Dear Mr. Jack:

The following speaking points were made to the New England chapter of the Social Investment Forum in Boston on October 8, 1993, by Grand Chief Matthew Coon Come which he then elaborated upon.

Dartmouth College in New Hampshire recently debated whether to divest their HQ bonds. The College asked the Crees three questions. They are very good questions; we were glad to answer.

Question 1: By what means, if any, have the human and legal rights of the native peoples, i.e., the Cree and the Inuit, been protected and safeguarded? Are these measures adequate?

Answer: There are no adequate means within the laws of Canada or Quebec to protect the human and environmental rights of the Crees. That is why the Crees are in the US., in Europe, and at the UN Commission on Human Rights

Canada's highest federal human rights official has referred to the aboriginal condition in Canada as a "national tragedy," "Canada's most serious human rights problem," and a "breach of Canada's international human rights obligations"

Question 2: What processes are in place to ensure that these rights will be upheld in the future as current and future phases of the James Bay hydroelectric complex are completed?

Answer: Environmental process is dominated by governments; makes recommendations only that can be overruled by cabinet; Canada and Quebec are in court trying to bring it to an end

**Question 3: It has been alleged by some that construction of James Bay Phase I, in conjunction with the completion of James Bay Phase II, would amount to cultural genocide of the Cree and Inuit. Please respond.**

**Answer: There is no word for “cultural genocide” in Cree. We can only tell our experience the way we see it. Cree culture is indeed being subjected to enormous stresses, and the James Bay project is without doubt the biggest factor. For example: mercury contamination of the fish and the Crees is a direct result of the projects. If the projects are all built, the Crees will lose this central part of our way of life. If this is not the death of a culture, what is?**

**Dartmouth College recently divested itself of its Hydro-Quebec bonds**

**The Crees would not presume to tell American investors what is ethical and social investment. But if you ask us:**

- Is this a breach of your human rights?**
- Is this a destruction of the last untouched wilderness in northeastern North America?**
- Might this cause the destruction of your way of life?**

**I must answer YES.**

**And if you ask is this a good investment:**

- Socially and environmentally destructive investments are inherently bad investments, no matter how well they are guaranteed by governments**
- On their own financial terms, it seems that there are far better places to put your money than into HQ securities**
- The time has come for investors to end the practices of the past. We need new ways of thinking.**

**Money talks. You can make an eloquent speech in the five hundred and first anniversary of the plunder of this continent by:**

- Investing your funds elsewhere**
- Advising your clients that HQ bonds are socially, ethically and economically unacceptable**

Few opportunities present themselves to make an enormous difference through small actions. This is such an opportunity. For your actions, the indigenous peoples of North America will thank you. The environment and the animals will thank you. And in the end, the province of Quebec will have reason to thank you, too. Meegwetch.

It has never been the position of the Cree Nation to tell American investors what to do, because that is something that a community or individual alone can decide. However, continuing to hold and invest in HQ bonds "drives" development and sends a message that investors condone the building of destructive megahydroprojects. I enclose a fact sheet on Cree bond holdings for your information.

Dear Senator Durand:

In regard to your proposed legislation, what can build the strongest case for full legislative consideration and generate additional publicity would be a joint hearing before the energy and natural resources committees. In the past two years, there has been no review process underway in Canada. Now there is, so things have changed substantially.

Where does the Senate President stand?

Ask Trudy Coxe's office to participate at some level.

Ask Maeve to compile questions for you to ask about MEPA and a comparison of the Canadian review process.

How can support be generated for Representative Marzilli's (and your) other related bills?

Seek higher level of local and state-wide publicity: for example, would *Boston Magazine* write a story? What about a personal appeal from you to other organizations, especially those which haven't spoken on the issue?

If Bobby Kennedy, the national environmental groups and the Cree leadership testify and there is more media attention, complement this from within the State House: meet with Senate and House leadership the day of the hearing; what about utilizing the continuing support of Senators Lees and Hicks to demonstrate that interest in the bill crosses party lines; emphasize Massachusetts consumers' concerns that power be produced in an environmentally benign manner

Do you need to update the fact sheet on the bill that was written from a business perspective?

Thank you for your leadership on environmental issues.
