¹Political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act means the dissemination of political propaganda and any other activity which the person engaging therein believes will, or which he intends to, prevail upon, indoctrinate, convert, induce, persuade, or in any other way influence any agency or official of the Government of the United States or any section of the public within the United States with reference to formulating, adopting, or changing the domestic or foreign policies of the United States or with reference to the political or public interests, policies, or relations of a government of a foreign country or a foreign political party.

PROPOSAL

World Trade Link (WTL) proposes to advise and assist Lembaga Bantuan Pemasaran & Manajemen (LBPM) regarding textile and apparel exports to the United States. WTL will provide analysis and advice on a strategy for the achievement of LBPM's goals and objectives. Such advice and assistance will relate to the U.S. Government, as well as the private sector, and will include, but not be limited, to the following:

I. U.S. Indonesia bilateral negotiations. Bilateral negotiations between the U.S. and Indonesia are scheduled for August 2-4 in Washington, D.C. WTL will work with LBPM during that round of negotiations on the following issues:

1. Negotiation of merged categories. WTL will advise on the development of a strategy for LBPM to accomplish the merger of various high priority categories.

A. Merger of the following categories within group limits:

- o 313/314/315 (sheeting/poplin and broad cloth/printcloth)
- o 334/335/635 (other M&B coats/W&G coats)
- o 338/339/638/639 (B&M knit shirts/W&G knit shirts & blouses)
- o 340/640 (woven M&B shirts)
- o 341/641 (woven W&G shirts & blouses)

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- o 347/348/647/648 (M&B/W&G trousers)

B. Merger of categories between groups:

- o 625/626/627/628/629 (Poplin/broadcloth/
printcloth/specialty fabrics)
- o 331/631 (Gloves & mittens)
- o 336/636 (Dresses)
- o 351/651 (Nightwear & pajamas)

2. Reconciliation of group limit discrepancy. WTL will assist in the identification and negotiation of the discrepancy between the sum of specific limits in Group I and the Group I limit.

3. Changes in quota coverage due to Harmonized System implementation. WTL will assist LBPM in identifying quota adjustments brought about by the U.S. conversion to the Harmonized System and ensure that Indonesia receives fair and legitimate adjustments to quotas.

4. Date of shipment problems. WTL will advise on the development of a strategy to explain to the U.S. government the date of export problems faced by Indonesian exporters, propose solutions to this unique problem, and identify negotiation options available to Indonesia so that embargoes which in the past have been partially caused by this date of shipment problem can be

positively avoided.

5. Classification of the U.S. government traditional folklore items. WTL will assist LBPM in the identification of specific folklore and handloom items; the clarification of LBPM's position to the U.S. government on the current bilateral agreement concerning the quantity of those items which may be shipped to the U.S.; and the development of a solution to these shipments as pertains to the group and aggregate limits of the bilateral agreement.

6. Participation of Indonesia in the Automatic Visa Verification System (AVVS). WTL will assist and advise on Indonesia's participation in the system, as well as the strengths and weaknesses of the AVVS.

II. General Issues

In addition to the above listed issues, WTL will advise in the following areas:

1. Consultation services regarding classification questions, particularly those which result from the adoption of the Harmonized Tariff System or other procedural or regulatory matters which might adversely affect exports from Indonesia to the United States.

2. Assist in the identification of discrepancies between United States import data and Indonesian export data and reconcile such discrepancies in order to avoid embargoes.

WTL will provide the services listed above on the basis of the following fee schedule:


