

Privacy Act Statement. 

Re: Letter of Authorization

Dear Ms. Chen:

We are delighted to have been assigned this opportunity and we are looking forward to working with you. In advance of entering into a detailed contract for public relation services, this letter will serve to confirm the intent of Weber Shandwick, a unit of CMGRP, Inc. ("Agency") and Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Boston ("Client") to enter into a full contract ("Agreement").

While the Agreement may not be finalized right away, the parties have agreed to enter into this letter of authorization to begin work with Client as of the above date based on the proposed plan and budget presented on May 23, 2005. (See attached.)

It is the intent of both parties that the Agreement will include the following terms:

1. The contract term will commence on May 23, 2005 and continue until November 30, 2005 or until terminated in accordance with the terms of the agreement.

3. Client will be billed monthly based on Agency's standard hourly rates for agency services up to a total budget of \$22,000, and out-of-pocket expenses not to exceed \$8,000.
4. The Agreement will include terms and conditions covering compensation, expenses, billing, termination, confidentiality, ownership and use of materials, retention of rights in materials by third parties, and indemnification obligations.

While we understand that modifications may be made throughout process, we will be relying on the Client to provide information regarding the work to be performed as well as complete and accurate information concerning Client's organization, products, services and competitors' products and services and we will ensure that any press releases or other publicly disseminated material is approved by Client.

This letter sets forth the basic business terms by which the parties agree to work together until such time as the Agreement is fully executed or, if we fail to conclude such Agreement, until such time as one party gives the other party thirty (30) days written notice of termination of the arrangement. At such time Client will pay Agency its compensation for all services performed through the termination date, and for any authorized expenses and non-cancelable commitments incurred on Client's behalf

We are very excited to begin working with you and the entire Taipei Economic and Cultural Office team.
