Dear Tim,

In answer to your letter of February 3, 1994, we are pleased to confirm our agreement on the remuneration of MNH and CLM/BBDO for our involvement in 1994. We understand this agreement as apart from the current work done on the Joint Partnership Campaigns which shall be covered by the standard terms of remuneration agreed last year for France, Germany, Italy, Spain and the U.K..

The work to be done under the new agreement (your letter from Feb. 3, 1994) consists of international coordination of communication activities for IWS within the BBDO and Omnicom network, planning of media and execution of campaign elements which have been developed as part of last year's strategic campaign development effort (contract dated June 21, 1993).


The workload has been set at a guaranteed minimum of 30 hours a month for each of the above agencies. Based on an agreed hourly rate of US\$ 175 the remuneration of each agency will be US\$ 5,250 per month. The total amount of US\$ 10,500 will be billed by CLM/BBDO which will transfer the respective funds to MNH.

The actual workload will be evaluated on a quarterly bases against timesheets. In case that the actual hours spent should exceed the guaranteed minimum of 30 hours the remuneration will be corrected accordingly and retroactively.

This remuneration does not cover any transfer of author's right from MNH and CLM/BBDO to IWS. If IWS decides to use or adapt a substantial part of the creation originated and presented by MNH or CLM/BBDO but produced and deployed through another agency network, or agency, or directly, then a specific remuneration will have to be agreed between the parties in return for the use of such creative elements.

The agreement shall start on January 1994 and shall be valid throughout 1994.
