

TITLE

Project Summit of the Americas Communications Support.

OBJECTIVES

To obtain U.S. media advice and to develop a media plan for the 2009 Summit of the Americas. To provide assistance in arranging United States media opportunities for the Prime Minister.

BACKGROUND, ASSUMPTION AND SPECIFIC SCOPE OF THE REQUIREMENT

The contractor will have extensive communications experience in the area of public policy, and political communications. The contractor will have a broad base of experience and reputation working in United States media markets including television, radio, newspapers, and magazines.

SCOPE OF WORK

- To provide the Office of the Prime Minister with assistance booking United States media opportunities around the 2009 Summit of the Americas.
- To provide communications advice around issues pertaining to the 2009 Summit of the Americas as they relate to the United States in order to effectively articulate the position of the Government of Canada.
- To provide United States media communications advice to the Prime Minister on issues relating to the 2009 Summit of the Americas.

DELIVERABLES

The contractor will work with the Office of the Prime Minister to develop a media plan that includes advice around communicating the position of the Government of Canada in the United States regarding the 2009 Summit of the Americas. The contractor will arrange appearances and interviews in U.S.-based media for the Prime Minister in both television and print media. The services are limited to communications advice and media relations assistance. The services do not include the lobbying of US government officials or the provision of policy advice to the Government of Canada.

Good morning, Laura,

As discussed between Mike and Kory over email, can we confirm a meeting between them at 0900, tomorrow, 15 Apr 09, at your office in Washington?

Also, we would like your office to review our proposed statement of work, attached. As the Summit of the Americas is fast approaching, there are certain things our office requires in order to get a contract rolling.

1. A resume for Mike McCurry as well as a profile of the company or firm,
2. A signed rate certification document indicating that the agreed rate is fair. (Kory will have one of these with him when he travels, but I've also attached one),
3. and a cost proposal for the work.

Kory is proposing a contract value of \$24,000. If you agree, you can decide how to report the cost breakdown. Our office requires a breakdown in terms of administrative costs, travel costs, miscellaneous expense, and services provided. A simple way of breaking this sum down might be to allocate for example, \$4,000 in admin costs, and the rest for services provided, with no miscellaneous or travel expenses.
