

4. Describe fully the nature and method of performance of the above indicated agreement or understanding.

Registrant educates the American public in the history and culture of the people of Kuwait and informs the American public of the consequences to the Kuwait people of the annexation of their country by the government of Iraq.

EXHIBIT B

5. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

The Registrant does not believe that it represents any foreign principal. However, it engages in activities on behalf of its own goals.

To achieve the registrant's goals, the registrant has interviews with national print and broadcast media. It has engaged local consultants for the preparation of press information kits for distribution to the media, members of Congress, universities, local, state and federal government officials and the general public. Registrant arranged for contacting offices of governors and elected leaders to inform and to elicit support for Kuwait. Through its consultants, registrant assists with electronic media services in Saudi Arabia and provides satellite feed for footage for the United States media.

Through its consultants, registrant monitors Congressional activities regarding the Persian Gulf crisis. This includes coverage of Congressional debate, committee hearings and members' public statements. Registrant meets with Congressional members and staff to convey its view point regarding Kuwait. Registrant provides information and responds to questions from members of Congress, staff and administration officials.

It supports such events as the National Free Kuwait Day rally at universities across the country, a National Prayer Day, a National Student Information Day and an Islamic Art Tour.

The registrant supports through contributions groups and organizations addressing human rights and/or the Persian Gulf crisis. Such groups as Kuwait/American Friendship Council, SMASH and the Congressional Human Rights Foundation have received contributions from the registrant.
