What You Need To Know

Passports and Visas

You will need a current passport, valid for longer than your period of stay, for your visit to Australia. Visas are required by all visitors, except Australian and New Zealand passport holders. Visit the Department of Immigration and Citizenship for more information regarding Visas. www.immi.gov.au

Language

English is predominant in Australia, however as the most culturally diverse nation on earth, most languages are spoken. Multilingual personnel and telephone interpreting services are available.

Time

Queensland follows 'Eastern Standard Time' throughout the year. Unlike Australia's southern states, Queensland does not have daylight saving during summer. Be careful to check the time if travelling to or from another state within Australia.

Climate and Clothing

Queensland is renowned for its beautiful temperatures all year-round. In the Southern Hemisphere, summer begins in December and winter in June. Winter temperatures are very mild and it can get quite warm in summer. In summer, lightweight clothing is recommended with a thin sweater or jacket for evenings when it can be cooler, plus a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen SPF30+ are a necessity all year round. 
How to get there

The World Heritage-listed Great Barrier Reef is the largest and most extensive coral reef system in the world comprising about 2900 individual coral reefs, 600 continental islands and 300 coral cays. It's also the largest natural feature on earth, running two-thirds the length of Queensland's coastline (around 2300 km). Its impressive size makes it the only living structure that can be seen from the moon.

The Great Barrier Reef is home to:

- more than 30 species of whales and dolphins
- 1625 species of fish
- 411 species of hard coral and over 150 species of soft coral (all up around 10% of the world's soft coral)
- As many as 3000 species of molluscs
- Six of seven of the world's species of marine turtles
- Millions of nesting seabirds
- Giant clams up to 120 years old

The Great Barrier Reef can be easily accessed from various points along the Queensland coast including Port Douglas, Cairns,

Townsville, the Whitsundays and Southern Great Barrier Reef.



2. Cuddle a koala

Queensland is one of the only places in Australia where visitors can literally cuddle a koala. The koala is an Australian icon and their placid, cuddly nature means visitors can hold and have their photo taken with one of these unique marsupials. Visitors can also feed and pat kangaroos, wallabies, native birds and get up close and personal with a range of other Australian native animals.

3. Stay on a Great Barrier Reef Island

The Great Barrier Reef is home to more than 600 continental islands and 300 coral cays. While most of these are uninhabited national parks, a few have accommodation that makes for an idyllic tropical break. Queensland's island retreats vary from 5-star luxury such as Hayman Island and Hamilton Island's qualia in the Whitsundays, to unique boutique resorts such as Lizard and Green Islands off the coast of Cairns.

In the middle of the Southern Great Barrier Reef such as the eco-certified Heron Island or Lady Elliot Island, visitors can literally dive or snorkel right off the beach. You can also mix a visit to Heron Island with a 5-star tent "glamping" adventure on nearby Wilson Island. These islands are also protected habitat for thousands of nesting seabirds and the giant green and loggerhead turtles who come ashore to lay their eggs and hatch their young each year between November and March.



4. Learn to Surf

Queensland's Gold and Sunshine Coast are amongst the best beaches in the world with miles of unspoilt sand and great waves. Whether you are a beginner or experienced surfer there are beaches and boards for you. If you've always wanted to learn to surf, local surf schools have professional teachers in a friendly and safe environment that will have you catching a wave in no time. If you want to get some tips from the real pros, plan your visit to the Gold Coast around a major surfing event such as the Breaka, Quiksilver or Roxy Pro, or the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships. If surfing's not your thing, there are plenty of other beach activities including boogie boarding, stand-up paddle boarding, kite surfing, swimming or just relaxing and building sandcastles. Both the Gold Coast and Sunshine Coast have international airports and accommodation ranges from 5-star resorts, hotels and apartments to budget-friendly and family options.



5. Explore World Heritage-listed national parks

Queensland is home to five World Heritage listed sites, including the only place on the planet where two World Heritage sites meet – the Great Barrier Reef and the Daintree Rainforest. World Heritage sites include:

• The Wet Tropics

Incorporating the Daintree – the World's oldest living rainforest where spectacular scenery goes hand-in-hand with rare, threatened plants

and animals such as the southern cassowary, spotted-tailed quoll and musky-rat kangaroo. More than 50 animal species are unique to this area, which is also home to 30% of Australia's marsupial species, 25% of frogs and reptiles, and about 60% of bat and butterfly species.

The Wet Tropics is managed with special regard for Indigenous peoples, with the history of the local Bama people dating back 50,000 years to the earliest human occupation of Australia.

• Fraser Island

The World's largest sand island is located a half-day drive north of Brisbane, or by flying into Fraser Coast Airport. Fraser Island is a giant sand mass 123 km long and 25 km at its widest point. The island includes over 250 km of sandy beaches including long, uninterrupted sweeps of ocean beach, strikingly coloured sand cliffs, spectacular dune blowouts, tall rainforests on sand, and clear freshwater lakes.

• Gondwana Rainforests

The sub-tropical rainforests of southern Queensland are some of the oldest on the planet. These rainforest national parks, which include Lamington, Springbrook, Mt Barney and Main Range, contain nearly all of the world's Antarctic beech cool temperate rainforest, and more frog, snake, bird and marsupial species than anywhere else in Australia.

• Riversleigh Fossil Fields

Australia is the oldest continent on Earth and the Riversleigh Fossil Fields of Queensland's Outback contain some of the oldest remnants of life on Earth. Its fossil deposits are among the richest and most extensive in the world, with some dating back 15–25 million years. Visitors can see fossilised mammals and reptiles in situ, including a dinosaur stampee, or can dig for dinosaur bones at the Australian Age of Dinosaurs near Winton. A trip to the Riversleigh fossil fields is the perfect add-on to a Queensland Outback adventure.
