THE GUYANA REPUBLICAN PARTY

OBJECTIVE

- (a) The objectives of this Political Organization (G.R.P.) is to establish a Democratic Political Organization within the Republic of Guyana.
- (b) A Party with a Capitalist Policy, of free Enterprise.
- (c) To contest all General Elections and Local Government Elections.
- (d) The G.R.P. would establish a country where the interest of the nation is taken at heart.
- (e) A country that would be aligned with the Free World of the West and all Free Democratic and Capitalist Countries.
- (f) The objectives of this Organization towards the Guyanese People, shall be to unite all Guyanese Overseas and at home.
- (g) To the working class---To improve their wages, hours of work, job security and other conditions of employment.  
To promote their social, political, cultural and economic interest and to encourage their participation in political activities and to urge them to exercise their rights as citizens.
- (h) To safeguard, protect and extend freedom and Democracy.
- (i) To strive for equality, regardless of race, color, creed, sex or National origin.
- (j) To promote and to protect companies of local and foreign investors.
- (k) To work along with all local unions, in reaching reasonable agreements and settlement of disputes and seek support of unions in time of need.

ALLIANCE

The G.R.P. shall establish the country of Guyana as a friendly nation, to all other countries of the West, East, North and South and strong diplomatic relations with the United States of America, Canada, Europe, Israel, Germany, all Africa, South America, the Caribbean and the Middle East.

JURISDICTION

The jurisdiction of the G.R.P. shall embrace all Guyanese living in and out of Guyana and supportive organization and affiliations as decided by the organization.

PARTY CONVENTIONS

CONVENTIONS

- (1) Regular conventions shall be held every two (2) years at a time and place designated by the organization.
- (2) Special convention shall be called whenever authorized, in cases of emergency, in a call of National unity, in defense of the nation.
- (3) Conventions shall continue as determined by the delegates until ajourned sine-die.
- (4) The organization shall be established in every region of the country.
- (5) An officer may serve in his capacity, as an officer, in any region, or several regions at a time, as the organization sees fit.
- (6) Each region shall be entitled to be represented at a convention by a number of delegates as determined by the organization.

- (7) The first party convention shall be held in New York City, where officers shall be elected to office, to establish Party Head Office in Guyana.
- (8) The party General Head Office shall be in New York City, until it seems safe for the Executive Office to move to the Republic of Guyana.
- (9) The party allies, shall at all times be consulted before any action is taken and the allies shall be informed of all immediate actions taken unknown to them.

Biannual Conventions

- (10) At Party Biannual Convention---No resolution or proposed amendment, shall be considered by the convention unless submitted to the Party Leader by the Regional or Local Group, at least twenty-seven days(27) prior to the date of the opening of the convention and bearing the signature of the Leader and the recording Secretary and the stamp of that group.
- (11) The convention may waive the requirements of the above provisions, in case of emergency, and consider a resolution or proposed amendment submitted late by a local group.
- (12) Resolutions or proposed amendments submitted shall be printed in convenient form and numbered. All local unions shall be sent a copy of the resolutions, submitted to the Party Leader, at least eighteen (18) days prior to the convention. Copies of resolutions or proposed amendments referred to the Convention or Resolution Committee shall be mailed to the members no less than nine (9) days prior to the convening the convention.

PARTY OFFICERS

The Party Officers shall be of (2) groups.

- (1) The Main Executive Office in New York.
- (2) The Party Headquarters in Georgetown Guyana.

The New York Office---Shall have the office of the Leader, Leader's Secretary, Party Treasurer, (A staff of three to five).

The Party Headquarters in Georgetown Guyana, shall have the office of the Party Chairman, Party Secretary, plus eight (8) other assistants, as the Chairman sees fit, but shall not increase the number of ten.

DUTIES OF THE LEADER

- (a) The Leader shall be the principal Executive Officer of the Guyana Republican Party. He shall preside at all conventions and meetings of the Executive Committee.
- (b) All other officers of the organization shall be responsible for the performance of their duties and he shall assign duties, responsibilities and authority to the officers as may be required, in serving the best interest and furthering the program and policies of the party.
- (c) The Leader may employ and fix salaries and assign duties of workers in the Executive Office. The staff shall not exceed a total of nine (9) in the New York Office within the period of the first three (3) years of the Party's establishment.

- (e) At no time within the first three (3) years of Party's establishment, shall the total staff of the two offices (the Guyana and New York Office) exceed a total of eighteen (18).
- (f) Within the Main Office in Georgetown Guyana, it is within the rights and limits of the Party Chairman to seek voluntary assistance from party supporters to assist in certain duties as need be, but not the duties of an officer of the Committee.
- (g) The compensation of officers and other members employed full time by the Party shall be both maximum and minimum rates, which will be approved by the Executive Office. Such employee shall serve under the Leader's supervision and direction, except as may otherwise be assigned by him.
- (h) The Leader shall determine any and all questions as to the application, interpretation and construction of the provisions of the constitution, or law or rules of order.
- (i) The Leader directs and supervise all organizational functions of the Party. He or his authorized representative may call meetings of any constituent local group or Regional Group. He or his authorized representative may attend meetings of all Committee of the Party as an ex-officio member thereof.
- (j) The Leader has a moral obligation to his supporters, allies and affiliates. Therefore the Leader shall authorize such expenditures as may be required to conduct the affairs of the Party, except as may otherwise be provided. He shall sign all checks drawn on the accounts of the Guyana Republican Party.
- (k) He may make available at any time and at all times the books of the organization for verification, of the use of such funds which they have funded or contributed. The Leader shall be questionable at all times to supporters on the use of such funds.

- (l) The Party shall maintain its Bank Account in an American own Bank at all times.
- (m) The Leader shall have the power to authorize a representative designated by him to audit the books and accounts also the records, or he may ask any of the Party Funders to do so.
- (n) He may assign any duty committed to him by this constitution to the Party Chairman. He may perform such other duties as may be necessary to protect and advance the policy and interest of the Party. He shall submit a report of his activities to each regular convention and to each meeting of the Committee.
- (o) The decisions and actions of the Leader authorized by this constitution, shall be binding on all officers, members and employees of the Guyana Republican Party; however such decisions and actions shall be subject to approval by the Executive Committee. All officers, members and employees shall abide by the decisions and actions of the Leader, which are authorized by this constitution; until decisions or actions are approved or set aside by the Executive Committee.

#### THE PARTY SECRETARY

The Party's Secretary shall keep the records of the Conventions, minutes of meetings and other records of the Guyana Republican Party. He shall conduct correspondence pertinent to his office. He shall furnish Affiliated, Regional and Local groups with supplies and required information of Party's activities.

The Party's Secretary is responsible to the Party Chairman, who is responsible to the Party's Leader.

He shall be secretary of the conventions and perform such other duties as may be required by law.

He shall interest local and regional groups, as to the manner in which they shall keep the records and accounts and may require them to submit periodic reports to him containing such information, as the Party's Executive Office may prescribe.

He shall submit a detailed financial statement and a report of his activities to each regular convention and to each meeting of the Executive Committee; and his determination and his decisions shall be subject to their approval. He shall submit a monthly report to the Leader.

#### THE PARTY'S CHAIRMAN

The Party's Chairman shall assist the Party's Leader in carrying out the program and policies of the Guyana Republican Party.

He shall serve as a regional officer or in other office and programs of the party.

He shall be responsible for the conduct of the administrative affairs and policies of the party; and shall receive authority and assistance from the Leader as may be necessary to efficiently perform his duties.

The Party's Chairman shall be available to report to the Leader of the Party and the Party's Executive Office in New York. The Leader shall then furnish such information to supporters, affiliates and funders in the United States, and also seek advice.

The Party's Chairman shall be responsible for equipments, vehicles and supplies owned by the Party. He shall be responsible for the distribution of Party's Literature, to supporters and friends in the Republic of Guyana.

He shall at all times consult with the Party's Executive Office before meeting with any other Political Organization in the Republic of Guyana; and after such meeting shall inform Party's Executive

Office of the details that transpired.

He is subject to and govern by this constitution.

He is responsible for the good relationship of the Party and all Religious Organization and at all times show respect to these Organizations.

### THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall execute the decisions of the convention and shall be the highest authority and supreme governing body of the Party. In between conventions it shall have general supervision over the affairs and properties of the Party. It shall have the authority to make rulings and adopt policies not covered by this constitution or convention decision but which shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of the Constitution.

The Executive Committee may amend the rights of jurisdiction of any Local or Regional Group after notice and hearing, where it needs be.

The Executive Committee shall meet at the call of the Party's Leader, or majority of the members of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee shall be convened at least once monthly. A majority of the members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting and its decisions shall be by a majority of the votes cast by those present and voting. It may act without meeting by the written approval of a majority of its members upon any matter or question presented to each of its members for action by the Party Leader.

### MEMBERSHIP

Except as herein otherwise provided, any person living or

is a citizen within the jurisdiction of this Organization may apply for membership.

No person who is not a citizen or residing within the jurisdiction of this organization shall be admitted to membership of this organization, provided however that a member retires from the Organization, through illness, or immigrated, may continue his membership pursuant.

Any member in good standing in this Organization, through affiliation with any Regional or Local group of the G.R.P. may transfer his membership from his Local or Regional group to another Local or Regional group of this Organization.

All new members before, being admitted to full membership of the G.R.P. shall subscribe to the following obligations.

"I ..... pledge my honor to faithfully observe the constitution and laws of this Organization: to comply with all rules and regulations for the administration thereof: not to divulge or make known any private proceedings of this Organization: to faithfully perform all the duties assigned to me to the best of my ability and skill, that I will not wrong a member, or see him wronged. If in my power to prevent, to so conduct myself at all time as not to bring reproach upon my Party, and at all times to bear true and faithful allegiance to the Guyana Republican Party.

MANIFESTO

AGRICULTURE

The Guyana Republican Party is committed to allocating millions of dollars to the Agriculture Sector of this Nation, after reports of a careful Feasibility Study of the agriculture situation in this country.

The Agriculture Department shall be divided into three divisions.

1. Essequibo
2. Berbice
3. Demerara (with the exception of Georgetown)

The region of Georgetown shall not be dealt with as an agriculture region, but instead shall be given such assistance needed from allotment to the Ministry of Agriculture.

Farming shall be done on a large scale, under the supervision of an American/British Agriculture Expert.

All machines larger than a normal tractor being used in the farm areas shall be supervised by a foreign expert.

ALLOCATION OF EQUIPMENTS

The Government shall allocate the following: 500 tractors, 300 bulldozers, 600 trailers (2 or 3 wheelers) 50 draglines, 100-5 ton trucks, 1000 3" pumps (water), 25 Agriculture Aircrafts, these are at the disposal of farmers requirements.

In the regions of Essequibo and Berbice there shall be built several silos for the storage and processing of such agriculture crops as required.

ESSEQUIBO

The Essequibo region shall be one of this country's most important regions. The Essequibo River shall be made available to accomodate large Ocean-Vessels. A cargo port shall be established along the Anna Regina foreshore with facilities of tracks for rail transportation.

Large cargo craines for loading and unloading of ships. An independent emergency system shall be installed. The Faculty of Agriculture (which shall be part of the University of Guyana) shall be established in this region.

TRANSPORTATION

The Ministry of Transportation shall be divided into three Divisions.

1. Air
2. Sea
3. Land-----Rail, Road and other means.

It is the objective of this party's policy to establish the Department of Transportation in three different Divisions, independent of each other but should work with each other in time of need.

The Leader of this Organization would like to take the Department of Aviation under his command. The Nation should establish a proper National Airlines for Domestic and Overseas services.

Our interland airfields should be accomodating for all aircrafts operating within our domestic services.

They should be proper communication services, Directional Facilities and well trained Personnel to fit these positions. There should be proper maintenance facilities at each major airport and a well establish center in the Timehri area.

There should be constant training programs going on, simulators for pilots and cabin crews, engines for mechanics, and also airframes.

Adequate transportation for Airline personnel to and from work, and adequate social facilities at airport and hangars.

All Aircraft Mechanics would be permitted to write the F.A.A. Mechanics Test. The Government <sup>of</sup> Guyana under the G.R.P. would move towards the U.S. F.A.A. Organization to establish a F.A.A. Center in Guyana.

The G.R.P. would approach the U.S. to establish a pilot's Training School here in the Ogle Airfield.

#### NATIONAL AIRLINE FACILITIES

The National Airline shall acquire the following Aircrafts:

2-727's (for International Flights).

3-737 (for Domestic and International Flights).

4-DC-3 (for Domestic Flights).

4-Twin Otters

4-Britton Normans

As foreign trade increases on the export level the airlines would have the option of purchasing a cargo Aircraft 707/ or DC 8.(OPTIONAL)

#### SEA

The seas must be made navigable. The three main rivers Essequibo, Berbice and Demerara must be dredge and all main navigational equipment installed. There shall be ships and vehicles for the passengers at all ports. All wharfs shall be repaired with adequate facilities being installed. There should be passenger service for all the regions in Guyana regularly. The docks in Georgetown and Mazaruni must be made seviceable for the receiving and maintaining of vessels. Crews must be trained regularly, and this would be the responsibility of the Marine Department.

### Land

There shall be two means of land transportation (a) Road (b) Rail.

(a) Road---The Government shall provide adequate road vehicles for the purpose of getting the general public around the country, in that way more roads and highways would be constructed. It would be top priority to construct about 3,000 miles of new roads and highways. Roads and Bridges would be built to link all main Islands within our seas.

### RAIL ROAD

Work should start immediately by replacing the Rail Road. The Rail Road shall be from Parika to Vreed-en-Hoop, Georgetown to Rosignol and Linden to Georgetown. A railroad system must be developed to transport our mining materials from the various interior regions, to the Essequibo - Anna Regina area.

### OTHER MEANS

The Government shall provide adequate forms of transportation for the Amerindians, who live mainly in the interior regions of the country. All other means of private transportation shall be encouraged.

### HEALTH

There must be adequate health care facilities throughout the country. The G.R.P. regards Health Care as top priority and establish dispensaries throughout the rural areas. There will be adequate emergency transport for those patients in the rural areas..

The G.R.P. would like to establish a technical exchange program with such countries as Brazil and England, whereby Doctors from those countries would be encouraged to share their knowledge and expertise with their Guyanese counterparts.

The Health Centers in the interior should be regularly serviced

by the medical personnel of the Armed Forces.

Priorities for health care must at all times be given to pregnant women, children and the elderly.

## DEFENCE

The Department of Defense shall be divided in three different services:

1. Army
2. Navy
3. Air Force

Each service shall have its own Chief-of-Staff and together they shall be known as the Joint-Chief-of-Staff (J.C.T.)

Though their operations are independent of each other they must at all times be in Communication and awareness of each other's operations.

The Guyana Armed Services must be equipt and trained to deal with situations not only at home, and on our borders, but also should be able to flex its muscle in restoring orders as far as possible within the Caribbean, it must assist and be prepared to take some of the burden off the shoulders of the United States in keeping the Caribbean free from all forms of infiltrations.

We must be prepared to free Islands that are suppress by dictators who does this in the interest of greed.

We are to provide adequate protection at sea for our fishermen in the Atlantic Ocean and Berbice River.

All military Headquarters must be re-established away from the City. Military equipment are to be had from England, the U.S.A., and other countries if necessary.

We must continue our officers training in the United Kingdom and the U.S.A. as for further Jungle Warfare, training should be had in other advance countries in this form of combat.

FOREIGN AFFAIRS

The G.R.P. policy is to establish Diplomatic relations with all Free Democratic countries of the West, East, North and South; this includes Israel, South Africa, and Namibia.

Trade and development, would be accepted and encourage with the Nations in the best interest of the re-development and construction of Guyana.

Our strongest and warmest trading ties would be with the United States of America.

We would also encourage trading with the Republic of Brazil.

We would seek the assistance of the United States of America and Great Britain, in solving, and coming to a final decision on the territorial dispute between Venezuela and Guyana.

## MINING

This Department would be entrusted with the development and expansion of most of our technical areas.

**Bauxite:** We must develop the ability and seek the assistance necessary to produce aluminum products, on a trade level; we must be prepared to use Foreign Technical Assistance in all of our Plants so that our products would be acceptable within the International Trade System.

One of the many services the proposed shipping port of Anna-Regina would provide us to store and be able to ship our bauxite and aluminum directly to the outside world; storage facilities would be built in this region.

Transporting of these products would be done via the proposed Rail System linking Linden with the Essequibo.

**Manganese:** We are to re-open the manganese mining in the Matthews Ridge area and establish trade within the international market; we must acquire the technology in using this product in our manufacturing of different products manganese deposit and exports can be done through the Port Kaitima Harbour.

**Gold and Diamond:** These minerals would strictly be under State control and the State reserve the rights to do mining of these minerals in large quantities, this means that underground mining to depths of several hundreds of feet would be done, the State will seek Foreign Assistance in the building and dwelling for these minerals. Security housing and all the necessary arrangements are the responsibility of the State.

The State will permit other form of mining, by private enterprise, as long as they comply with laid down guidelines.

The private enterprises will be remunerated fairly.

**Mining Cont.**

The minerals must also be made easily acceptable to our citizens for social purposes and accumulating if they find it possible (in the form of Jewels).

**COPPER:** It is true that we do have this mineral but in small quantity. We must be able to extract it and have it put on the International Trade market.

**GAS AND OIL:** We are fully aware that we have Oil in very large quantities, but through our present situation with Venezuela we are unable to explore.

It will be much easier to accomplish this when the G.R.P. takes office; we will be extracting Oil, refining and shipping.

We must be prepared to meet reasonable agreement with our explorers in this field.

## EDUCATION

Strong emphasis shall be put into this area, the University of Guyana shall expand itself, by having additional faculties, most important the Faculty of Agriculture shall be in the County of Essequibo, as proposed (Anna-Regina).

The University of Medicine shall be built on Fort Island, along with a new hospital complex.

Student exchanges will be done on a yearly basis, between students from Europe, Canada, U.S.A., Africa, Israel, Japan, Australia, New Zeland, Brazil.

In this Department, shall be house the division of the National Service will remain, but its functions will differ. No University student shall be required to do any form of military service, during his or her entire period of study , he or she may serve at different outlets in accordance with the line of study.

This Department is responsible for the establishment and functioning of our Public Library, and these units should be modified with the most recent technologies (e.g. Computers, Slides, etc.).

HOME AFFAIRS

Much work would have to be done to get the Guyana Police Force, back in its respectful order.

Changes in the dress code, equipment, locations, and procedures. A redress in the Juridicial Department.

In the Department of Home Affairs shall be the office of the State Chief Investigations officer, who shall have the responsibility of investigating wrong doings within Government officials..

FINANCE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

This Department will make the necessary arrangements to accomodate all proposed development plans and shall decide on the Budget in the appropriate time.

## HOUSING

Within the first four years of the G.R.P. in office we should be able to construct some 27000 housing units (individual houses) within the County of Essequibo, and these units shall be divided within 10 new Towns, two (2) main housing complex of multiple dwellings for Bachelors & Spaces in the Mahadia and Lethem areas.

Each new Town shall be inter-linked within each other along the proposed 3000 miles road way.

Each new housing town shall be provided with its independent health facilities and the G.R.P. takes in to consideration the great need for the mosquito control units, adequate water supply and shall encourage residents to have their independent means of water supply.

In the establishment of these Towns they will be sewerage treatment plants.

All forms of social activities will be encourage, but its the Policy of the G.R.P. that these Towns being residential areas, all liquors stores, shall be not less than three miles to the perimeter of the Town.

## INTERIOR DEVELOPMENT

Top priority for this Department is to coordinate its functions with the Military Services in the best interest of Border Security.

This Department will play a major role in the construction of the (Proposed 3,000 mls roadway and Railway System. It shall work along with Public Works Dept. on the interior water supply and the sewerage systems, Interim towns layout (Proposed 27,000 housing units and two multiple housing complex).

ELECTRICITY: With foreign assistance we will once and for all complete the Hydro-electric plant <sup>5<sup>c</sup></sup> so that they would be adequate power for the entire Nation, and our proposed Industries and Harbours.

In doing this we must take into consideration the safety of our Wild-Life.

As certain regions of our interior becomes more develop and inhabited the necessary arrangements would be made to upgrade those areas from interior regions to respective develop brackets.

The Department of Interior would also be responsible for providing a round-the-clock emergency services for our farmers, miners and armed forces.

This Department will assist our neighbors on the Border, in cases of personal emergency, disasters, etc. and should immediately report same to the local Military Command.

It is the responsibility of this Department to enforce the law prohibiting the exportation of our wild-life. (A violation of this act carries the maximum penalty).

## PUBLIC WORKS

This Department shall bear the responsibility of the maintenance of our road ways, sewerage system, drainage and irrigation. The construction of new sea defence walls-parks and be able to establish tourist sites and facilities.

One of the main task of this Department is to establish into one of our largest parks, that is the site of the Slaves Chateau-Margot on the East Coast.

**Pure Water Supply:** This Department will ensure that at all times prompt repairs are made and residents request for new installation.

**Electricity:** This Department shall work along with the electricity Corporation in prompt services, repairs, etc.
