SCOPE OF WORK

Services to be provided to the Office of Information of the Embassy of the Republic of Korea by Patrick E. Nieburg are as follows:

Press Relations

The consultant will act as liaison between the Embassy and representatives of the news media and will assist the Office of Information in preparing the Korea Digest newsletter, fact sheets and press statements for dissemination to the media and other organizations concerned.

Economic, Cultural and Political Research

The consultant will conduct an ongoing research designed for the compilation of timely political and cultural information and economic data for use by Korean officials, the news media, and where pertinent, in advertisements. The consultant will also prepare a fact sheet of major information items about Korea for use by all persons involved.

Communications with Private Groups and Communities

The consultant will act as liaison between the Embassy and non-governmental organizations and community groups concerned in order to facilitate a continuing exchange of information about American-Korean relations.

Internal Communications

The consultant will meet regularly with officials of the Embassy to review current developments and to maintain an ongoing communications program, and thereby prepare publicity programs.

Speech Writing

The consultant will prepare or edit speeches for various occasions as requested by embassy staff members. These speeches may pertain to such topics as political, cultural, economic or historic aspects of Korea.
