresponding provisions of future law.

EIGHTH: The address, including street and number, of the initial registered office of the corporation is Suite 560, 1819 H Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20006, and the name of the initial registered agent at such address is Jos. Dinsmore Murphy.
