3. To generate greater understanding among these groups (US government officials and concerned legislators; influential foreign policy specialists, bankers, potential investors and importers) of Argentina's history and circumstances and of President Menem's role in effective positive change.
4. To present Argentina to the U. S. banking and business communities as a dependable and potentially profitable place to do business.

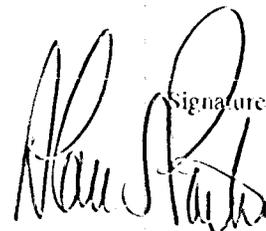

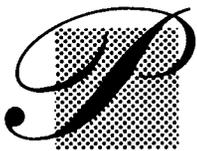

This letter confirms Congresos Internacionales' appointment of Parter International, Inc. as its communications consultant in the United States and sets forth the mutual understanding of our agreement.

1. SERVICES/SCOPE OF WORK

Parter International, Inc. will devote our best efforts to further the interests of the World Trade Centre of Buenos Aires and will work with you to develop and carry forward a successful public relations program for The World Trade Centre. We will provide communications counseling and marketing services, establish appropriate media contacts, and produce necessary communications materials.

In particular we will develop and implement a media strategy with the goal of improving the image of Argentina in the U.S. The messages conveyed will center around the country's economic restructuring, the preservation and strengthening of democracy in Argentina and Argentina's improved relations with the U.S.

2. COMPENSATION

In consideration of the services to be performed by us, you will compensate us in accordance with the following:

a. Fee

Six thousand dollars for the first month, March 22, 1991 to April 22, 1991, during which an audit of press coverage of Argentina in the U.S. will be conducted and a preliminary action plan drafted. Thereafter, our retainer is \$13,000 per month billable in advance on the first of each month.

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b. You will be billed for all production and creative services at our cost plus 17.65%. This will include such services as photography, prints, slides, video production news clippings, artwork, printing and production and similar items. These expenses will only be included if first authorized by you.

c. Payments

It is understood that:

(i) All invoices are payable within 20 days after receipt by you.

(ii) Approved production creative services and expenses will be billed to you on the next monthly bill after invoices for such costs are received by us.

3. GENERAL PROCEDURES

a. You reserve the right to modify, reject, cancel or stop any and all plans, schedules or work in process; and in such event we shall immediately take proper steps to carry out your instructions. In turn you agree:

(i) to assume our liability for all such commitments;

(ii) to pay us, in accordance with the provision of this agreement, any and all proper charges earned and incurred by us in connection with such work up to the time of its discontinuance, cancellation, or modification;

(iii) to indemnify us for all claims and actions by third parties for damages in consequence of our carrying out your instructions.

b. All copy, layouts, scripts, artwork, photography, designs or other materials or documents prepared, purchased or furnished by us on your account and at our expense, and produced during the term hereof, become your property, and shall be delivered to you upon request.

c. We will use our best efforts to maintain the confidential nature of all information and data (whether written or oral) which you entrust to us or of which we become aware in the course of the discharge of our obligations under this Agreement through strict control of its distribution and use within our firm by our professional staff and employees.

- d. We will endeavor to the best of our ability to guard against any loss to you through failure of suppliers to execute properly their commitments but we shall not be held responsible for any failure on their part.
- e. You will indemnify us against any loss and/or expense we may incur as the result of any claim, suit or proceeding made or brought against us or in which we are asked to participate, based upon any materials we prepared or placed for you and based upon information provided by you or which you approved before its dissemination, production, prior publication, as well as for claims or suites arising out of the nature of use of your products or services or our relationship to you.

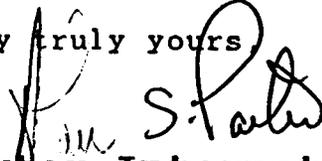
4. TERMS AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- a. This agreement shall be considered in effect as of March 22, 1991, and shall remain in full force thereafter subject to cancellation by either party by giving ninety (90) days written notice.
- b. Our duties, responsibilities and rights shall continue in full force during the period of notice of termination.
- c. Upon termination of this agreement, you are to pay for all authorized work in process, at cost, and you shall assume our liability under and indemnify us with respect to all outstanding contracts made in your behalf.
- d. We shall transfer, assign and make available to you or your representative all property and materials in our possession or control belonging to and paid for by you. We also agree to give all reasonable cooperation to transferring and approval of third parties in interest and reservations, contracts and agreements yet to be used and all rights and claims thereto and therein, upon being duly released from the obligation thereof.

We are pleased and happy to be associated with you and your organization and are confident that ours will be a successful relationship.
